And after that he will answer written questions.

The audience will have an opportunity to write the questions after the lecture and before the film,

Mr. Desmond Leslie, ladies and gentlemen,

18

gives me tremendous pleasure tonight to introduce to you who I think is really one of the most

certainly memorable people we will ever meet in our generation.

20

It's not every day you run into somebody who is accustomed to hot-knock with space men

21

and to make friends with them as Mr. Adamski has done.

I'm perhaps in a rather privileged position as I have known Mr. Adamski since 1954,

and I have lived with him in California,

24

where I can tell you now we did see Flying Sources on several occasions,

once as near as that projector is for me,

26

and only very recently I was with him when we had the privilege of meeting a space man.

I not get to talk very long.

28

My function rarely is a sort of stooge in between the chairmen and the speaker.

It's a sort of keeping things scary while the last people sit settle down

30

and sort of kick the neighbors' red-naked butts and gently enjoy themselves.

31

I have never seen Mr. Adamski looking so well on such full of themes,

32

even though he has been more than halfway around the world.

33

He has, I think he's got 60 or 70 lectures on this world program.

34

You're going to tell you a great deal of things, not in the books you've read,

35

and we do her two questions you'll ask.

It will be there to bring out more things that you want to know.

You're also going to see, which I may tell you is a very remarkable film,

I've seen it this afternoon on a static projector, analyzing some of them.

They're quite the best movies I've seen on Flying Sources.

Well, everyone seems fairly happy, very proud, so let's get me out of the way

42

and hand you over to Georgia Adamski.

Thank you, Mr. Adamski.

I'm glad to be here after disappointing a lot of you three years back

45

when I couldn't make it when everything was really set up.

46

I have much to say in reference to what I've transpired in the last 11 years,

47

00:04:17,000 --> 00:04:21,000

but I'll let that go toward the last.

48

I will begin at the moment with my experience with the movie,

49

You Are More Interested, than what has transpired in the governments themselves.

First of all, I would like everybody else being brought up in a way

51

as sort of an astronomer by taking up astronomy 1929.

52

00:04:44,000 --> 00:04:49,000

Naturally, we were taught that there was no one in our system

53

00:04:49,000 --> 00:04:53,000

on any of the other planets but ourselves.

54

Naturally, when they appeared on the scene, it was hard to accept

55

after you've been taught that way.

56

00:05:00,000 --> 00:05:04,000

Yet many, many times I have questioned whether the information given

57

during the astronomical studies were really correct.

58

I've been quite inquisitive ever since I was born, I might say.

59

I tried to question everything quite critical of some of them,

60

00:05:17,000 --> 00:05:20,000

so in this case it was no exception.

61

So finally, in 1946, in October,

62

when all of us that were amateur astronomers were informed

63

to count the meteorites that had followed during that month,

64

00:05:34,000 --> 00:05:36,000

if they think it was on the 19th,

65

00:05:36,000 --> 00:05:40,000

count them as years record as how many would fall in per minute.

66

00:05:40,000 --> 00:05:43,000

The moon naturally was shining bright,

67

00:05:43,000 --> 00:05:46,000

so some of the small ones could not be counted on the scene.

68

00:05:46,000 --> 00:05:49,000

But during that time, quite a large number of us,

69

and Desmond Hampton on that property,

70

00:05:52,000 --> 00:05:55,000

were overlooking George San Diego,

71

00:05:55,000 --> 00:05:58,000

which is few mountains ahead of us there

72

00:05:58,000 --> 00:06:01,000

known as the Rodriguez Mountain, the Belgium Mountain,

73

00:06:01,000 --> 00:06:04,000

while the Palomar is in the background of us.

74

00:06:04,000 --> 00:06:07,000

We saw this big ship appear,

75

00:06:07,000 --> 00:06:10,000

and it was something like at the original size,

76

00:06:10,000 --> 00:06:15,000

but it didn't have a basket underneath which was strange.

77

00:06:15,000 --> 00:06:19,000

This basket was missing as a customary within,

78

00:06:19,000 --> 00:06:22,000

well, due to warning, I have developed something

79

00:06:22,000 --> 00:06:24,000

we never heard nothing about.

80

00:06:24,000 --> 00:06:26,000

So we let it go at that,

81

00:06:26,000 --> 00:06:28,000

but suddenly the thing shot out into outer space,

82

00:06:28,000 --> 00:06:33,000

straight up, awfully fast, and left the amper trail behind it.

83

00:06:33,000 --> 00:06:35,000

Well, we questioned that a little bit,

84

00:06:35,000 --> 00:06:38,000

and referenced to the amper trail.

85

00:06:38,000 --> 00:06:40,000

Still didn't pick nothing of it.

86

00:06:40,000 --> 00:06:41,000

After it's gone out of sight,

87

00:06:41,000 --> 00:06:43,000

the wind alarm would count and meteorites.

88

00:06:43,000 --> 00:06:46,000

We went to this cafe, which Miss Wells wrote

89

that I never owned a business of any kind.

90

00:06:48,000 --> 00:06:50,000

I didn't own this cafe.

91

00:06:50,000 --> 00:06:53,000

I lived on the property and been seen in the cafe

92

00:06:53,000 --> 00:06:55,000

a lot of time talking to people.

93

00:06:55,000 --> 00:06:57,000

So we went to this cafe,

94

00:06:57,000 --> 00:07:01,000

and of course, the Kansas City San Diego Station

95

00:07:01,000 --> 00:07:06,000

was broadcasting the news of the meteorites and other things.

96

00:07:06,000 --> 00:07:10,000

And they mentioned this particular ship.

97

00:07:10,000 --> 00:07:14,000

They said it was a spacecraft that passed over San Diego,

98

00:07:14,000 --> 00:07:18,000

a big one, which was Mother Shared, Mother Shared Type,

99

00:07:18,000 --> 00:07:20,000

so we didn't tell sense.

100

00:07:20,000 --> 00:07:25,000

And Jack, they didn't know why it didn't land,

101

00:07:25,000 --> 00:07:29,000

so they consupled the meteor down there in San Diego

102

00:07:29,000 --> 00:07:32,000

to follow the Shepard Mintley.

103

00:07:32,000 --> 00:07:35,000

I'm giving it to you as it was given then.

104

00:07:35,000 --> 00:07:38,000

And she was supposed to have gone out to contact them

105

00:07:38,000 --> 00:07:42,000

Mintley and come back stating that it did not land

106

00:07:42,000 --> 00:07:46,000

because they did not know how they would be received.

107

00:07:46,000 --> 00:07:49,000

That was the reason. And that's all that was to it.

108

00:07:49,000 --> 00:07:54,000

Well, few Sundays after that, finally,

109

00:07:54,000 --> 00:07:57,000

people coming up to this cafe,

110

00:07:57,000 --> 00:08:01,000

there was Pro-Con, knowing that I was interested in astronomy

111

00:08:01,000 --> 00:08:04,000

and all the direction on it right there,

112

00:08:04,000 --> 00:08:09,000

two people had come from the top, 200 engines out going.

113

00:08:09,000 --> 00:08:12,000

So we had an argument going on.

114

00:08:12,000 --> 00:08:14,000

Pro-Con, among some people there,

115

00:08:14,000 --> 00:08:17,000

had come up to the restaurant to eat.

116

00:08:17,000 --> 00:08:20,000

And I was saying at the time, it was fantastic,

117

00:08:20,000 --> 00:08:23,000

basing it at the time on the information received

118

00:08:23,000 --> 00:08:26,000

through astronomical teachings.

119

00:08:26,000 --> 00:08:30,000

When three officers were sitting at a table next to the table

120

00:08:30,000 --> 00:08:34,000

I was talking to, and one was a captain.

121

00:08:34,000 --> 00:08:36,000

They were from Arizona.

122

00:08:36,000 --> 00:08:38,000

And finally, they couldn't stand it, I guess,

123

00:08:38,000 --> 00:08:39,000

and he woke up and he says,

124

00:08:39,000 --> 00:08:42,000

this might as fantastic as it sounds.

125

00:08:42,000 --> 00:08:44,000

When you're nine feet away from one of these things,

126

00:08:44,000 --> 00:08:47,000

you really know what you're looking at.

127

00:08:47,000 --> 00:08:49,000

So then I turned my attention to them.

128

00:08:49,000 --> 00:08:51,000

I wanted them all.

129

00:08:51,000 --> 00:08:54,000

And they asked them, and I told them a few things,

130

00:08:54,000 --> 00:08:55,000

not too much.

131

00:08:55,000 --> 00:08:57,000

They couldn't talk too much about it, they said.

132

00:08:57,000 --> 00:08:59,000

But they did tell us and assured us

133

00:08:59,000 --> 00:09:02,000

that the spacecraft was coming.

134

00:09:02,000 --> 00:09:05,000

Well, then of course it was in 1947

135

00:09:05,000 --> 00:09:07,000

when the news broke wide open

136

00:09:07,000 --> 00:09:09,000

that the General General was a North Korean

137

00:09:09,000 --> 00:09:11,000

or state of Washington.

138

00:09:11,000 --> 00:09:15,000

Naturally again, there were a lot of questioning thrown out

139

00:09:15,000 --> 00:09:18,000

from an astronomical angle and many of us.

140

00:09:18,000 --> 00:09:21,000

And so again, I was wondering how much truth

141

00:09:21,000 --> 00:09:24,000

there was to this situation in general.

142

00:09:24,000 --> 00:09:26,000

And I kept on doing that.

143

00:09:26,000 --> 00:09:28,000

I didn't accept the thing immediately.

144

00:09:28,000 --> 00:09:30,000

I started looking into it.

145

00:09:30,000 --> 00:09:34,000

I closed my mind to it, but I never accepted it for either.

146

00:09:34,000 --> 00:09:38,000

So in 49, when the military branch came up

147

00:09:38,000 --> 00:09:40,000

and it was going up the top, it was raining there,

148

00:09:40,000 --> 00:09:44,000

very heavily, and it was going up the top

149

00:09:44,000 --> 00:09:46,000

what we called the big observatory

150

00:09:46,000 --> 00:09:51,000

to ask them to photograph what was going on in space.

151

00:09:51,000 --> 00:09:53,000

That was the first instruction I understand

152

00:09:53,000 --> 00:09:55,000

given to the big observatory to do that.

153

00:09:55,000 --> 00:09:58,000

Now they can do that, but they were going to do it at the age

154

00:09:58,000 --> 00:10:01,000

but they could do it with the 18th and the 48th of something

155

00:10:01,000 --> 00:10:03,000

as well as the 12th.

156

00:10:03,000 --> 00:10:06,000

So those instruments would lead themselves to that purpose very well.

