Some of you have heard about my tape recordings which are in 1958.

A lot of you have been wondering whether if these tape recordings really are from space

or spacecraft or space people, has it led to anything? What is it leading to?

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00:00:19,000 --> 00:00:25,000

Well, I'm glad to say that it has led to something, and that is actual physical contact.

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00:00:25,000 --> 00:00:32,000

And I have the permission to tell you a certain amount about it.

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00:00:32,000 --> 00:00:38,000

Now, I must apologize if this lecture is not very well planned, because it was less than two days ago

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00:00:38,000 --> 00:00:41,000

that I knew definitely that I was allowed to give it.

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00:00:41,000 --> 00:00:47,000

Because I've made contact with people, and I've told you something about them,

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00:00:47,000 --> 00:00:52,000

and for a long time I had to keep silent.

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00:00:52,000 --> 00:00:58,000

Now, I've been told a great deal. I would say not as much as Adamowski,

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00:00:58,000 --> 00:01:05,000

but a great deal I have been told, and I'm only allowed to give you about one-tenth of what I know

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00:01:05,000 --> 00:01:08,000

for security reasons. You see?

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00:01:08,000 --> 00:01:13,000

And I must ask you to bear with me. If I'm vague, it's because of the fact that I cannot tell you

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00:01:13,000 --> 00:01:17,000

certain things, because if I were to tell you how I first met these people,

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00:01:17,000 --> 00:01:20,000

then it might give you a clue. It might give somebody a clue.

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00:01:20,000 --> 00:01:24,000

Not one of you, perhaps, but somebody who might hear about it,

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00:01:24,000 --> 00:01:29,000

and they might try and pester the people concerned, which will be very, very embarrassing.

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00:01:29,000 --> 00:01:34,000

Not only for the space people, and they are space people, they are real people,

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00:01:34,000 --> 00:01:37,000

but also for the English people who help them.

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00:01:37,000 --> 00:01:42,000

They are helped by a lot of our people, and these people, at least most of these people,

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00:01:42,000 --> 00:01:45,000

do not know that they're helping space people.

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00:01:45,000 --> 00:01:50,000

And if these people were to be traced, then there might be somebody going up

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00:01:50,000 --> 00:01:56,000

and not only demanding specimens of their hair and their blood and their skin,

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00:01:56,000 --> 00:01:59,000

in fact, one gentleman whom you'll know, I won't mention his name,

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00:01:59,000 --> 00:02:03,000

he insisted when I hoped to make contact in 1959, he said,

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00:02:03,000 --> 00:02:08,000

insist that, well, you must let us have a bit of their skin so we can prove that they are space

people.

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00:02:08,000 --> 00:02:11,000

And there's several hundred people who would insist on having a bit of their skin.

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00:02:11,000 --> 00:02:14,000

The poor blighters wouldn't have any skin left.

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00:02:14,000 --> 00:02:19,000

And they would also want their blood samples and hair samples, they'd be bald,

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00:02:19,000 --> 00:02:27,000

and they'd have no blood or skin, and also television people, reporters, anthropologists,

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00:02:27,000 --> 00:02:32,000

and television and newspaper men who would be pestering them,

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00:02:32,000 --> 00:02:35,000

and their life would be absolutely unbearable.

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00:02:35,000 --> 00:02:40,000

And also the people who are associated with them would also be pestered.

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00:02:40,000 --> 00:02:48,000

So I have been told, in fact, I was given a very long bit of instruction less than two days ago

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00:02:48,000 --> 00:02:52,000

saying what I could say at this lecture, they want me to disclose certain things.

But when it comes to what I call a classified bit of information, I'm going to do this.

And that means it's classified, I'm not going to answer.

Is that understood?

And I can assure you that it's no use trying to ply me with liquor,

because the more I have to drink, the less I will say.

