I had no experience with photographs, or anything, on that order,

145

161

169

When I know this is a story, finally, great time.

170

00:13:19,000 --> 00:13:27,000

Well, this wind, he's worked the examiner,

171

00:13:27,000 --> 00:13:31,000

and he came out on TV every short statement.

172

00:13:31,000 --> 00:13:35,000

And then, of course, the associated blasts were sent out there,

173

00:13:35,000 --> 00:13:41,000

the associated blasts that he exposed, that he wrote about all of you,

174

00:13:41,000 --> 00:13:45,000

were sent out there, listened to what we were discussing,

175

00:13:45,000 --> 00:13:52,000

both of them discussing stuff, and they were all down and up and down.

I have three words, though,

191

and they told you what,

193

and I got up, went outside,

194

to see what he was talking about,

195

00:14:47,000 --> 00:14:50,000

and his highway was in front of my house,

196

00:14:50,000 --> 00:14:52,000

a bar on the monster road,

197

00:14:52,000 --> 00:14:55,000

and as the car stepped down from the house,

198

00:14:55,000 --> 00:14:56,000

drove by on his yard,

199

00:14:56,000 --> 00:15:00,000

and I could see the blackout man and his step-man,

200

00:15:00,000 --> 00:15:02,000

no light.

201

00:15:02,000 --> 00:15:05,000

The last of what happened that morning,

202

00:15:05,000 --> 00:15:07,000

I came back to the house, got a gun,

203

00:15:07,000 --> 00:15:12,000

went back outside, got behind the storm shelter,

204

00:15:12,000 --> 00:15:16,000

and in a little bit by this car,

205

00:15:16,000 --> 00:15:19,000

came on by the house, running through,

206

00:15:19,000 --> 00:15:22,000

and no light went on up somewhere,

207

00:15:22,000 --> 00:15:25,000

turned around, and came back back,

208

00:15:25,000 --> 00:15:27,000

filled with no light.

209

00:15:27,000 --> 00:15:28,000

The other blackout man,

210

00:15:28,000 --> 00:15:30,000

he was cornered in the house,

211

00:15:30,000 --> 00:15:33,000

and he bought a great shot.

212

00:15:33,000 --> 00:15:35,000

For a long time, he'd shoot man up,

213

00:15:35,000 --> 00:15:37,000

and I don't know how many times they shot,

214

00:15:37,000 --> 00:15:40,000

back to where they used to be, or what.

215

00:15:40,000 --> 00:15:43,000

But I shot back,

216

00:15:43,000 --> 00:15:47,000

and being on the back,

217

00:15:47,000 --> 00:15:50,000

I just went ahead and told what had happened.

218

00:15:50,000 --> 00:15:53,000

Did you have any bullets,

219

00:15:53,000 --> 00:15:56,000

or had lights anywhere near you?

220

00:15:56,000 --> 00:15:58,000

No.

221

00:15:58,000 --> 00:16:01,000

We'd hit 90 bullets to hit a round road.

222

00:16:01,000 --> 00:16:03,000

We found where the,

223

00:16:03,000 --> 00:16:06,000

I guess the ballpark snail found

224

00:16:06,000 --> 00:16:08,000

where the car sat around.

225

00:16:08,000 --> 00:16:10,000

But we'd hit 90 in place

226

00:16:10,000 --> 00:16:12,000

where the head round road was made.

227

00:16:12,000 --> 00:16:14,000

And you don't have any evidence

228

00:16:14,000 --> 00:16:16,000

that you hit them, either, huh?

229

00:16:16,000 --> 00:16:17,000

No.

230

00:16:17,000 --> 00:16:19,000

Well, certainly it's an interesting story.

231

00:16:19,000 --> 00:16:21,000

Have you had any threats on yourself?

232

00:16:21,000 --> 00:16:23,000

Is that for you?

233

00:16:23,000 --> 00:16:29,000

They are conducting a visual investigation out of this,

234

00:16:29,000 --> 00:16:35,000

and I was talking to one of the investigators,

235

00:16:35,000 --> 00:16:40,000

Jackie, and I talked to a police in an umbrella.

236

00:16:40,000 --> 00:16:43,000

And for all of them,

237

00:16:43,000 --> 00:16:45,000

I guess it was about an hour,

238

00:16:45,000 --> 00:16:47,000

that's something like that, I kind of told.

239

00:16:47,000 --> 00:16:51,000

So, forging me not to get it stirred up again.

240

00:16:51,000 --> 00:16:53,000

I reached out of my hands,

241

00:16:53,000 --> 00:16:55,000

there was a visual investigation,

242

00:16:55,000 --> 00:16:59,000

and it began, and they were continuing.

243

00:16:59,000 --> 00:17:01,000

They were already hit in the tank.

244

00:17:01,000 --> 00:17:03,000

Now, who does this involve? The FBI?

245

00:17:03,000 --> 00:17:06,000

No, the University of Colorado.

246

00:17:06,000 --> 00:17:09,000

Oh, I see, they're in on a doctor's conduct.

247

00:17:09,000 --> 00:17:11,000

Yeah.

248

00:17:11,000 --> 00:17:14,000

There were three investigators down here,

249

00:17:14,000 --> 00:17:16,000

on Monday morning.

250

00:17:16,000 --> 00:17:18,000

And they went around, oh, they,

251

00:17:18,000 --> 00:17:20,000

I don't know what all they done,

252

00:17:20,000 --> 00:17:25,000

but they are done with the interstit,

253

00:17:25,000 --> 00:17:30,000

and they've had to have been sent to the University of Colorado.

254

00:17:30,000 --> 00:17:33,000

And of course, I don't know what all they're doing.

255

00:17:33,000 --> 00:17:35,000

They told me they'd come up with something,

256

00:17:35,000 --> 00:17:37,000

probably a conversation with someone.

257

00:17:37,000 --> 00:17:40,000

Now, have you made copies of the photos?

258

00:17:40,000 --> 00:17:41,000

No, no.

259

00:17:41,000 --> 00:17:44,000

Oh, this is unfortunate, I think it should have.

260

00:17:44,000 --> 00:17:48,000

Because now you don't have anything at all, do you?

261

00:17:48,000 --> 00:17:53,000

No, I have certified mail.

262

00:17:53,000 --> 00:17:59,000

I'll have certified mail for the disease.

263

00:17:59,000 --> 00:18:01,000

And they promised to send them back to you?

264

00:18:01,000 --> 00:18:02,000

Yeah.

265

00:18:02,000 --> 00:18:04,000

Well, I would have sent the University,

266

00:18:04,000 --> 00:18:06,000

would keep the word on that.

267

00:18:06,000 --> 00:18:09,000

I wouldn't have done it quite so sure.

268

00:18:09,000 --> 00:18:12,000

Other agencies had gotten it, but I think they would.

269

00:18:12,000 --> 00:18:13,000

Yeah.

270

00:18:13,000 --> 00:18:15,000

Well, they think they're lucky that it was overfined

271

00:18:15,000 --> 00:18:20,000

on these three investigators being in the community several times.

272

00:18:20,000 --> 00:18:23,000

They didn't have them before, that people had been threatened.

273

00:18:23,000 --> 00:18:27,000

And the state and the family were just involved

274

00:18:27,000 --> 00:18:29,000

and they were going to get the whole thing.

275