157

00:10:06,000 --> 00:10:09,000

So they stopped to eat at the place

158

00:10:09,000 --> 00:10:12,000

and no eater had a 15th and a 6th.

159

00:10:12,000 --> 00:10:15,000

So they asked me if I would also do the same.

160

00:10:15,000 --> 00:10:18,000

There was no money involved, no pay of any card,

161

00:10:18,000 --> 00:10:19,000

it was voluntary work.

162

00:10:19,000 --> 00:10:21,000

I said I would, but I said,

163

00:10:21,000 --> 00:10:22,000

why am I the photograph?

164

00:10:22,000 --> 00:10:24,000

Well, it was traveling through space,

165

00:10:24,000 --> 00:10:26,000

it was sad, they wouldn't name it.

166

00:10:26,000 --> 00:10:28,000

I said, what is the target?

167

00:10:28,000 --> 00:10:31,000

Well, they said the target is the moon.

168

00:10:31,000 --> 00:10:34,000

So the moon even went to a moon picture

169

00:10:34,000 --> 00:10:36,000

that I had good size about four foot

170

00:10:36,000 --> 00:10:40,000

that I got from McDonald's observatory out of Texas

171

00:10:40,000 --> 00:10:43,000

and they even marked the side that I should watch

172

00:10:43,000 --> 00:10:45,000

that portion of the moon.

173

00:10:45,000 --> 00:10:48,000

Sure enough, had there a few tries,

174

00:10:48,000 --> 00:10:52,000

set up my equipment in Holland and got two pictures.

175

00:10:52,000 --> 00:10:55,000

And according to the agreement made between them and myself,

176

00:10:55,000 --> 00:10:57,000

I kept quiet.

177

00:10:57,000 --> 00:11:00,000

I sent those pictures to the lab at the rate point below

178

00:11:00,000 --> 00:11:03,000

where I was told to.

179

00:11:03,000 --> 00:11:07,000

And I got no answer one way or the other.

180

00:11:07,000 --> 00:11:10,000

Until one day, shortly after the pictures were sent,

181

00:11:10,000 --> 00:11:12,000

which was about two weeks,

182

00:11:12,000 --> 00:11:16,000

I was lecturing in an alcohol district of San Diego

183

00:11:16,000 --> 00:11:18,000

to what they call every man's club,

184

00:11:18,000 --> 00:11:21,000

every day every man's club, yes.

185

00:11:21,000 --> 00:11:23,000

And the reporter come up there,

186

00:11:23,000 --> 00:11:26,000

it was an ace reporter in a world one, number two,

187

00:11:26,000 --> 00:11:28,000

and the Pacific.

188

00:11:28,000 --> 00:11:31,000

And there was supposed to be no reporters there at the time.

189

00:11:31,000 --> 00:11:33,000

Well, he sat down and asked me some questions

190

00:11:33,000 --> 00:11:37,000

and referring to the things that were moving through space.

191

00:11:37,000 --> 00:11:42,000

Nothing was as in reference to the pictures I had taken already.

192

00:11:42,000 --> 00:11:47,000

So, naturally, I thought that was all right.

193

00:11:47,000 --> 00:11:51,000

So it was a journal that's out of existence now.

194

00:11:51,000 --> 00:11:53,000

So the journal published a very nice article

195

00:11:53,000 --> 00:11:55,000

about the lecture and so forth.

196

00:11:55,000 --> 00:12:00,000

And finally, somehow, the Union and the Tribune,

197

00:12:00,000 --> 00:12:02,000

that is in existence today,

198

00:12:02,000 --> 00:12:05,000

have gotten some information from some source

199

00:12:05,000 --> 00:12:07,000

in reference to the existing pictures.

200

00:12:07,000 --> 00:12:10,000

So they went to this laboratory and asked.

201

00:12:10,000 --> 00:12:12,000

And they denied it.

202

00:12:12,000 --> 00:12:15,000

So the denial kept on going.

203

00:12:15,000 --> 00:12:17,000

I have a full stack of clippings,

204

00:12:17,000 --> 00:12:20,000

pro and con going on, a battle between Washington

205

00:12:20,000 --> 00:12:23,000

and the Tribune and the Union.

206

00:12:23,000 --> 00:12:27,000

They come to me finally, and I was to be a sort of a scapegoat

207

00:12:27,000 --> 00:12:29,000

in this case, being in the military service.

208

00:12:29,000 --> 00:12:33,000

And I have been from 1913 to 1919.

209

00:12:33,000 --> 00:12:35,000

I knew the procedure.

210

00:12:35,000 --> 00:12:38,000

So I knew what was going on that way.

211

00:12:38,000 --> 00:12:40,000

So since they let me down,

212

00:12:40,000 --> 00:12:44,000

I figured then finally I was off my bar up, which I did.

213

00:12:44,000 --> 00:12:46,000

I claimed that it weren't existence

214

00:12:46,000 --> 00:12:48,000

and still denial kept coming.

215

00:12:48,000 --> 00:12:52,000

So finally, hopefully, Cable is known by that name,

216

00:12:52,000 --> 00:12:54,000

which is the Union and Tribune,

217

00:12:54,000 --> 00:12:57,000

shout over a message to Pentagon.

218

00:12:57,000 --> 00:12:59,000

Three months prior to this,

219

00:12:59,000 --> 00:13:03,000

Pentagon have discontinued research on blind sources.

220

00:13:03,000 --> 00:13:05,000

They made that public.

221

00:13:05,000 --> 00:13:09,000

Well, so nobody knew that they were any more interested

222

00:13:09,000 --> 00:13:11,000

in the blind sources.

223

00:13:11,000 --> 00:13:14,000

Yet, the answer came to the paper and saying

224

00:13:14,000 --> 00:13:16,000

that if there were such a pictures,

225

00:13:16,000 --> 00:13:18,000

they would have known about it.

226

00:13:18,000 --> 00:13:20,000

They know nothing about it, they were a little skeptical

227

00:13:20,000 --> 00:13:23,000

in reference to those pictures,

228

00:13:23,000 --> 00:13:27,000

which proved again also that they were double talking.

229

00:13:27,000 --> 00:13:28,000

Three months prior to that,

230

00:13:28,000 --> 00:13:30,000

it made a statement they were no longer interested.

231

00:13:30,000 --> 00:13:32,000

Here they still tell us that they were interested

232

00:13:32,000 --> 00:13:34,000

in a picture like that would have been brought to them

233

00:13:34,000 --> 00:13:36,000

had it been in existence.

234

00:13:36,000 --> 00:13:39,000

But they were not sure of themselves.

235

00:13:39,000 --> 00:13:42,000

So they must have sent a wire to the laboratory,

236

00:13:42,000 --> 00:13:45,000

and the laboratory issued the letter.

237

00:13:45,000 --> 00:13:47,000

I'll tell you that it's passed over since

238

00:13:47,000 --> 00:13:49,000

with the Los Angeles Times

239

00:13:49,000 --> 00:13:52,000

that wrote the science part for that paper

240

00:13:52,000 --> 00:13:55,000

was present with a document that never came.

241

00:13:55,000 --> 00:13:57,000

And it read, as you probably remember those of you

242

00:13:57,000 --> 00:13:59,000

that bought the blind sources have landed,

243

00:13:59,000 --> 00:14:01,000

we published it there,

244

00:14:01,000 --> 00:14:05,000

it read that they thought it probably was

245

00:14:05,000 --> 00:14:08,000

electric discharge of static electricity

246

00:14:08,000 --> 00:14:10,000

on the film doing a process of rolling

247

00:14:10,000 --> 00:14:13,000

in core or half a level.

248

00:14:13,000 --> 00:14:16,000

The fact remains that I did not use a road filler.

249

00:14:16,000 --> 00:14:18,000

I had plates.

250

00:14:18,000 --> 00:14:19,000

So that's not that out.

251

00:14:19,000 --> 00:14:21,000

Yet they did not ask me what sort of a filler

252

00:14:21,000 --> 00:14:24,000

I used at the time taking these photographs.

253

00:14:24,000 --> 00:14:26,000

Well, the next thing, of course,

254

00:14:26,000 --> 00:14:28,000

they said in the next paragraph,

255

00:14:28,000 --> 00:14:31,000

as those of you who read the Black Source Atlantic can,

256

00:14:31,000 --> 00:14:33,000

read and see for yourself,

257

00:14:33,000 --> 00:14:37,000

that they didn't think it had anything to do with visitors.

258

00:14:37,000 --> 00:14:40,000

Well, if there is no visitors, why even mention?

259

00:14:40,000 --> 00:14:42,000

Yes, they did.

260

00:14:42,000 --> 00:14:44,000

So they immediately picked up this ear,

261

00:14:44,000 --> 00:14:46,000

she said, give me that letter,

262

00:14:46,000 --> 00:14:49,000

and I'll take a visit at times and bust them right open.

263

00:14:49,000 --> 00:14:51,000

I said, Bill, I've been in the search,

264

00:14:51,000 --> 00:14:54,000

I know what the program is more or less in that way.

265

00:14:54,000 --> 00:14:56,000

I said, just let it be quite, you are not all right,

266

00:14:56,000 --> 00:14:58,000

I'd rather have it that way.

267

00:14:58,000 --> 00:15:02,000

So he said, OK, I'll have it in the hand.

268

00:15:02,000 --> 00:15:04,000

Then after they did that, of course,

269

00:15:04,000 --> 00:15:07,000

I got disgusted with them, see.

270

00:15:07,000 --> 00:15:10,000

And so I switched over to the Air Force,

271

00:15:10,000 --> 00:15:13,000

and I didn't do that immediately either.

272

00:15:13,000 --> 00:15:18,000

It was after Mr. Thompson of the REN project,

273

00:15:18,000 --> 00:15:21,000

which is their air research project in Ceremonica,

274

00:15:21,000 --> 00:15:22,000

come up with his wife,

275

00:15:22,000 --> 00:15:24,000

and he wanted to see all the film I had.

276

00:15:24,000 --> 00:15:26,000

He examined it early,

277

00:15:26,000 --> 00:15:31,000

and then ordered me to send all the photographs of East Gillom

278

00:15:31,000 --> 00:15:34,000

to the right field, Dayton, Ohio,

279

00:15:34,000 --> 00:15:37,000

where the research was going on.

280

00:15:37,000 --> 00:15:40,000

At that time, Captain Luton, as he is now known,

281

00:15:40,000 --> 00:15:44,000

was butter lieutenant, but in charge of the research.

282

00:15:44,000 --> 00:15:47,000

So I did that, everything.

283

00:15:47,000 --> 00:15:51,000

Then he told me now, these films that you've got, the Reginals,

284

00:15:51,000 --> 00:15:53,000

I would like for you to lock them up.