And on the other hand, this person who rang me up has been very kind,

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00:03:17,000 --> 00:03:24,000

and I had the idea that I would not only ask you to ask questions,

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00:03:24,000 --> 00:03:28,000

but if there are some questions that I haven't asked or haven't got answers to,

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00:03:28,000 --> 00:03:33,000

I would be very glad to make a note of them, and I cannot guarantee anything at all.

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00:03:33,000 --> 00:03:37,000

And this person agreed that I mustn't guarantee, and I said,

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00:03:37,000 --> 00:03:41,000

look, I can't guarantee anything, but I will try to put the question to them

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00:03:41,000 --> 00:03:44,000

and then see if they give me an answer.

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00:03:44,000 --> 00:03:49,000

And if you're kind enough to invite me to talk to you again, I may have a lot more information.

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00:03:49,000 --> 00:03:52,000

So I have a little braille machine here.

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00:03:52,000 --> 00:03:57,000

There's nothing space about this, it's an American model, Banks' Braille Machine.

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00:03:57,000 --> 00:04:02,000

And I write in grade 3 braille, which is very, very compressed and which very few people can read.

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00:04:02,000 --> 00:04:08,000

And I have what I'll do, I'll make a note of any questions, any points that you raise,

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00:04:08,000 --> 00:04:15,000

and then I'll wrap up the little strips of paper, put them in these tins.

Incidentally, in the bottom of my guitar case, there's a piece of braille there,

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00:04:19,000 --> 00:04:27,000

and if somebody would kindly hand it to me, that has got a list of topics that I've been talking about with them.

And I thought that when I finished this introductory talk, I would read out this list,

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00:04:33,000 --> 00:04:36,000

and then you might like to make a note of certain questions.

I've got information about various things, sometimes only a little scrap of information,

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00:04:40,000 --> 00:04:45,000

but I've got things that may interest you as ufologists.

Thank you very much.

Right, well, now, I'll get it up the right way up first of all, I'm sure that's wrong.

This is the right way up, or the glass, yes, that's a good idea.

No, that's wrong.

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00:04:58,000 --> 00:05:00,000

That's it.

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00:05:00,000 --> 00:05:03,000

Topics, that's just topics.

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00:05:03,000 --> 00:05:08,000

Yes, well, now, the first thing that I'll tell you is a lot of people have wondered,

where do they come from?

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00:05:10,000 --> 00:05:11,000

That's the first thing.

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00:05:11,000 --> 00:05:14,000

Well, now, you're in for a surprise here.

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00:05:14,000 --> 00:05:18,000

They do not come from our solar system originally.

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00:05:18,000 --> 00:05:20,000

They come from far outside the solar system,

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00:05:21,000 --> 00:05:25,000

and they are capable, a scientist, please note, of overdrive.

By overdrive, I mean exceeding the speed of light.

And when I expressed a certain surprise about this, this person said,

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00:05:33,000 --> 00:05:43,000

oh, look, Philip, about 1800, it was stated definitely that anybody traveled more than 30 miles an hour would disintegrate.

And I remember Harry Harper, who was probably the world's first air correspondent about 1910.

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00:05:50,000 --> 00:05:55,000

He was told authoritatively that airfields were never going to go more than 100 miles an hour.

And you remember just before, just after the war, when they began to break the sound barrier,

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00:06:00,000 --> 00:06:08,000

my brother, who's a scientist, PhD in physics, he said he thought they'd never break through the sound barrier.

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00:06:09,000 --> 00:06:15,000

And people have been talking recently about the light barrier, where they can travel faster than that.

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00:06:15,000 --> 00:06:20,000

And what I can say is that the planet that this particular group comes from,

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00:06:20,000 --> 00:06:24,000

from a planet, and I can tell you the name, it's called EODS.

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00:06:24,000 --> 00:06:30,000

If you want to take it down, it's A-E-O-D-Z in our spelling.

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00:06:30,000 --> 00:06:34,000

You see, I'm allowed to give certain of their names, I will say that.

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00:06:34,000 --> 00:06:38,000

They can travel at a tremendous speed, apparently.

