"Fatima" Shows Their Policy

Sister Lucia of Fatima left for Heaven on February 13. Though I am not Catholic, I believe that she lives with the Virgin Mary (# 1).

I have often referred to the miracle of Fatima, because this UFO event shows how to understand space people.

Firstly, they do not regard science as important. As I pointed out in the fourth issue, the dancing sun seen by crowd on October 13, 1917, means the geocentric system (# 2). Let me add. Ms. Ann Druffel says at her writing about Fatima contained in The Encyclopedia of UFOs (edited by Mr. Ronald D. Story; 1980): "many reported hearing a sound like a very faint voice, similar to 'the buzzing of a bee.' " You may regard this sound as a by-product of an electromagnetic activity. But a bee is, according to Catholic tradition, a symbol of the Virgin Mary. Moreover, the Lady of Fatima perplexes even some Catholics, who can scarcely believe in the existence of Hell, the underground world, which the three children including sister Lucia were shown by her (#3).

And secondly, space people need excuses for their aids of us. The Lady of Fatima asked the children to devote themselves to her desire (# 4). They did, therefore space people could do something secret to help us. What the three children did has no meaning for non-Catholics. But space people wanted that.

Ideal space people will never establish diplomatic relations with us, because they can make our all dreams come true. They must want us not to become slaves of dependence. Therefore they give us only incomprehensible contacts, only when they need them to help us.

- This is also a logical conclusion, if you do not regard UFOs as liars. And if UFOs are liars, every UFO hypothesis loses its basis. Mr. John A. Keel in UFOs: Operation Trojan Horse (1970 / Japanese translation: 1976) is too optimistic as I wrote in my booklet Enban-gaku (Saucerlogy) published in 1981.
- The Vatican newspaper L'Osservatore Romano published a photo of the dancing sun in 1951 (I do not know the original article). This unclear photo, which seems to be trimmed from a far bigger picture, shows a small black, round object that is within a big, round light in the sky. Mr. Kiyoshi Amamiya points out, in his memorial article for sister Lucia in Amamiya UFO Kenkyu-shitsu Tsushin (News from Amamiya UFO Study Office) No.21 (March 2005), that the monochrome photo changes deep red into black. But Mr. Avro Manhattan did not believe this photo. He says: " • • • apart from the photographer, the rest of mankind never noticed the sun falling to the horizon at noon on October 13, 1917" (Vietnam: Why Did We Go? Chapter 5). I do not know whether this is correct. And though the newspaper refers to the horizon, the photo itself does not tell us the distance from the horizon, as far as I know.

A Video Has Puzzled Us

On March 15, 2005, the daily sports paper <u>Tokyo Supotsu</u> (Tokyo Sports) carried a large article about a video of a luminous body that apparently nearly had had a midair collision with a passenger plane, a Boeing 777-300 of Japan Airlines. This spectacle was captured by Mr. Kiyoshi Amamiya (1944-), one of the most active UFOlogists in current Japan, at Sugimoto-cho, Tenri City, Nara Prefecture, on October 23, 2004.

At 17:24 of that day, fine weather, he started to video the jet plane flying from the east to the west at an altitude of about 2000 meters. His digital video camera (Canon FV1), to which he had attached a telephoto lens to get larger images, tracked the plane. Before long a small reddish bright light came into the view of the finder from the direction of movement of the plane, and at 17:25 (these time are expressed in minutes; to be exact, about 30 seconds after the start of his tracking) the light apparently passed by, or touched, the left wing of the passenger plane. Mr. Amamiya tracked the light, and zoomed in on it.

This near miss may be an optical illusion, because no one knows the altitude of the object. The movements of the object, also, is unknown; Mr. Amamiya used no tripod, so we can not distinguish actual movements from apparent ones (according to the impression he received, the object was almost at the same position).

Whether it changed its position or not, it changed its appearance one after another: broadly speaking, firstly, two joined round lights leaning to the left; secondly, a round light; lastly, two joined round lights leaning to the right. This object, if these lights and some feeble lights belong to an object, is very bright, though the photos below may give you no such impression. And dark structures of this object may be false images made by bright objects; such phenomena are common in video images (in 1991 one of such false images that was on a star, Venus, made a Japanese TV news program think that this object was a dark UFO reflecting the sunlight).

About three minutes after the start of tracking the plane, at last the object was missed; the video camera seems to have become unable to adjust the focus automatically (according to Mr. Amamiya, the object got smaller). He kept an eye on the finder not to lose track; he did not see the object with the naked eye.

If one object shows only character that earthling-made objects can have, the object is not a UFO — this is my hypothesis. But I have yet to decide about this video.