285

00:15:53,000 --> 00:15:55,000

You can make copies of them,

286

from which you can make friends,

but the Reginals lock them up, which they are locked up.

288

Not where I cannot get them at all, but they are locked up.

289

00:16:05,000 --> 00:16:10,000

So immediately, things start moving.

290

00:16:10,000 --> 00:16:12,000

Well, I realized then that things were happening

291

00:16:12,000 --> 00:16:14,000

that we knew just little about.

292

00:16:14,000 --> 00:16:17,000

A lot of fancy ideas came along from all sources.

293

00:16:17,000 --> 00:16:19,000

Everybody seemed to know the answer.

294

00:16:19,000 --> 00:16:21,000

As of the date, we find the same thing,

295

00:16:21,000 --> 00:16:27,000

that overnight, experts sprung up on space and spacecraft,

296

00:16:27,000 --> 00:16:30,000

that even today, most of us, as in most of the research,

297

00:16:30,000 --> 00:16:33,000

were up to date, still don't know anything about it,

298

00:16:33,000 --> 00:16:36,000

and a way to become an expert in that field.

299

00:16:36,000 --> 00:16:39,000

Yet experts sprung up all of the work, suddenly.

300

00:16:39,000 --> 00:16:42,000

All kinds of messages began to trick in from various sources,

301

00:16:42,000 --> 00:16:45,000

which was not the truth at all.

302

00:16:45,000 --> 00:16:47,000

It produced the issue terrifically.

303

00:16:47,000 --> 00:16:54,000

So we finally find that in 1951,

304

when Walter Wynchell over a nationwide hookup,

305

00:16:59,000 --> 00:17:03,000

and he's a top recorder or commentator in the states,

306

00:17:03,000 --> 00:17:08,000

made the statement point blank, saying that space-crap

307

00:17:08,000 --> 00:17:10,000

was landing up into the desert,

308

00:17:10,000 --> 00:17:13,000

which is only about 30 miles from where we live.

309

00:17:13,000 --> 00:17:16,000

That it was seen landing there by the data observatory,

310

00:17:16,000 --> 00:17:19,000

men getting out of the ships, looking around,

311

00:17:19,000 --> 00:17:24,000

walking around, boarding into the ship's can, and taking off.

312

00:17:24,000 --> 00:17:26,000

Then I thought, well, this is a good place to go

313

00:17:26,000 --> 00:17:28,000

and try to get some photographs.

314

00:17:28,000 --> 00:17:31,000

If that's what they're doing, I might get closer.

315

00:17:31,000 --> 00:17:35,000

The pictures you have seen, they're in the books.

316

00:17:35,000 --> 00:17:38,000

As good as they are, due to the fact that a telescope,

317

00:17:38,000 --> 00:17:40,000

if you understand how that works,

318

00:17:40,000 --> 00:17:44,000

telescopes act similar to your flashball.

319

00:17:44,000 --> 00:17:46,000

You get all this good picture with a flashball,

320

00:17:46,000 --> 00:17:49,000

but you might not get as good a picture if you didn't use it.

321

00:17:49,000 --> 00:17:51,000

Well, the same is true with a telescope.

322

00:17:51,000 --> 00:17:52,000

The mirror acts as a flashball.

323

00:17:52,000 --> 00:17:54,000

They're backing up the object.

324

00:17:54,000 --> 00:17:57,000

And it also, magnification, brings it down close to you.

325

00:17:57,000 --> 00:17:58,000

It's a photograph.

326

00:17:58,000 --> 00:18:01,000

So naturally, I would take my 6th age,

327

00:18:01,000 --> 00:18:04,000

as I could make it portable, and go out to the desert.

328

00:18:04,000 --> 00:18:07,000

Many times, I went out there and nothing happened.

329

00:18:07,000 --> 00:18:10,000

But I've always considered it was a day spent,

330

00:18:10,000 --> 00:18:12,000

sort of a vacation, away from home,

331

00:18:12,000 --> 00:18:16,000

and I didn't really get discouraged.

332

00:18:16,000 --> 00:18:21,000

So one day, in the fall of the year,

333

00:18:21,000 --> 00:18:25,000

when Williamson and Bailey's come out from Arizona,

334

00:18:25,000 --> 00:18:28,000

they heard of me, since that fall up of this,

335

00:18:28,000 --> 00:18:30,000

they went out and referenced to the pictures

336

00:18:30,000 --> 00:18:34,000

that was denied and finally admitted.

337

00:18:34,000 --> 00:18:36,000

So they come up and were a story.

338

00:18:36,000 --> 00:18:39,000

They thought they had a great story to tell.

339

00:18:39,000 --> 00:18:41,000

Well, I listened to them for a little bit,

340

00:18:41,000 --> 00:18:44,000

and that was in reference to the ticker

341

00:18:44,000 --> 00:18:49,000

in the Santa Fe station, at Needles.

342

00:18:49,000 --> 00:18:53,000

And this ticker, like all the rail stations have,

343

00:18:53,000 --> 00:18:56,000

to direct the trains and so forth,

344

00:18:56,000 --> 00:18:59,000

was supposed to make a contact over the ticker system

345

00:18:59,000 --> 00:19:02,000

with the space people.

346

00:19:02,000 --> 00:19:04,000

And they come and tell me about it.

347

00:19:04,000 --> 00:19:06,000

Well, I've already had quite a bit of information

348

00:19:06,000 --> 00:19:09,000

in that relationship from other sources.

349

00:19:09,000 --> 00:19:12,000

So I told them what I knew a little bit, not too much.

350

00:19:12,000 --> 00:19:14,000

And they figured I knew more than they did,

351

00:19:14,000 --> 00:19:16,000

so they didn't tell me much more after that.

352

00:19:16,000 --> 00:19:18,000

But instead, they asked me,

353

00:19:18,000 --> 00:19:23,000

would you let us go out with you sometime when you go out with us?

354

00:19:23,000 --> 00:19:24,000

I said, that'd be all right.

355

00:19:24,000 --> 00:19:26,000

They seemed to be nice people.

356

00:19:26,000 --> 00:19:30,000

So when you do, telephone us and reverse the charges,

357

00:19:30,000 --> 00:19:32,000

which I did.

358

00:19:32,000 --> 00:19:34,000

So we met them at light.

359

00:19:34,000 --> 00:19:38,000

And then after we had the breakfast,

360

00:19:38,000 --> 00:19:40,000

we figured, where are we going?

361

00:19:40,000 --> 00:19:44,000

I followed my hunches, where are we going?

362

00:19:44,000 --> 00:19:47,000

So I finally figured to go back to a road

363

00:19:47,000 --> 00:19:50,000

that was branching off the main highway.

364

00:19:50,000 --> 00:19:52,000

No one could park the highway,

365

00:19:52,000 --> 00:19:56,000

which goes to the park of Dan, also for Indian reservation.

366

00:19:56,000 --> 00:19:59,000

It's a very beautiful highway and a wide one.

367

00:19:59,000 --> 00:20:03,000

So we went back, which was 40 miles from the light,

368

00:20:03,000 --> 00:20:07,000

backtracking, and turned there and went up about 10 miles

369

00:20:07,000 --> 00:20:10,000

or one tenth of something of that nature,

370

00:20:10,000 --> 00:20:12,000

not quite 10 and a half miles.

371

00:20:12,000 --> 00:20:15,000

And it'd come up the hill and go down again.

372

00:20:15,000 --> 00:20:17,000

So we stopped right on the peak of it.

373

00:20:17,000 --> 00:20:19,000

So we could see both valleys,

374

00:20:19,000 --> 00:20:22,000

this one and the other one on the opposite side.

375

00:20:22,000 --> 00:20:25,000

Quite a large mountains here and here.

376

00:20:25,000 --> 00:20:28,000

On the right-hand side, going up that road,

377

00:20:28,000 --> 00:20:30,000

is a nola band of airport.

378

00:20:30,000 --> 00:20:31,000

Used to do a war.

379

00:20:31,000 --> 00:20:34,000

On the left-hand side, going up, is an old target range.

380

00:20:34,000 --> 00:20:37,000

Putting well-paradown by the heavy machine

381

00:20:37,000 --> 00:20:39,000

we go through there and things like that.

382

00:20:39,000 --> 00:20:41,000

And there's quite a wash up there.

383

00:20:41,000 --> 00:20:43,000

It goes up into the mountain area,

384

00:20:43,000 --> 00:20:46,000

and it goes on the left of it.

385

00:20:46,000 --> 00:20:49,000

So we stood upon this top

386

00:20:49,000 --> 00:20:53,000

and the B-29 came through on this routine flight.

387

00:20:53,000 --> 00:20:56,000

Next thing we saw was this big mothership aircraft

388

00:20:56,000 --> 00:20:58,000

that is now the name mothership.

389

00:20:58,000 --> 00:21:01,000

And we thought our eyes were deceiving us.

390

00:21:01,000 --> 00:21:03,000

And so we looked to Banakas

391

00:21:03,000 --> 00:21:07,000

and we saw this ship having no wings or appendages of any kind,

392

00:21:07,000 --> 00:21:12,000

but it had a rib, sort of a symbol on the back of it,

393

00:21:12,000 --> 00:21:15,000

on a top, an orange looking.

394

00:21:15,000 --> 00:21:17,000

So immediately thought,

395

00:21:17,000 --> 00:21:20,000

well, this must be one of those ships.

396

00:21:20,000 --> 00:21:22,000

So I said to the group, I says,

397

00:21:22,000 --> 00:21:24,000

now some of you stay and watch this,

398

00:21:24,000 --> 00:21:27,000

while some of us will go down, there was a saveness,

399

00:21:27,000 --> 00:21:29,000

all together including me,

400

00:21:29,000 --> 00:21:31,000

we'll go down and help you set up the telescope.

401

00:21:31,000 --> 00:21:33,000

It was right here I watched.

402

00:21:33,000 --> 00:21:37,000

Where I might photograph this ship, and that was the idea.

403

00:21:37,000 --> 00:21:40,000

At the time, putting these instruments together

404

00:21:40,000 --> 00:21:43,000

and placing a camera on it, and I had eight plates,

405

00:21:43,000 --> 00:21:48,000

fully filled with the film, ready to go.

406

00:21:48,000 --> 00:21:52,000

We were so busy watching, and putting up the instrument,

407

00:21:52,000 --> 00:21:55,000

that we didn't watch what was happening in the sky.

408

00:21:55,000 --> 00:21:58,000

During that time, the mothership released

409

00:21:58,000 --> 00:22:01,000

one of these so-called flying saucers.

410

00:22:01,000 --> 00:22:04,000

And it came in just like we'd come into this room.