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00:06:38,000 --> 00:06:43,000

I was told it took 30 days to get here, but another, what I call an elder,

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00:06:43,000 --> 00:06:48,000

I'll tell you about an elder, the elder's in a minute, told me that it's more than that.

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00:06:48,000 --> 00:06:55,000

And yet, when they say, they may say that they come from Venus or from the moon.

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00:06:55,000 --> 00:07:02,000

Well, now that may be correct, because apparently they have bases on the planets in this solar system.

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00:07:02,000 --> 00:07:08,000

You know very well that our astronauts will eventually have a base on the moon,

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00:07:08,000 --> 00:07:11,000

but the moon is uninhabitable, so we think.

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00:07:11,000 --> 00:07:15,000

The moon is uninhabitable, and yet we can have bases on it.

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00:07:15,000 --> 00:07:18,000

Well, apparently, and I'm not quite certain about this,

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00:07:18,000 --> 00:07:22,000

because they will not tell me precisely which planets are inhabited,

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00:07:22,000 --> 00:07:30,000

they do use, they may use Venus as a kind of, the word they use is bestop.

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00:07:30,000 --> 00:07:33,000

That's about they use several times.

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00:07:33,000 --> 00:07:38,000

And you'll find that the scientists say, the skeptical scientists say,

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00:07:38,000 --> 00:07:41,000

that it is impossible for a flying source of the existence,

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00:07:41,000 --> 00:07:43,000

because there's no where they can come from.

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00:07:43,000 --> 00:07:49,000

Well, the thing is this, they have these bases, fairly near to us.

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00:07:49,000 --> 00:07:53,000

I think they've got, I'm pretty sure they've got bases on the moon.

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00:07:53,000 --> 00:07:55,000

And there's a certain amount of evidence for this,

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00:07:55,000 --> 00:07:58,000

you've probably heard them in the second moon landing.

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00:07:58,000 --> 00:08:00,000

What's the name of the, not explorer,

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00:08:00,000 --> 00:08:03,000

what was the one that landed two years ago?

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00:08:03,000 --> 00:08:06,000

No, not now, no, does anybody know?

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00:08:06,000 --> 00:08:08,000

So there?

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00:08:08,000 --> 00:08:09,000

So there too, yes.

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00:08:09,000 --> 00:08:13,000

Well, you know when our chaps came near to it, they, one of them said,

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00:08:13,000 --> 00:08:16,000

and it was definitely heard over the radio,

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00:08:16,000 --> 00:08:17,000

though they've suppressed it since,

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00:08:17,000 --> 00:08:20,000

that he thought something had landed near to it.

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00:08:20,000 --> 00:08:23,000

Well, anyway, that is the answer.

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00:08:23,000 --> 00:08:25,000

They are able to come all this way,

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00:08:25,000 --> 00:08:28,000

but I must now explain that I only know members of one group,

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00:08:28,000 --> 00:08:31,000

and a more than one group here.

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00:08:31,000 --> 00:08:33,000

These are the people that I know,

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00:08:33,000 --> 00:08:36,000

and I know them, some of them, at least one of them,

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00:08:36,000 --> 00:08:38,000

as well as I know anybody here.

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00:08:38,000 --> 00:08:43,000

And although I haven't had the, I've never been in a spacecraft,

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00:08:43,000 --> 00:08:45,000

still this have I been into outer space,

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00:08:45,000 --> 00:08:48,000

but I have met them on the ground,

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00:08:48,000 --> 00:08:51,000

and I've been far more mixed up with them, shall we say,

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00:08:51,000 --> 00:08:54,000

far more involved with them than I think any other,

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00:08:54,000 --> 00:08:57,000

at least more than Adam's, he met his people,

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00:08:57,000 --> 00:09:00,000

on board, either in a café, or,

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00:09:00,000 --> 00:09:02,000

and he was taken on board a craft,

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00:09:02,000 --> 00:09:05,000

but with me, I've, they were more or less diplomats,

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00:09:05,000 --> 00:09:08,000

and I've known these people when they were here,

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00:09:08,000 --> 00:09:11,000

and I can assure you that sometimes when they're here,

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00:09:11,000 --> 00:09:13,000

they're far from happy.

