But in the meantime, after I did go to bed, I was just joking, so, and it wasn't because

and I didn't go to sleep for many hours.

We've seen falling meteors and what we thought to be stars, various things, but we've never

Now I have been asked, what is this light?

125

And the only thing I can say to describe it is, if you have ever met a car on a highway,

126

with a high beam on, with a white light, well, if you just can imagine putting twelve of

127

00:09:37,720 --> 00:09:42,720

those together in a circle, or in a ball, whichever way you like, and you're looking

128

right into it, I was standing there and I had to hold my head because my eyes seemed

129

00:09:48,720 --> 00:09:50,720

to be drawn right out of my head.

130

But anyway, that is the only description that I can give it.

131

Now, I was so fascinated and so frightened I was wanting to hear if I could hear anything

132

like a motor or what was driving it, and I couldn't on the count of these pieces and

making such a classic, and the honking and the flapping of the wings that I couldn't hear

134

Now, if there was any sound of anything like a plane or a drone or any kind of a sound,

136

I got to admit that I could not hear that.

137

It could have been too for my fear and my nervousness, along with the ducks that may have

138

heard, maybe, that I couldn't hear anything or couldn't hear any sound.

139

But any further than that, I couldn't say that I saw any more.

140

Now, when you speak of 12 headlights, do you mean it was the greatest 12 headlights

141

combined with one, or did these appear as separate lights from the other?

142

They were combined as one.

143

They just seemed to be like one big ball just running into the other.

144

Could you give me any idea of how the size of the object would compare, let's say,

to the full meaning that has been in that position?

So it has much bigger than that.

147

Well, I have been asked about how big it was, how far away it was.

148

Now, the only way I can judge about one mile from us is a provincial park on the north side of the dam.

149

Halfway up from that park is a point to most, which we figure is halfway.

150

00:11:27,720 --> 00:11:34,720

Then, in between that halfway point and our home, is a small bay called McCoy Bay.

151

And it was just round about McCoy Bay that this object appeared and went up over the hill,

152

00:11:40,720 --> 00:11:44,720

so that I would figure it just serves about a quarter of a mile away.

153

And how far above the water that is, closest to close to me?

154

00:11:48,720 --> 00:11:53,720

Well, it is pretty high to drag, but I would say between 50 to 100 feet.

155

Now, you spoke of a white light.

156

There was a very thin, the only thing that stood for you.

157

00:11:58,720 --> 00:12:02,720

Yes, there was kind of a blue, the blue start of the paint.

158

00:12:02,720 --> 00:12:07,720

Something that's a bit of light that we have here in the street, but there was just this kind of a blue-y light.

159

00:12:07,720 --> 00:12:11,720

Do you remember where the conditions were, the clouds were clear?

160

00:12:11,720 --> 00:12:14,720

No, it was a very nice, bright, starlight night.

161

00:12:14,720 --> 00:12:15,720

That's why I was looking up.

162

00:12:15,720 --> 00:12:16,720

It wasn't bright.

163

00:12:16,720 --> 00:12:19,720

It was a dark night, but there was a great many stars there.

164

00:12:19,720 --> 00:12:25,720

And that is when I stood there before I went to bed and looked at the star of the night, and then again, made it.

165

Now, when it lit up the wall, would you say it was as bright as a full moon or in the middle of the water?

166

00:12:31,720 --> 00:12:33,720

Yes, it would be.

167

00:12:33,720 --> 00:12:41,720

It would be here by the vast, except the whole moon usually makes a gold night, but this makes kind of a whole light.

168

00:12:41,720 --> 00:12:45,720

Do you mind if I use this on the radio, perhaps?

169

00:12:45,720 --> 00:12:53,720

No, if you would care to, if I could help a call and anything that might be very infertile to you, if I would ideally go ahead.

I'll put it to very much for you to start.