411

00:22:04,000 --> 00:22:07,000

Here we are, and the mountains going certainly all around,

412

00:22:07,000 --> 00:22:09,000

just like that.

413

00:22:09,000 --> 00:22:12,000

I shot all eight shots at it.

414

00:22:12,000 --> 00:22:14,000

It didn't take too much time to focus,

415

00:22:14,000 --> 00:22:16,000

it didn't have the time.

416

00:22:16,000 --> 00:22:18,000

You were excited, you didn't know how long

417

00:22:18,000 --> 00:22:20,000

it was going to be there for you to photograph.

418

00:22:20,000 --> 00:22:22,000

You didn't know anything.

419

00:22:22,000 --> 00:22:24,000

So you'd done the best you could.

420

00:22:24,000 --> 00:22:27,000

I figured that most of those shots probably were no good at all.

421

00:22:27,000 --> 00:22:29,000

Because the way I had to work them.

422

00:22:29,000 --> 00:22:32,000

The group again stood a little ways from me.

423

00:22:32,000 --> 00:22:34,000

Not too far, it says mile, that's not true.

424

00:22:34,000 --> 00:22:38,000

Less than a mile, some even close to the net.

425

00:22:38,000 --> 00:22:41,000

This well sketched the man perfectly.

426

00:22:41,000 --> 00:22:44,000

All right, and she couldn't see that much.

427

00:22:44,000 --> 00:22:46,000

Unless she was close enough to sketch him,

428

00:22:46,000 --> 00:22:48,000

as an artist must be.

429

00:22:48,000 --> 00:22:50,000

But I had them there standing,

430

00:22:50,000 --> 00:22:52,000

because highway is heavy to travel.

431

00:22:52,000 --> 00:22:55,000

The traffic sometimes, not always, but most of the time.

432

00:22:55,000 --> 00:22:58,000

And they were cars moving very heavy on it that day.

433

00:22:58,000 --> 00:23:02,000

And I figured, well, I'll start gapping into sky,

434

00:23:02,000 --> 00:23:04,000

and set up a telescope right nearby.

435

00:23:04,000 --> 00:23:06,000

All these cars will be stopping,

436

00:23:06,000 --> 00:23:09,000

and the next thing we won't have a chance to even photograph it,

437

00:23:09,000 --> 00:23:12,000

it might just vanish on the side just that quick.

438

00:23:12,000 --> 00:23:15,000

So I took the questions to handle it that way.

439

00:23:15,000 --> 00:23:18,000

But after I shot the eight of them,

440

00:23:18,000 --> 00:23:22,000

she went over the hill, and that's the last I saw.

441

00:23:22,000 --> 00:23:24,000

I thought that was the end.

442

00:23:24,000 --> 00:23:27,000

When I looked up into the sky,

443

00:23:27,000 --> 00:23:29,000

the big mother ship was so small out there,

444

00:23:29,000 --> 00:23:31,000

must have been awfully high up there,

445

00:23:31,000 --> 00:23:34,000

she went out in other spaces far from the earth she could,

446

00:23:34,000 --> 00:23:36,000

and she was a little bit,

447

00:23:36,000 --> 00:23:39,000

I didn't see the stars really go up to it or nothing.

448

00:23:39,000 --> 00:23:42,000

I just saw it over the hill in the severe.

449

00:23:42,000 --> 00:23:45,000

So I got to myself, well, I wonder where I got to.

450

00:23:45,000 --> 00:23:47,000

So I called a group to help me dismantle the instrument,

451

00:23:47,000 --> 00:23:50,000

for a man, if I didn't wave to me.

452

00:23:50,000 --> 00:23:52,000

As he waved to me, I thought,

453

00:23:52,000 --> 00:23:54,000

well, this is nothing new either.

454

00:23:54,000 --> 00:23:57,000

In the California desert, people go out there,

455

00:23:57,000 --> 00:24:00,000

prospecting either gold or precious stones.

456

00:24:00,000 --> 00:24:03,000

So I thought maybe one of these prospectists

457

00:24:03,000 --> 00:24:05,000

would be in some help.

458

00:24:05,000 --> 00:24:07,000

I was cautious going up to him,

459

00:24:07,000 --> 00:24:09,000

because there could be anything.

460

00:24:09,000 --> 00:24:12,000

I also knew that all of them here were watching me.

461

00:24:12,000 --> 00:24:16,000

I've already waved to them to come and help me dismantle the instrument.

462

00:24:16,000 --> 00:24:18,000

So I knew that if anything did happen to me,

463

00:24:18,000 --> 00:24:21,000

they would see it, and in that way I could get help.

464

00:24:21,000 --> 00:24:26,000

And the same was true at the time I was taking pictures the same way.

465

00:24:26,000 --> 00:24:29,000

Well, the closer I got to it,

466

00:24:29,000 --> 00:24:32,000

the caution begins to relax.

467

00:24:32,000 --> 00:24:36,000

Not because I intended to, but it just merely happened.

468

00:24:36,000 --> 00:24:38,000

I realized this man had a wrong hair,

469

00:24:38,000 --> 00:24:40,000

but that was nothing new either.

470

00:24:40,000 --> 00:24:42,000

Because in California desert,

471

00:24:42,000 --> 00:24:45,000

when you get out there and stay a year or a half a year or a year,

472

00:24:45,000 --> 00:24:47,000

you naturally have no promise or I'll tell you,

473

00:24:47,000 --> 00:24:50,000

you must let them grow, and they're going to really get long.

474

00:24:50,000 --> 00:24:53,000

So that was nothing but strange.

475

00:24:53,000 --> 00:24:56,000

So I took it. It could be one of our people.

476

00:24:56,000 --> 00:24:58,000

Well, when I got close to them then,

477

00:24:58,000 --> 00:25:01,000

I realized that something just dropped away from you.

478

00:25:01,000 --> 00:25:02,000

Caution and all.

479

00:25:02,000 --> 00:25:04,000

In very mild sort of a feeling come over you.

480

00:25:04,000 --> 00:25:09,000

It was like, to me, you feel like you have known a man for all your lifetime.

481

00:25:09,000 --> 00:25:11,000

You even live off.

482

00:25:11,000 --> 00:25:13,000

He had that condition around him.

483

00:25:13,000 --> 00:25:15,000

He had this what appeared to be one piece suit.

484

00:25:15,000 --> 00:25:17,000

Yet it was later I have learned,

485

00:25:17,000 --> 00:25:19,000

because of the two pieces and the way the belt came in,

486

00:25:19,000 --> 00:25:21,000

that's where the two pieces joined.

487

00:25:21,000 --> 00:25:23,000

But you couldn't see it that way.

488

00:25:23,000 --> 00:25:27,000

So he had this belt with his between six and eight inches width.

489

00:25:27,000 --> 00:25:31,000

And so he put out his hand to shake hands first.

490

00:25:31,000 --> 00:25:33,000

Well, I naturally grabbed a grip.

491

00:25:33,000 --> 00:25:35,000

He refused that.

492

00:25:35,000 --> 00:25:37,000

Then he put it out again, the way he put it out,

493

00:25:37,000 --> 00:25:39,000

that's the way I followed the instructions, man.

494

00:25:39,000 --> 00:25:41,000

I got an impression to do that.

495

00:25:41,000 --> 00:25:43,000

Then he touched it and gave a certain signal.

496

00:25:43,000 --> 00:25:47,000

But to this day, it had not been revealed for purpose of identity,

497

00:25:47,000 --> 00:25:49,000

to identify the real thing,

498

00:25:49,000 --> 00:25:52,000

because once it's given, it's no longer of any value.

499

00:25:52,000 --> 00:25:55,000

Anybody could take one up then.

500

00:25:55,000 --> 00:25:57,000

But he gave me that.

501

00:25:57,000 --> 00:26:01,000

And immediately I realized this was something different.

502

00:26:01,000 --> 00:26:03,000

But I looked around and saw a ship.

503

00:26:03,000 --> 00:26:05,000

And I also knew that while the ship was in flight,

504

00:26:05,000 --> 00:26:07,000

and I was photographing it,

505

00:26:07,000 --> 00:26:10,000

that there was no one stepped out of it.

506

00:26:10,000 --> 00:26:13,000

So I was wondering where he came from.

507

00:26:13,000 --> 00:26:15,000

Then all of a sudden,

508

00:26:15,000 --> 00:26:17,000

while I was talking, of course, he stepped away

509

00:26:17,000 --> 00:26:19,000

from the pockets of sand.

510

00:26:19,000 --> 00:26:22,000

So there's a wind blowing in there,

511

00:26:22,000 --> 00:26:24,000

those sand and his pockets.

512

00:26:24,000 --> 00:26:26,000

And it's not the kind of sand that you think like

513

00:26:26,000 --> 00:26:28,000

on a piece of something like it.

514

00:26:28,000 --> 00:26:30,000

It's the sand that takes an imprint pretty good.

515

00:26:30,000 --> 00:26:33,000

And it was not heavier to make that imprint,

516

00:26:33,000 --> 00:26:36,000

because I left mine there too, as I walked with it.

517

00:26:36,000 --> 00:26:40,000

And I wasn't putting on any extra weight on myself to do that.

518

00:26:40,000 --> 00:26:42,000

But he left those imprints.

519

00:26:42,000 --> 00:26:43,000

They were funny.

520

00:26:43,000 --> 00:26:45,000

And he pointed to them, meaning they meant something.

521

00:26:45,000 --> 00:26:50,000

I have been studying and teaching also telepathic communication,

522

00:26:50,000 --> 00:26:52,000

which is a taught transference.

523

00:26:52,000 --> 00:26:54,000

So I tried it.

524

00:26:54,000 --> 00:26:56,000

I tried it with my ideas to him,

525

00:26:56,000 --> 00:26:58,000

because I spoke first to him,

526

00:26:58,000 --> 00:27:00,000

and he did not answer in the language of any kind.

527

00:27:00,000 --> 00:27:03,000

So then I figured this was what I must do.

528

00:27:03,000 --> 00:27:07,000

And that was gestures and taught pictures to him.

529

00:27:07,000 --> 00:27:09,000

At times I thought he was not getting it,

530

00:27:09,000 --> 00:27:11,000

most of the time because he did.

531

00:27:11,000 --> 00:27:14,000

But I was not sure I was getting his correctly.

532

00:27:14,000 --> 00:27:17,000

But I really tried to do those footprints and all.

533

00:27:17,000 --> 00:27:19,000

Made me feel that there was something in them.

534

00:27:19,000 --> 00:27:21,000

There was a reason for him leaving me.

535

00:27:21,000 --> 00:27:22,000

Three of them.

536

00:27:22,000 --> 00:27:23,000

Like that.