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00:09:13,000 --> 00:09:16,000

In fact, they sometimes feel terribly lonely,

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00:09:16,000 --> 00:09:18,000

and I've known them in a very, very bad state,

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00:09:18,000 --> 00:09:23,000

because of the fear and the loneliness and isolation.

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00:09:23,000 --> 00:09:26,000

And one of the, the person I was talking to two days ago

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00:09:26,000 --> 00:09:30,000

was saying that our astronauts, when they go to the moon,

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00:09:30,000 --> 00:09:32,000

they probably feel terribly lonely,

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00:09:32,000 --> 00:09:34,000

at least when they're in space,

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00:09:34,000 --> 00:09:36,000

even if they're in radio contact with the Earth.

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00:09:36,000 --> 00:09:40,000

Well, no, that is where they come from,

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00:09:40,000 --> 00:09:45,000

and now I'd like to debunk a lot of nonsense

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00:09:45,000 --> 00:09:47,000

that's been flying about.

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00:09:47,000 --> 00:09:49,000

There's been a frightful lot of nonsense

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00:09:49,000 --> 00:09:52,000

for the simple reason that people have spun ideas

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00:09:52,000 --> 00:09:54,000

about outer space, space people,

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00:09:54,000 --> 00:09:57,000

without any actual knowledge of them.

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00:09:57,000 --> 00:10:01,000

And what's one of the ideas is that they're etheric entities.

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00:10:01,000 --> 00:10:02,000

That's one of the idea.

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00:10:02,000 --> 00:10:06,000

Now, there is that they're low astral entities.

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00:10:06,000 --> 00:10:08,000

One lady, by the way,

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00:10:08,000 --> 00:10:10,000

when I was doing an investigation on the,

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00:10:10,000 --> 00:10:12,000

of the phenomena of April the 25th last,

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00:10:12,000 --> 00:10:15,000

she sent a track to me saying that these,

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00:10:15,000 --> 00:10:18,000

these flying saucers are actually

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00:10:18,000 --> 00:10:20,000

emanations of the devil.

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00:10:20,000 --> 00:10:23,000

They enter the human being through his private parts,

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00:10:23,000 --> 00:10:25,000

and they're actually, in fact, no bigger than a pinhead.

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00:10:25,000 --> 00:10:29,000

Now, that's a lot of the nonsense that's going around.

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00:10:29,000 --> 00:10:31,000

And some people think that these,

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00:10:31,000 --> 00:10:33,000

these people are astral projections,

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00:10:33,000 --> 00:10:35,000

and they're not real people at all,

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00:10:35,000 --> 00:10:37,000

but I can assure you that they are solid.

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00:10:37,000 --> 00:10:40,000

In fact, some of them are down-site solid, most of you.

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00:10:40,000 --> 00:10:42,000

So they are real people.

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00:10:42,000 --> 00:10:46,000

As for the, the fact that I know that they are from outer space,

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00:10:46,000 --> 00:10:49,000

that would involve my giving too much away.

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00:10:49,000 --> 00:10:51,000

So I'm afraid I can't tell you that.

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00:10:51,000 --> 00:10:54,000

But I can tell you that I'm very glad to say

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00:10:54,000 --> 00:10:56,000

that some of the recordings that I have,

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00:10:56,000 --> 00:10:59,000

although by no means all, are definitely from them.

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00:10:59,000 --> 00:11:01,000

And one which is on the machine now,

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00:11:01,000 --> 00:11:03,000

which I hope you'll be able to hear,

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00:11:03,000 --> 00:11:05,000

although I'm afraid it was very lightly recorded,

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00:11:05,000 --> 00:11:07,000

was not only made on a spacecraft,

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00:11:07,000 --> 00:11:09,000

but without having heard it,

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00:11:09,000 --> 00:11:12,000

they were able to tell me that words, the words are on it.