537

00:27:23,000 --> 00:27:25,000

After he did that,

538

00:27:25,000 --> 00:27:28,000

wind was going pretty good out in the desert,

539

00:27:28,000 --> 00:27:31,000

and it must have been that ship that was hiding,

540

00:27:31,000 --> 00:27:34,000

because a flash of light shot out into space.

541

00:27:34,000 --> 00:27:35,000

And I spotted it.

542

00:27:35,000 --> 00:27:37,000

So immediately I started looking away at the sheet from it.

543

00:27:37,000 --> 00:27:40,000

And then when I found where the ship was hovering in a cold,

544

00:27:40,000 --> 00:27:42,000

horseshoe-type cold,

545

00:27:42,000 --> 00:27:44,000

the hillside was like this,

546

00:27:44,000 --> 00:27:47,000

and the ship was anchored against it,

547

00:27:47,000 --> 00:27:49,000

while now he was suspended at the other end

548

00:27:49,000 --> 00:27:51,000

in an eight-foot-odd about,

549

00:27:51,000 --> 00:27:54,000

we say, 12 to 13 feet from the ground

550

00:27:54,000 --> 00:27:56,000

against the hillside.

551

00:27:56,000 --> 00:27:57,000

So I then asked him,

552

00:27:57,000 --> 00:27:58,000

is that your ship?

553

00:27:58,000 --> 00:28:00,000

And he nodded his head and was.

554

00:28:00,000 --> 00:28:03,000

So we walked over from here about 75 to 100 feet.

555

00:28:03,000 --> 00:28:06,000

Walked over from his spot where we first met,

556

00:28:06,000 --> 00:28:08,000

over to the ship.

557

00:28:08,000 --> 00:28:10,000

He then warned me not to get the post to it.

558

00:28:10,000 --> 00:28:12,000

Well, when you get to talking,

559

00:28:12,000 --> 00:28:14,000

and all excited, and you don't know,

560

00:28:14,000 --> 00:28:17,000

what words to bring forth,

561

00:28:17,000 --> 00:28:18,000

or what thought,

562

00:28:18,000 --> 00:28:20,000

because millions of them are passing through your mind

563

00:28:20,000 --> 00:28:21,000

anytime like that,

564

00:28:21,000 --> 00:28:23,000

you forget yourself.

565

00:28:23,000 --> 00:28:25,000

And I kept moving around,

566

00:28:25,000 --> 00:28:26,000

just like you'd read,

567

00:28:26,000 --> 00:28:28,000

over, and before I knew I was partially

568

00:28:28,000 --> 00:28:30,000

under the flange of the ship.

569

00:28:30,000 --> 00:28:32,000

And that's when my arm got caught,

570

00:28:32,000 --> 00:28:35,000

pulled up, and slammed back and paralyzed.

571

00:28:35,000 --> 00:28:37,000

Well, he grabbed for me then.

572

00:28:37,000 --> 00:28:41,000

Actually grabbed for me because had he not done so,

573

00:28:41,000 --> 00:28:43,000

I would have fallen fully under that ship.

574

00:28:43,000 --> 00:28:46,000

And my whole body would have got that condition

575

00:28:46,000 --> 00:28:48,000

instead of the arm alone.

576

00:28:48,000 --> 00:28:49,000

He grabbed for me, and the brush,

577

00:28:49,000 --> 00:28:50,000

it was a lot of brush,

578

00:28:50,000 --> 00:28:52,000

wild brush going in the desert.

579

00:28:52,000 --> 00:28:54,000

As he grabbed for me,

580

00:28:54,000 --> 00:28:57,000

he scratched his hand and bled very fiercely,

581

00:28:57,000 --> 00:28:58,000

right here on the surface.

582

00:28:58,000 --> 00:28:59,000

Blood like yours and mine,

583

00:28:59,000 --> 00:29:01,000

not one bit different.

584

00:29:01,000 --> 00:29:03,000

He rubbed it three times finally,

Or you can give me a picture and I'll have them enlarged to 10 by 12.

At the bare base, which he did and sent me 12.

717

So I give it to him, and he told me to do it in half.

738

So there he was standing, smiling,

739

and he spoke to me for the first time in English.

740

And I got hurt a little bit because I said,

741

here I wasted all this time on the first contact trying to convey my ideas to you,

you to me, why in the world did you speak English then?

743

He didn't speak it now.

744

Testing him a little bit to see what he could speak in the other language,

745

00:37:02,000 --> 00:37:05,000

I cannot speak very well Polish anymore,

746

00:37:05,000 --> 00:37:07,000

but I can say few words, so I did.

747

00:37:07,000 --> 00:37:10,000

And he came back to Polish a lot better than I could.

748

00:37:10,000 --> 00:37:12,000

So there was no trouble at all.

749

00:37:12,000 --> 00:37:15,000

So then he told me why he did what he did.

750

00:37:15,000 --> 00:37:22,000

He said, now look, there is no telephone system between us and your planet.

751

00:37:22,000 --> 00:37:24,000

So the only way if I wanted to meet you again,

752

00:37:24,000 --> 00:37:26,000

would be by an impression.

753

00:37:26,000 --> 00:37:28,000

I put impression well enough,

754

00:37:28,000 --> 00:37:30,000

then you followed that impression,

755

00:37:30,000 --> 00:37:32,000

which you did in this case.

756

00:37:32,000 --> 00:37:36,000

And you have proven yourself well enough to be worth worth.

757

00:37:36,000 --> 00:37:39,000

You do receive impressions fairly good.

758

00:37:39,000 --> 00:37:41,000

So that was the reason.

759

00:37:41,000 --> 00:37:44,000

We test you to find out if we've got to really depend on you

760

00:37:44,000 --> 00:37:46,000

in case you want to see you again.

761

00:37:46,000 --> 00:37:48,000

At that time, he was naturally,

762

00:37:48,000 --> 00:37:50,000

he was doing something, some repair job.

763

00:37:50,000 --> 00:37:54,000

He must have melted up some mineral that they had to fix this job.

764

00:37:54,000 --> 00:37:57,000

So he dumped the rest of it on the sand.

765

00:37:57,000 --> 00:38:00,000

I fixed it up and takes the hand chip and fix it up

766

00:38:00,000 --> 00:38:02,000

and puts it in a handkerchief.

767

00:38:02,000 --> 00:38:05,000

Well, he left out me and said, what are you going to do with it?

768

00:38:05,000 --> 00:38:09,000

Well, I'm going to take it home because I think this is some from your own planet.

769

00:38:09,000 --> 00:38:10,000

That's correct.

770

00:38:10,000 --> 00:38:13,000

But all planets are made up of the same chemical units.

771

00:38:13,000 --> 00:38:16,000

So there's going to be much, not any difference.

772

00:38:16,000 --> 00:38:19,000

Then I said, don't, but they might be better in different types of alpha.

773

00:38:19,000 --> 00:38:23,000

And he smiled at and said, so sure enough, I thought,

774

00:38:23,000 --> 00:38:25,000

I try to get it analyzed.

775

00:38:25,000 --> 00:38:27,000

They have made the analysis.

776

00:38:27,000 --> 00:38:30,000

I would never give me the analysis of what they found out.

777

00:38:30,000 --> 00:38:32,000

That part, they kept from me all the time.

778

00:38:32,000 --> 00:38:35,000

So one more time, until this, unless we came down, and I give him a bit of,

779

00:38:35,000 --> 00:38:39,000

he went to work on an analysis in Britain here and gave me the analysis,

780

00:38:39,000 --> 00:38:43,000

saying that there are two elements in there found that were not going on Earth.

781

00:38:43,000 --> 00:38:48,000

And on those grounds, it became a restricted piece of material.

782

00:38:48,000 --> 00:38:53,000

And I couldn't publish that in my book, which was the *Insighted Spaces*.

783

00:38:53,000 --> 00:38:59,000

Then in an orgy-conformant, I finally luckily run across two women in Arizona

784

00:38:59,000 --> 00:39:04,000

that worked for the government in a big laboratory, that's their job, good physicists and all.

785

00:39:04,000 --> 00:39:06,000

And I asked them if they were doing it.

786

00:39:06,000 --> 00:39:07,000

They did.

787

The same answer.

788

789

So the analysis here, and the analysis in the mirror are identical,

790

00:39:17,000 --> 00:39:20,000

showing that the ship is constructed of lumen mostly,

791

00:39:20,000 --> 00:39:25,000

and at the same time possessing two elements which are not known on Earth.

792

00:39:25,000 --> 00:39:30,000

That does not mean that we have stopped them, but we have not come across them.

793

00:39:30,000 --> 00:39:35,000

So that is the reason why they did not publish anything in a book in reference to that,

794

00:39:35,000 --> 00:39:40,000

because the England restrict is a democratic restrict, so they work hand in hand that way.

795

00:39:40,000 --> 00:39:42,000

I put it in the book, you probably wouldn't have read the book,

796

00:39:42,000 --> 00:39:46,000

because they had to pull it off the market, because they didn't want it to be known,

797

00:39:46,000 --> 00:39:48,000

so we have to keep it that way.

798

00:39:48,000 --> 00:39:51,000

And with that, then I took the trip in the ship.

799

00:39:51,000 --> 00:39:56,000

Well, as I did, to tell you something about the trip.

800

00:39:56,000 --> 00:40:01,000

The feeling that you get first when you leave the ground is no different than the feeling that you get

801

00:40:01,000 --> 00:40:04,000

when you board our own aircraft.

802

00:40:04,000 --> 00:40:10,000

When it's starting on a runway at 125 miles per hour to get an airborne, you feel that cool.

803

00:40:10,000 --> 00:40:14,000

Once it's airborne, don't forget our own ships.

804

00:40:14,000 --> 00:40:20,000

Once they are airborne, the pilot keeps accelerating to probably 300, 350 miles per hour,

805

00:40:20,000 --> 00:40:22,000

and you no longer feel that acceleration.

806

00:40:22,000 --> 00:40:25,000

It's going right along the increasing speed, you don't know anything about.

807

00:40:25,000 --> 00:40:27,000

The same is true in spacecraft.

808

00:40:27,000 --> 00:40:29,000

It does the same thing.

809

00:40:29,000 --> 00:40:33,000

You no longer feel the acceleration once that start the speed.

810

00:40:33,000 --> 00:40:36,000

You're already accustomed to it, and the ships are fully pressurized,

811

00:40:36,000 --> 00:40:38,000

same as our own aircraft are.

812

00:40:38,000 --> 00:40:42,000

Fully pressurized to meet the conditions of the humans they're occupied of,

813

00:40:42,000 --> 00:40:44,000

or work in them, and so forth.

814

00:40:44,000 --> 00:40:50,000

So it's no better than traveling in our own ships, except that they are plastered

815

00:40:50,000 --> 00:41:00,000

on far greater types of instruments than them, and things like that, more comfort and safer in many ways.

816

00:41:00,000 --> 00:41:01,000

Lot safer.

817

00:41:01,000 --> 00:41:05,000

For instance, to give you some idea about the ship now before I go into the other details,

818

00:41:05,000 --> 00:41:07,000

is something like this.

819

00:41:07,000 --> 00:41:11,000

That the nearest analysis that can be made to give you an idea of what a spacecraft,

820

00:41:11,000 --> 00:41:15,000

a mothership, or a saucer is like when you're writing in them.

821

00:41:15,000 --> 00:41:18,000

It's no different than the submarine.

822

00:41:18,000 --> 00:41:22,000

The submarine comes the nearest of explaining the mothership.

823

00:41:22,000 --> 00:41:26,000

As one of our great men of the Navy has stated in America,

824

00:41:26,000 --> 00:41:32,000

that the submarine and the spacecraft are identical instruments in every respect.

825

00:41:32,000 --> 00:41:35,000

And that was an Admiral of the Navy lecturing in New York.

826

00:41:35,000 --> 00:41:37,000

I got the lecture here.

827

00:41:37,000 --> 00:41:38,000

They're identical.

828

00:41:38,000 --> 00:41:41,000

One is made for liquid, which is water.

829

00:41:41,000 --> 00:41:45,000

The other, what is made for gas, which is space.

830

00:41:45,000 --> 00:41:48,000

And both operate identically the same, except of course,

831

00:41:48,000 --> 00:41:52,000

spacecraft has got more instrument property for space purposes.

832

00:41:52,000 --> 00:41:55,000

It has more to encounter than the submarine has.

833

00:41:55,000 --> 00:41:58,000

But, give you the idea of the submarine.

834

00:41:58,000 --> 00:42:02,000

It doesn't make no difference to the men that are inside of that submarine.

835

00:42:02,000 --> 00:42:05,000

Whether they surface it, surface the water,

836

00:42:05,000 --> 00:42:09,000

or go down to a depth of 300 feet, and the bottom of the ocean.

837

00:42:09,000 --> 00:42:11,000

They don't know the difference.

838

00:42:11,000 --> 00:42:15,000

Their bodies are normal all the way down.

839

00:42:15,000 --> 00:42:17,000

When the thing is going down, the wind is coming up.

840

00:42:17,000 --> 00:42:19,000

It does not affect them at all.

841

00:42:19,000 --> 00:42:22,000

They do not float around in a submarine,

842

00:42:22,000 --> 00:42:25,000

because they come through a lighter atmosphere, or a lighter pressure,

843

00:42:25,000 --> 00:42:30,000

when they surface, or are they crushed when they go down to 300 foot level

844

00:42:30,000 --> 00:42:33,000

of the depth of the ocean.

845

00:42:33,000 --> 00:42:37,000

The submarine is pressurized to suit them,

846

00:42:37,000 --> 00:42:41,000

give them all the comforts possible that they've been enjoying on Earth

847

00:42:41,000 --> 00:42:43,000

outside of the submarine.

848

00:42:43,000 --> 00:42:45,000

The submarine is built to take care of all of that.

849

00:42:45,000 --> 00:42:47,000

The same thing is with a spacecraft.

850

00:42:47,000 --> 00:42:49,000

It's built the same way.

851

00:42:49,000 --> 00:42:52,000

When it's coming towards the Earth, it's no different than a ship,

852

00:42:52,000 --> 00:42:55,000

submarine going down towards the bottom of the ocean.

853

00:42:55,000 --> 00:42:57,000

The closer it gets to the bottom of the ocean, the greater pressure,

854

00:42:57,000 --> 00:43:00,000

the closer the spacecraft gets to it.

855

00:43:00,000 --> 00:43:04,000

Going up again is the same way.

856

00:43:04,000 --> 00:43:08,000

Coming up from that heavy pressure, upward to surface on the water,

857

00:43:08,000 --> 00:43:11,000

the voyages inside the submarine don't know any difference.

858

00:43:11,000 --> 00:43:13,000

They still are the same as they were at the bottom,

859

00:43:13,000 --> 00:43:15,000

and they won't be at the surface.

860

00:43:15,000 --> 00:43:17,000

They don't float around because they lack of gravity,

861

00:43:17,000 --> 00:43:19,000

and things like that, like we've been talking about,

862

00:43:19,000 --> 00:43:21,000

in a submarine, neither does a spacecraft.

863

00:43:21,000 --> 00:43:25,000

People in the spacecraft do, once they leave our atmosphere.

864

00:43:25,000 --> 00:43:27,000

They don't float around either.

865

and that in reference to mother ships are two saucers.

Now, the people in themselves are no different than you and I.

870

They are better looking. They look better in general.

871

Men and women alike, why?

872

They haven't got the tension of life that we have.

873

They don't go through the same tension.

874

00:43:57,000 --> 00:44:01,000

They live longer, they live up to a thousand years of age,

875

00:44:01,000 --> 00:44:04,000

yet our own fiber tells us that one night people on the ship

876

00:44:04,000 --> 00:44:06,000

had lived that sort of an age.

877

00:44:06,000 --> 00:44:09,000

Now, of course, a thousand years of their life on their planet

878

00:44:09,000 --> 00:44:11,000

would be much shorter if it's somewhere around seven

879

00:44:11,000 --> 00:44:14,000

or 800 years or 30 type of years,

880

00:44:14,000 --> 00:44:17,000

because areas are short on Venus.

881

00:44:17,000 --> 00:44:20,000

I think around 260 some odd days to an year,

882

00:44:20,000 --> 00:44:24,000

well, ours is 335, 35, or 65.

883

So there is a difference there.

884

But they do live long life, and they don't float.

885

A person around 29 or 30 years of age now lives here.

886

Because what causes bodies to go the way we do

887

is the heavy tension on the circumstances of life

888

that we possess, which they have not.

889

Their system or society has been so well organized

890

00:44:45,000 --> 00:44:47,000

that no one worries about the matter.

891

00:44:47,000 --> 00:44:50,000

As we do about rent and so many other things,

892

00:44:50,000 --> 00:44:54,000

they have a so-called social system of a planetary unit

893

00:44:54,000 --> 00:44:59,000

of all humans based on one law, and that is

894

00:44:59,000 --> 00:45:02,000

that the planet belongs to the Creator and not to man.

895

That man is only to be given the right to live upon it

896

as a child of a creator.

897

And therefore, all children of the same family

898

to useful purposes like the protection of machines,

903

like the spacemen, and many other things,

904

for learning more and services unto man of that planet.

905

In that way, the minerals actually serve man.

906

All their daily production is all mechanical,

907

utilizing the same power for the machinery work

908

that operates their spacecraft from there to here and back.

The same power that motivates our world into action

910

and keeps it going, which we know that our earth is moving

911

at 18 and a half miles per second or better,

912

yet there is no jet engine on the back of it,

913

no wings on it, nobody pulling it, nobody pushing it.

914

It just moves while we're living on it

915

00:46:12,000 --> 00:46:14,000

and don't even know that it's moving.

916

And the spacecraft is built the same way also.

917

The spacecraft is a copy.

918

00:46:19,000 --> 00:46:21,000

You might say it's a man-made planet

919

00:46:21,000 --> 00:46:25,000

copied after all the planets, like ours and that of others.

920

They're not the same principles,

921

00:46:27,000 --> 00:46:30,000

complying with natural laws, and therefore naturalize laws

922

00:46:30,000 --> 00:46:34,000

that lend themselves to the spacecraft to be able to travel anywhere.

923

00:46:34,000 --> 00:46:37,000

The only difference between a planet and a spacecraft is

924

00:46:37,000 --> 00:46:40,000

that its spacecraft travels wherever you want it to travel.

925

00:46:40,000 --> 00:46:43,000

A planet must go on its own, like on a rail,

926

00:46:43,000 --> 00:46:46,000

and hears to that all the time for its control.

927

00:46:46,000 --> 00:46:51,000

So they have used the same power for everything that they need.

928

They're little, they use those ships that also operate,

929

which you in England now are beginning to realize

930

that we're going to have here what we call

931

an automobile wheel of wheels, a cushion,

932

00:47:03,000 --> 00:47:06,000

an air-pushing system, they call it,

933

00:47:06,000 --> 00:47:35,860

and so forth in the very near future, which may be the

934

00:47:36,000 --> 00:47:39,000

reason why they're going to have to travel anywhere.

935

The ladies on those planets, due to not having to work this hard as they do,

936

they partake equally with men in scientific and every type of research

937

00:47:47,000 --> 00:47:50,000

or development in the field of knowledge.

And you say we have to wash clothes, regardless of how good a machine we had,

939

we still have to enter those machines in the washcloth,

They may wash them themselves once you put the clothes in there,

put all my soap in there, and turn the switch on.

They do turn the switch on, that's true, but that's all.

Because it's high frequency operation and they put the clothes into a closed closet,

945

so to speak, and push a button, and the clothes are clean and energetic.

Because at a high frequency even makes them newer than they were.

947

Because they claim that it's the finest mineral, the purest and the cleanest mineral that do.

956

They do gather, it's quite supposed to gather itself in its place.

957

They gather it like you would ashes from the ground stove, and process it.

958

And as a result they don't have to do very much mining.

959

They defend a mineral sandwich and they work through mining processes.

960

They do all the that, and then they have their recreations, same as you and I have,

they dance, they sing, they have a grand old time.

A lot better than we have, because they're more relaxed,

963

and really live for joy of life, living rather than for the misery of living as we do.

964

And it's the difference.

965

We are living for the misery of it, and the misery is already taken away from us,

966

00:49:29,000 --> 00:49:33,000

we start hollering, you don't want to change, this is just like the misery.

967

But that's the way we're living, where there they do.

968

00:49:37,000 --> 00:49:39,000

For instance, when I asked them, I said,

969

now look, if you come within the range of our guns, and we shoot you down,

970

00:49:45,000 --> 00:49:48,000

and there's a tendency to killing you while you're spraying your ship dock,

971

00:49:48,000 --> 00:49:51,000

would you defend yourself with the power that you have,

972

00:49:51,000 --> 00:49:54,000

which is even greater than any atomic power yet hooked up?

973

00:49:54,000 --> 00:49:57,000

Because it's the power that's a creative power, it's instant,

974

00:49:57,000 --> 00:49:59,000

and as well as the disintegrating power.

975

00:49:59,000 --> 00:50:02,000

They go, this disintegrates you in a twink of an eye.

976

00:50:02,000 --> 00:50:04,000

With that power they want to use it, aren't they?

977

00:50:04,000 --> 00:50:06,000

They said, no, we couldn't.