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00:11:12,000 --> 00:11:15,000

And I'm, I'm very pleased to say that one of them,

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00:11:15,000 --> 00:11:19,000

who was then a girl, whose voice you'll hear, I now know her.

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00:11:19,000 --> 00:11:22,000

And when I first met her, I didn't know who she was.

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00:11:22,000 --> 00:11:23,000

She didn't know who I was,

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00:11:23,000 --> 00:11:26,000

and we had a very unhappy first meeting, I'm afraid,

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00:11:26,000 --> 00:11:28,000

that then things became very different.

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00:11:28,000 --> 00:11:31,000

We became very fond of each other, that's putting it mildly.

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00:11:31,000 --> 00:11:34,000

And later it was told who she was.

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00:11:34,000 --> 00:11:38,000

Now I can give the name, the name was Bronja.

And I'm allowed to give her name, that she uses now, that's Chesque.

It's a funny name, but she's called Chesque.

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00:11:44,000 --> 00:11:48,000

But unfortunately, she's been ill and had to go, go away.

Whether she'll come back, I don't know, but she is on the tape.

And I have been told how it was done.

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00:11:55,000 --> 00:11:58,000

So there is a connection, there's a dynamic connection,

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00:11:58,000 --> 00:12:02,000

between the space people and these tapes of mine.

But as for the other groups, I don't really know anything about.

But I have some information here,

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00:12:10,000 --> 00:12:13,000

and I thought that after this introductory talk,

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00:12:13,000 --> 00:12:17,000

I would like to read out in my, I can write it better than I can read it,

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00:12:17,000 --> 00:12:19,000

so I may read it very badly.

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00:12:19,000 --> 00:12:23,000

But here is a list of topics that I'm willing to talk about.

Now, I've been given precise information on that,

and if you'd like to know that, about that I'll tell you.

But now I'll read through the list.

The first one is Earth history.

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00:12:59,000 --> 00:13:05,000

That's going back to the early population of this planet.

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00:13:05,000 --> 00:13:08,000

The next one is Captain Mantell.

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00:13:08,000 --> 00:13:10,000

But I mustn't tell you too much about that,

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00:13:10,000 --> 00:13:13,000

because I haven't discussed that two nights ago,

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00:13:13,000 --> 00:13:16,000

and part of it may be classified.

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00:13:16,000 --> 00:13:19,000

Now, the next one is Kenneth Arnold.

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00:13:19,000 --> 00:13:21,000

I've got some information on him.

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00:13:21,000 --> 00:13:23,000

Now, I've got information.

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00:13:23,000 --> 00:13:27,000

This was, as a result of a discussion, a question that I've had answered,

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00:13:27,000 --> 00:13:28,000

lays.

You know the lays, the lines travelling all across the country and across Europe.

That's one subject connected with Kinder Scout, near to us.

Any of you who've read Adamski's second book will know

358

that he sat in the room in the Big Mothership

359

and he was given a projection of pictures from Venus

with no particular point, no screen or anything like that.

Well, now that's what they would do in the case of the Flatwoods monster.

and that would erase the memory and they forget all about the other thing.

Now then, that's one case and now I'd like to tell you the story of Mrs. Buxton.

One was of a flying train before the war by Mrs. Pleasance.

374

I'm allowed to give these names.

Mrs. Pleasance saw this.

376

I know I've seen her daughter Janik quite a bit recently

377

and she saw a flying train going through the sky.

378

I haven't asked about this and it looked as if it had carried windows

379

00:21:32,000 --> 00:21:35,000

and this was long before anybody dreamt about Flying Sources.

380

But the best sighting was by a very quiet lady,

381

Mrs. Buxton, whose husband used to own Fox House Garage.

382

I knew her husband and her daughter Norma,

383

00:21:44,000 --> 00:21:47,000

but I didn't know her because she was a very retiring person.