978

00:50:06,000 --> 00:50:09,000

We can't take advantage of our younger brother, because he doesn't understand,

979

00:50:09,000 --> 00:50:13,000

we'd have to die, to him dead, such as we know is an atomic system.

980

00:50:13,000 --> 00:50:17,000

They just, you just destroy their house and boy, they go ahead and fill another one,

981

00:50:17,000 --> 00:50:19,000

and better ones than they do destroy it.

982

00:50:19,000 --> 00:50:21,000

So you don't can't beat them at all.

983

00:50:21,000 --> 00:50:23,000

They always got their best of you.

984

00:50:23,000 --> 00:50:26,000

So that way, they said, we'd have to die, would you go dead?

985

00:50:26,000 --> 00:50:30,000

That time is struck with very funny, because if we all breathe in for well,

986

00:50:30,000 --> 00:50:33,000

whether we are today thinking in no sense or not,

987

00:50:33,000 --> 00:50:35,000

that we Christ is upon a cross,

988

00:50:35,000 --> 00:50:39,000

he too said, Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.

989

00:50:39,000 --> 00:50:44,000

They are actually living what they're supposed to be living instead of talking about it.

990

00:50:44,000 --> 00:50:46,000

And all we do is talk about it and never try to live it,

991

00:50:46,000 --> 00:50:48,000

while they are actually living.

992

00:50:48,000 --> 00:50:50,000

So they might say that they are a better Christian,

993

00:50:50,000 --> 00:50:53,000

if you want to use that word, then we are.

994

00:50:53,000 --> 00:50:55,000

And that is an everything.

995

00:50:55,000 --> 00:50:57,000

They look upon a human being as I stated before.

996

00:50:57,000 --> 00:50:59,000

That's the manifestation of a creator.

997

00:50:59,000 --> 00:51:01,000

That's how the planet is organized.

998

00:51:01,000 --> 00:51:03,000

They have leaders yet.

999

00:51:03,000 --> 00:51:06,000

Or overseers, you might say, that seems to things that are to be done.

1000

00:51:06,000 --> 00:51:09,000

There's plenty of this, there's plenty of that, and plenty of everything else.

1001

00:51:09,000 --> 00:51:14,000

So they have those overseers, which might be called like groups or states.

1002

But there is a central force that sees that all is done.

1003

00:51:17,000 --> 00:51:20,000

And that central force can be removed by any minute,

1004

00:51:20,000 --> 00:51:24,000

if it is the base, the purpose of the planet, when it starts working for itself.

1005

But that is eliminated, because it might work for yourself when you got plenty.

1006

00:51:28,000 --> 00:51:31,000

So obviously there's nobody trying to get both the others,

1007

00:51:31,000 --> 00:51:34,000

since they are all equal, as far as the benefits of the your talk are concerned,

1008

00:51:34,000 --> 00:51:36,000

to all of them alike.

1009

00:51:36,000 --> 00:51:40,000

So there is no such a desire even, as to try to get better than the other,

1010

00:51:40,000 --> 00:51:42,000

or get better at others.

1011

00:51:42,000 --> 00:51:45,000

They are constantly improving upon themselves,

1012

00:51:45,000 --> 00:51:48,000

either through dancing, through recreation or something.

1013

00:51:48,000 --> 00:51:52,000

They never go up there and put up a wrestling match, let us say,

1014

00:51:52,000 --> 00:51:54,000

only to meet the other guy.

1015

00:51:54,000 --> 00:52:00,000

They put up a wrestling match, maybe, with the purpose of seeing how either one of these has been developed,

1016

00:52:00,000 --> 00:52:02,000

how well they can develop from their own.

1017

00:52:02,000 --> 00:52:05,000

In other words, make their bodies still better for what they are,

1018

00:52:05,000 --> 00:52:09,000

without injuring those bodies, or in any shape or form.

1019

00:52:09,000 --> 00:52:11,000

They will not go through the state of injury, anywhere.

1020

00:52:11,000 --> 00:52:14,000

They know how body can go with their bodies, they know what the bodies can take.

1021

00:52:14,000 --> 00:52:18,000

But they keep on improving upon those bodies, all the time, through these various exercises.

1022

00:52:18,000 --> 00:52:21,000

They eat the same issue that I do.

1023

00:52:21,000 --> 00:52:24,000

They eat all kinds of vegetables, a lot of fish.

1024

00:52:24,000 --> 00:52:26,000

They do eat meat here and there.

1025

00:52:26,000 --> 00:52:31,000

Because there is a law there that flesh is flesh and carbon is carbon.

1026

00:52:31,000 --> 00:52:38,000

And they do keep the body going with the carbon necessary that can only come from flesh and nothing else.

1027

00:52:38,000 --> 00:52:43,000

Because nature transmits it to the non-money, and others cannot be denied.

1028

00:52:43,000 --> 00:52:46,000

But they do not raise animals or anything else for commercial purposes,

1029

00:52:46,000 --> 00:52:48,000

which is the big job of ours.

1030

00:52:48,000 --> 00:52:51,000

They do not slaughter if they did slaughter in the manner that we slaughter.

1031

00:52:51,000 --> 00:52:57,000

They do not frighten the animal or anything that might sway by the methods we do.

1032

00:52:57,000 --> 00:52:59,000

For instance, they do something like this.

1033

00:52:59,000 --> 00:53:01,000

They do it over the ray of course, no more later.

1034

00:53:01,000 --> 00:53:05,000

But if you were walking down the street and knew that nobody was after you,

1035

00:53:05,000 --> 00:53:08,000

that there was no one really hunting you down, you would not fear anything.

1036

00:53:08,000 --> 00:53:10,000

You would be very free.

1037

00:53:10,000 --> 00:53:12,000

And all of a sudden, the bullet come along, and you're heading, you went over,

1038

00:53:12,000 --> 00:53:15,000

and there was not the slightest moment of you fearing anything.

1039

00:53:15,000 --> 00:53:20,000

So you really passed away just like that, without any fear or premeditated talk of fear.

1040

00:53:20,000 --> 00:53:25,000

So the animal goes the same way when it does happen, but not very often.

1041

00:53:25,000 --> 00:53:30,000

But the idea that they're better than you and I are, they are not.

1042

00:53:30,000 --> 00:53:32,000

They are identically sad as you and I.

1043

00:53:32,000 --> 00:53:36,000

Better be gave you some example and a way of development.

1044

00:53:36,000 --> 00:53:40,000

The difference between our stage of development and that of theirs.

1045

00:53:40,000 --> 00:53:46,000

So you will see that they are not to be worshipped as they have already been by some groups,

1046

00:53:46,000 --> 00:53:48,000

and they don't want that to be done.

1047

00:53:48,000 --> 00:53:51,000

They actually oppose it altogether.

1048

00:53:51,000 --> 00:53:54,000

They dislike the idea of being worshipped or considered as master or this.

1049

00:53:54,000 --> 00:53:59,000

Although I give my name in my book, that was a mistake on my part.

1050

00:53:59,000 --> 00:54:05,000

Because I give that name as master's, but there's no such a thing as a master anywhere as they say.

1051

00:54:05,000 --> 00:54:10,000

Yet I had to give some ideas to convey to you the difference of their development and of mine,

1052

00:54:10,000 --> 00:54:13,000

and I used that name, which was wrong for me to use.

1053

00:54:13,000 --> 00:54:18,000

But, and the next book comes along, I'll have to do some explaining on it.

1054

But anyway, let us skip the percentage.

1055

00:54:21,000 --> 00:54:25,000

Now that this does not mean that they're actually that way,

1056

00:54:25,000 --> 00:54:31,000

but just the idea, just the development, or the difference between their mental stage and that of ours.

1057

00:54:32,000 --> 00:54:35,000

They'll say that we are 10% designed as claim.

1058

00:54:35,000 --> 00:54:39,000

We have developed 10% mental abilities in this world today.

1059

00:54:39,000 --> 00:54:45,000

Well, they have developed on Mars a 15, 5% better than we are.

1060

00:54:45,000 --> 00:54:50,000

They have still 85% to go to make 100.

1061

00:54:50,000 --> 00:54:53,000

On Venus, they developed 20%, so they'd have 20.

1062

00:54:53,000 --> 00:54:57,000

Actually, 80% yet to go for improvements.

1063

00:54:57,000 --> 00:54:59,000

We have developed 10%, so we got 90 to go.

1064

00:54:59,000 --> 00:55:01,000

That is the difference.

1065

00:55:01,000 --> 00:55:04,000

They don't find fault with us, as you can see from the book I've written.

1066

00:55:04,000 --> 00:55:06,000

They only show you the difference.

1067

00:55:06,000 --> 00:55:10,000

They have not come here with the idea of converting us to their ways,

1068

00:55:10,000 --> 00:55:13,000

or to bring up a new religion of any kind.

1069

00:55:13,000 --> 00:55:16,000

They are non-religious, not political, all together.

1070

00:55:16,000 --> 00:55:21,000

They're not concerned with races, politics, or nations.

1071

00:55:21,000 --> 00:55:24,000

They're concerned with people when they speak, the people they speak with,

1072

00:55:24,000 --> 00:55:31,000

to people whether they be Nichols, whites, be communists, or Christians.

1073

00:55:31,000 --> 00:55:32,000

They're only people.

1074

00:55:32,000 --> 00:55:35,000

They don't recognize the Nichols and Ascends as we do.

1075

00:55:35,000 --> 00:55:37,000

So therefore, they're concerned with people.

1076

00:55:37,000 --> 00:55:41,000

And also, they are concerned with the world itself.

1077

00:55:41,000 --> 00:55:43,000

For the world is changing today, and we know it.

1078

00:55:43,000 --> 00:55:48,000

We have the geography clear, and it's been extended for another 18 months,

1079

00:55:48,000 --> 00:55:53,000

all because the science has found things that they are showing up

1080

00:55:53,000 --> 00:55:58,000

where something of unpredictable at the moment

1081

00:55:58,000 --> 00:56:02,000

could take place that might not be pleasant for the society of the world.

1082

00:56:02,000 --> 00:56:04,000

They're watching that.

1083

00:56:04,000 --> 00:56:07,000

And such publications already come out

1084

00:56:07,000 --> 00:56:11,000

are the findings of the first 18 months of research work on the expanded field,

1085

00:56:11,000 --> 00:56:14,000

and as is known in the Dell publication, The World in Space,

1086

00:56:14,000 --> 00:56:17,000

35 central quotations in the popular edition,

1087

00:56:17,000 --> 00:56:19,000

has all the information of the first 18 months.

1088

00:56:19,000 --> 00:56:23,000

You didn't get it, and you see what's going on for yourself.