384

00:21:47,000 --> 00:21:52,000

And there was an article in the paper in the spring of 1957

385

and Mr. Buxton said to my sister,

386

00:21:56,000 --> 00:21:58,000

my wife has seen something marvellous.

387

00:21:58,000 --> 00:22:00,000

She's a most reliable person

388

00:22:00,000 --> 00:22:03,000

and she'd like Philip to know about it,

389

00:22:03,000 --> 00:22:07,000

so I went up and she told me the following story.

390

When she was walking along Verbage Book,

391

it was a beautiful day

392

and over the surprise rocks,

393

I'd have to take you there to give you the idea of the environment.

394

She saw something dark filling the sky

395

and there was a huge cigar shaped craft

396

about 2,000 feet long.

397

Judging by the altitude and the angle,

398

it was dark brown, had flat ends

399

and absolutely no features at all,

400

apart from a huge metallic plate across the middle.

401

And this was going about 120-140 miles an hour.

402

Going straight overhead and suddenly she heard the sound of an engine

403

and from the other direction she saw an aeroplane.

An ordinary aeroplane,

405

she wasn't interested in the aeroplane,

406

and it appeared that they were going to crash.

407

She was rather frightened,

408

but fortunately the aeroplane went over the big craft,

409

the family, she told the family, but she didn't tell me.

And unfortunately I couldn't register it as a sighting

430

00:24:07,000 --> 00:24:10,000

because of the fact that there was no date it was given.

431

Anyway, all kinds of people came along with explanations.

432

One explanation I had by thought communication

433

was that our aircraft have a very narrow field of vision,

and he probably didn't see it,

435

he probably thought it was seeing things

436

and going a bit lower over the ground or something like that.

437

Another one anthroposophical friend of mine

438

gave the most delightfully Freudian explanation,

439

00:24:34,000 --> 00:24:37,000

which I can't give to before decent ladies and gentlemen.

440

And Mr. Peter Maysfield,

441

my friend Tony Redd, I went to see him

442

made by the RAF.

444

The only thing I got that explanation,

445

that the airship was built in 1957 or 1958,

446

00:24:52,000 --> 00:24:54,000

and this took place in 1954.

447

So therefore it was a piece of precognition.

448

No, then I've just been given the explanation.

449

This is what they did.

450

It wasn't a craft at all, it was a projection.

451

The idea was that Mrs. Buxton was a very sensitive

452

and a very discreet person.

453

By the way, the account she gave me was deadly accurate.

454

It was perfectly true.

455

00:25:17,000 --> 00:25:21,000

What they did was they wanted to rivet her attention on the sky,

456

00:25:21,000 --> 00:25:24,000

and that very active riveting attention

457

00:25:24,000 --> 00:25:30,000

would influence people several miles away in Hillsborough.

458

00:25:30,000 --> 00:25:34,000

So they prepared them to make their sighting.

459

00:25:34,000 --> 00:25:37,000

She said that I've always assumed that what they saw

460

00:25:37,000 --> 00:25:40,000

was what she saw, because I've never been able to trace the account

461

00:25:40,000 --> 00:25:41,000

in the newspaper.

462

00:25:41,000 --> 00:25:44,000

A friend of mine was searched for ages and could never find it.

463

00:25:44,000 --> 00:25:48,000

We think that the space people put a kind of bake on it.

464

00:25:48,000 --> 00:25:52,000

But what happened was they saw something different,

465

00:25:52,000 --> 00:25:55,000

and it was a very good sighting, but it wasn't what she saw.

466

00:25:55,000 --> 00:25:59,000

That was actually a three-dimensional projection.

467

00:25:59,000 --> 00:26:01,000

And that's what they can do.

468

00:26:01,000 --> 00:26:03,000

In the case of Flatwood monsters and things like that,

469

00:26:03,000 --> 00:26:05,000

they can project these things.

470

00:26:05,000 --> 00:26:09,000

Now, I'm only saying what I'm told,

471

00:26:09,000 --> 00:26:14,000

and I'm allowed to give this out, this bit of information out.

472

Right, that's one.