1089

00:56:23,000 --> 00:56:27,000

Where all the top scientists and all the top military branches

1090

00:56:27,000 --> 00:56:30,000

spend in the field of research and about these things do happen.

1091

00:56:30,000 --> 00:56:32,000

So they're concerned with that.

1092

00:56:32,000 --> 00:56:35,000

More than that, they're also concerned in case of a warfare,

1093

00:56:35,000 --> 00:56:39,000

which they try to prevent as well of atomic nature.

1094

00:56:39,000 --> 00:56:44,000

Anybody knows that the weak foes, which we do have by saying that those foes,

1095

00:56:44,000 --> 00:56:49,000

and many others, if a given amount of concussions

1096

00:56:49,000 --> 00:56:54,000

are placed in that particular vicinity where these foes really are,

1097

00:56:54,000 --> 00:56:57,000

well, we wonder whether those foes could take it or not.

1098

00:56:57,000 --> 00:57:00,000

But concussions of atomic nature,

1099

00:57:00,000 --> 00:57:04,000

a thousand bombs a day or more,

1100

00:57:04,000 --> 00:57:07,000

the chances are they might open up,

1101

00:57:07,000 --> 00:57:09,000

and they open up wider than they are.

1102

00:57:09,000 --> 00:57:13,000

There's also a chance that the world would split in half and go to pieces.

1103

We probably wouldn't know anything about it by that time,

1104

00:57:16,000 --> 00:57:17,000

but it would go to pieces.

1105

But that would affect the system.

1106

Since all of this system are balanced by the planets

1107

and the positions of the planets whole in those systems,

1108

they are balanced.

1109

Not one out, and although this whole system are balanced,

1110

no different than if you took a ladder out of a front wheel or a back wheel

of your car that's put on there to balance up those wheels,

but throw the car out of balance and you have a rock right.

So they are observing from that purely scientific intervention,

yet and also preventing us from going all out in the world of that nature,

But aside from that, I don't care what you believe and what you don't believe.

1118

They're not here to impose upon your mind any new ideas of religion.

If you think that there is, are better than what we got,

1120

00:58:02,000 --> 00:58:05,000

then it's up to you to have it, to take it.

You don't have to pay for it.

1122

And not to scrape it.

1123

00:58:08,000 --> 00:58:11,000

And the only reason why the book has been written to take my,

1124

00:58:11,000 --> 00:58:13,000

for instance, the satisfaction of the way it has,

1125

00:58:13,000 --> 00:58:16,000

because it was wrote that I come through England.

1126

I come through England, I don't know its laws, so I ask you,

1127

00:58:19,000 --> 00:58:22,000

you tell me what I can do, what I can't do.

1128

You have never been in America, maybe?

1129

00:58:24,000 --> 00:58:26,000

So you ask me, how is America?

1130

And this and that.

1131

We exchange information of each nation.

1132

And that's what they've done to me, and that's what I've written about

1133

Their church is everything living.

They employ the law or exercise the law which Christ taught us.

It's very simple law.

which is a divine law.

1237

the beauty of the building of it.

And that's what they do in every form.

So he's not an equally of the artist himself.

In other words, they recognize all faces of mental development

that fit into the plan of society which makes the whole planet live

as a unit together and progressing together.

Everyone does something different.

1251

Then they too, being the men who are, they do not exhaust very much energy

1252

in talking to each other.

They pass the task of linking one another and they recognize themselves.

And if you go back in your own thought,

So they use that.

1259

Intersakings and so forth, they use sound.

1260

Otherwise they don't.

Then also, they also get a lot of information

1262

for the improvement of the planet from children that are just born.

1263

Child that's just born, many times you have seen it.

1264

While in the cradle, they smile.

and that negative begins to express itself in a happy form.

Should they see something, or some new revelation is coming through that pure mind

1276

they'll accept it and incorporate it into their society

immediately as a betterment of their society.

While we think fun, the child will get a laugh ourselves

is an incorporated there.

1299

But here is one that's last years

1300

01:07:03,000 --> 01:07:07,000

by the version of the United States of America.

1301

01:07:07,000 --> 01:07:10,000

Eisenhower, in Congress in recent months,

1302

01:07:10,000 --> 01:07:13,000

took the most decisive and substantially important steps

1303

01:07:13,000 --> 01:07:16,000

to give solid significance and great prestige

1304

01:07:16,000 --> 01:07:21,000

to his space exploration and to study, get this one,

1305

01:07:21,000 --> 01:07:26,000

and to study off-craft from space.

1306

01:07:26,000 --> 01:07:31,000

You know yourself that you cannot study off-craft from space

1307

01:07:31,000 --> 01:07:34,000

unless it's coming from space to here.

1308

01:07:34,000 --> 01:07:38,000

But, you cannot study craft from space when it's in the air

1309

01:07:38,000 --> 01:07:41,000

unless it lands, then you can make a good study of it.

1310

01:07:41,000 --> 01:07:44,000

Go through it and study it very well.

1311

01:07:44,000 --> 01:07:46,000

But here it is.

1312

01:07:46,000 --> 01:07:51,000

I'll repeat it again. Exploration and study are craft from space

1313

01:07:51,000 --> 01:07:56,000

in all problems of air phenomena.

1314

01:07:56,000 --> 01:08:00,000

So you have official acknowledgement of them here.

1315

01:08:00,000 --> 01:08:03,000

This bill became a law, actually passed.

1316

01:08:03,000 --> 01:08:07,000

And if you want the number of bills to write for, you'll never write to have it.

1317

H.R. 85568.

1318

It passed and signed by the President of the United States,

1319

01:08:14,000 --> 01:08:17,000

incorporating in that sense this particular statement

1320

01:08:17,000 --> 01:08:24,000

on all levels when it was a bill in July the 29th of 1958.

1321

01:08:24,000 --> 01:08:29,000

So America has officially announced them to be officially.

1322

01:08:29,000 --> 01:08:31,000

You can't get any more.

1323

01:08:31,000 --> 01:08:36,000

Now, any more that you might want cannot be brought up as this guy went to any position

1324

01:08:36,000 --> 01:08:40,000

until the people themselves settle down and be ready for more.

1325

01:08:40,000 --> 01:08:42,000

There is a lot more to it, naturally.

1326

01:08:42,000 --> 01:08:45,000

But the great body of the Indian has been appointed.

1327

To handle the situation, this is not now known as you will be reading as time goes on.

Your own nation made an announcement here just a few days ago

1329

Frankly speaking, there are 87 nations that have been incorporated in that particular setup

that I just mentioned.

1332

87 nations.

1333

Your nation made a statement here that has recently entered the space race.

1334

Naturally.

1335

01:09:13,000 --> 01:09:18,000

Well, the space race is known by the letters M-A-S-A.

1336

01:09:18,000 --> 01:09:23,000

It's the same group of men which are civilians connected with the government

1337

01:09:23,000 --> 01:09:27,000

also with another grade to some degree, but mostly civilians set up.

1338

01:09:27,000 --> 01:09:32,000

No one is the M-A-S-A that shot this last shot out

1339

01:09:32,000 --> 01:09:36,000

that joined the sparkling of the Russians that is circling the sun.

1340

01:09:36,000 --> 01:09:38,000

No one is the one shot.

1341

01:09:38,000 --> 01:09:41,000

It's this group that did it.

1342

01:09:41,000 --> 01:09:45,000

In this group, actually, he's gonna do not more.

1343

To give you a little idea on that, and I hope that it's not taken politically,

1344

01:09:48,000 --> 01:09:50,000

as somebody says it might be political,

1345

01:09:50,000 --> 01:09:52,000

what does the bill mean?

1346

Just a shot. I'll give you.

1347

The bill means that you and I will live

1348

instead of having atomic bomb terraces to pieces.

Nailings.

1350

Because we have and are at the moment on war economies, you know.

1351

Changing over to the space economy,

1352

a space will demand a lot more instruments than we have for war purposes,

1353

a lot more exploration,

1354

not more ships of various types as we learn what is needed,

1355

01:10:24,000 --> 01:10:28,000

and the employment that could be otherwise not employment

1356

01:10:28,000 --> 01:10:32,000

will be full and maybe more people employed than they are even now.

1357

01:10:32,000 --> 01:10:34,000

They may be a greater demand for labor,

1358

01:10:34,000 --> 01:10:37,000

for all sorts of mechanics, science and every type,

1359

01:10:37,000 --> 01:10:39,000

as we venture into outer space.

1360

We today in America are already building a spacecraft.

1361

You are too.

1362

01:10:44,000 --> 01:10:46,000

Have you knew the truth?

1363

01:10:46,000 --> 01:10:49,000

We are building it. We're not making any bones about it.

1364

01:10:49,000 --> 01:10:52,000

And I have an article right here

1365

01:10:52,000 --> 01:10:56,000

that says it's contracted last November.

1366

01:10:56,000 --> 01:10:58,000

Right here I have. It's been public.

1367

01:10:58,000 --> 01:11:00,000

So it's nothing new.

1368

01:11:00,000 --> 01:11:02,000

They do.

1369

01:11:02,000 --> 01:11:04,000

It's this one here. We asked for this.

1370

01:11:04,000 --> 01:11:07,000

And the man that asked for these bits of a spacecraft

1371

01:11:07,000 --> 01:11:11,000

has the same management degree in that in reference to the ending essay program,

1372

01:11:11,000 --> 01:11:13,000

a shout-out to Moonshot.

1373

01:11:13,000 --> 01:11:15,000

Same man.

1374

01:11:15,000 --> 01:11:18,000

We have all the aircraft and missile manufacturers

1375

01:11:18,000 --> 01:11:21,000

to give a bit to the United States government

1376

01:11:21,000 --> 01:11:24,000

for a spacecraft that will go out there and come back, bring people back.

1377

01:11:24,000 --> 01:11:29,000

We also are already training 50 men and women, young people.

1378

01:11:29,000 --> 01:11:33,000

I say young because it's from 20 to 40 years of age.

1379

01:11:33,000 --> 01:11:35,000

We should come and ask for volunteers,

1380

01:11:35,000 --> 01:11:38,000

and we are training them for this particular trip.

They'll be going to Venus, directly to Venus.

And a sociology is one of the things they must learn.

whether these human beings look like us or not,

that these things that fly through space are controlled intelligently.

They produce intelligent maneuvers that only intelligent could produce.

So any one of the technical means is

1399

the intelligence in there are capable of moving through space as it can and we can.

So then we started out.

And so you might say that a flying saucer really was the one that gave us a kick.

What a little jump they did have on us.

1407

Same thing.

1408

So you see, the saucers have actually, as they are called,

1409

done tremendous livelihood to the society already.

1410

Telling us that we can't live providing we go out of space.

1411

Because if we continue in the war effort, we eventually must have a war.