473

00:26:16,000 --> 00:26:19,000

Well, I took just looking down my list,

474

00:26:19,000 --> 00:26:22,000

but it got two items here following on one another,

475

00:26:22,000 --> 00:26:23,000

that looked as though they said,

476

00:26:23,000 --> 00:26:25,000

legs and chest, but on looking more closely,

477

00:26:25,000 --> 00:26:27,000

I see they're Lazy Christ.

478

00:26:27,000 --> 00:26:30,000

But I think I'll pass those over,

479

00:26:30,000 --> 00:26:33,000

and go on to one that I know is made dear to your own heart,

480

00:26:33,000 --> 00:26:35,000

the subject of George King.

481

00:26:35,000 --> 00:26:37,000

What can you tell us about him?

482

00:26:37,000 --> 00:26:39,000

The person who ordered laughter.

483

00:26:39,000 --> 00:26:42,000

The mention of him, particularly when I gave an imitation of

484

00:26:42,000 --> 00:26:44,000

Miles 2nd to 6th!

485

00:26:44,000 --> 00:26:48,000

And also, I told him about how he was singing a popular song

486

00:26:48,000 --> 00:26:51,000

and a yogi jumped through the window or something like that.

487

00:26:51,000 --> 00:26:53,000

I had peels of laughter.

488

00:26:53,000 --> 00:26:57,000

And I was told of what a \$50 doctor.

489

00:26:57,000 --> 00:27:01,000

So I'd rather not say any more than that.

490

00:27:01,000 --> 00:27:03,000

I think that's enough, isn't it?

491

00:27:03,000 --> 00:27:05,000

Probably, yes.

492

00:27:05,000 --> 00:27:09,000

Well, all right, let's...

493

00:27:09,000 --> 00:27:12,000

We'll have questions afterwards.

494

00:27:12,000 --> 00:27:14,000

Brian, after tea, I think.

495

00:27:14,000 --> 00:27:20,000

There's one thing that's going from one that's perhaps dear to your heart,

496

and everyone looks not exactly dear to mind,

497

but very well known to it. Captain Mantell.

498

Yes.

499

Oh, well, now there's one thing I'd rather not say,

500

because I haven't...

one thing that nobody knows, but it was a genuine sighting.

502

That's all I can say, but I'm...

503

What I'll do, I'll make a note of Captain Mantell,

504

but I was told something that's rather astonishing about it.

505

It was genuine all right.

506

He wasn't seeing spots before his eyes,

507

00:27:47,000 --> 00:27:49,000

nor was he chasing the planet Venus.

508

To see if I'm allowed to give away this piece of information.

509

Just put...

510

I've got a bit discreet about that, because it was a subject...

511

You see, I was asked over the phone,

512

Only they have, this is a very amusing thing to me,

they just have a single tunnel, they only have a single track,

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00:30:29,000 --> 00:30:31,000

they don't run double tracks.

554

And one of them, when I just knew where she was from,

555

she said, Philip, what's it like in a train?

556

00:30:39,000 --> 00:30:41,000

That was on the phone.

557

I thought, haven't you been in one?

558

00:30:43,000 --> 00:30:45,000

She told me out, but she'd never been in a train.

559

00:30:45,000 --> 00:30:48,000

And she came to our house, and she was going through it,

560

00:30:48,000 --> 00:30:51,000

and she was in a diesel train, you see,

561

00:30:51,000 --> 00:30:54,000

and diesel rail car, and she liked it.

562

Only she had a terrible fight, they went into a tunnel,

563

and she saw another train coming for them.

564

And she thought it was headed straight for them.

565

She had just a shock of her life,

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00:31:02,000 --> 00:31:05,000

and she didn't realize it was going past, you see.

567

So that's a little bit about their transport.

568

Now, I was ticked off for, I was rather ticked off for telling them too much.

569

570

Is that Honey's Bell? No.

571

It's something that's right.

Oh, is it? I wondered what it was, because I'm very sensitive to sounds.
