170

Yeah, I spoke directly with these people.

Well, in cross communication, you know,

It isn't a language of English or Chinese or whatever it may be.

195

I think it's a time in some fields at church.

198

199

There's more than one kind of pre-fold U.S. over

201

202

use of the word carnation is extremely unfortunate

204

205

that's just classifying them as it may be past.

207

But in time, that's like a brand new...

208

Yeah, U.S.O. isn't even a proper title.

209

as unidentified flying objects,

212

yet they know what they are.

So they're really identified flying objects.

214

They do?

215

00:12:37,000 --> 00:12:38,000

Oh, definitely.

216

They've got at least six of the ships that they have.

217

Where?

218

00:12:42,000 --> 00:12:45,000

They were forced down to mechanical failures

219

00:12:45,000 --> 00:12:48,000

and at least six of them are left.

220

00:12:48,000 --> 00:12:51,000

One time they were right-handed from fields

221

00:12:51,000 --> 00:12:54,000

and now I believe they're all under private research

222

00:12:54,000 --> 00:12:56,000

and various companies around the country.

223

Mm-hmm.

224

What happened to the pilots of the...

225

or intelligence of piloting the...

Well, I wouldn't know except the one that Frank Scully was about.

for the UFO, published by Citadel Press.

Dan Fry, I know that you possibly have read some of the articles that have appeared in the various magazines,

268

such as Fantastic Universe and other publications.

How do you feel about these articles that have appeared about flying saucers?

270

apparently spent almost no time or effort in determining the facts containing the things about which he writes.

and there are articles in which almost nothing stated in there as facts is actually facts.

283

In other words, you feel that they didn't do an adequate amount of research

284

prior to writing the article, as far as the facts could be determined readily yet.

285

You are referring mostly to articles of what you might call a negative nature.

286

I have planned the whole idea of the UFO and stuff.

287

Do you think that there is anybody who could be considered to be a qualified expert on the subject of flying saucers?

288

Well, this would be more a question of the definition of the term,

289

what is an expert and what is a qualification.

290

I think that anyone who wants to write an article on the subject

291

could readily obtain the facts that is described by the individual's name,

292

his first name, his place of residence, and things like this, which are readily attainable.

293

And if these are put in correctly, then the individual is welcome to have anything on the subject, which he chooses.

294

Well, how about the story, forgetting about the fact that possibly they have misspelled a name or possibly misscoded an age?

Maybe he had something better fit for him than the back of the jacket.

And similarly, in other material, when we have had honor piercings and some reason to mention anyone,

Oh, we've got other people there.

We've got other people there.

As far as CSI, well, that in theory, we were not doing the science fiction article

356

when you have an article on this content page,

357

where there are people who claim to have had these experiences.

I mean, you know, this is the article I'm trying to say.

I wasn't aware that it was a science fiction.

But if you serve CSI and I must say this,

because nobody can see if I have a contact with me

and have their readers to see if they all contact with the host.

Or a family.

392

I think the person December 15th, you know, the bulletin was in it.

They had a, the bulletin by the day and a half.

I'm a little inclined to take similar issues to hand

424

on the being, at least, mildly skeptical in some of these cases,

425

because we have to distinguish between two types of what you might call negative articles.

426

The thing that Stan Fly started out talking about a while ago was the article written

427

by what you might call a professional debunker.

428

A debunker has to be a debunker. He hasn't got any occupations.

429

00:28:50,000 --> 00:28:59,000

And if he keeps it up, he does run into the situation where he doesn't have legitimate

430

00:28:59,000 --> 00:29:03,000

or at least accurate information to do with it.

431

00:29:03,000 --> 00:29:12,000

Now, I don't think the CSI boys are quite the famous category as professional debunkers.

432

00:29:12,000 --> 00:29:18,000

I think the biggest trouble is that like, whether you're a dead bloke or both of whom I know

433

00:29:18,000 --> 00:29:25,000

and consider very good friends, the racist couple with him is simply a useful enthusiast.

434

I'm writing for ghetto on one of these things, and writing is a little hardy,

435

and they are just trying and doing. On the basis that Stan points out,

436

00:29:35,000 --> 00:29:42,000

the special knowledge they have in hand are times when I'm inclined to agree with him,

437

00:29:42,000 --> 00:29:46,000

and not to make the right of his statements in any case.

438

00:29:46,000 --> 00:29:55,000

It's my privilege to agree or not to agree with my privilege to make unwanted and unbounded statements.

439

Well, as very pointed out, I have no objection to any conclusion that anyone who has that

440

00:30:01,000 --> 00:30:05,000

provided that that conclusion is based on the reason in which one has researched the universe

441

00:30:05,000 --> 00:30:11,000

on destination. As you say, there are some people who are called professional scoffers

442

00:30:11,000 --> 00:30:16,000

who make a living by sharing the things that they know nothing about.

443

It doesn't matter what they know anything about them or not, because their only good job is to share anything with them.

444

There's another thing that hasn't occurred to a lot of people in regard to contact stories,

445

and that is that these stories can be proved that they cannot be disclosed.

446

When Man says he saw something, he cannot possibly prove that he didn't do it,

447

as he may be, and by the way, I think it proves that he did.

448

And if you want that at the time, it's a little dangerous to say that that is definitely untrue.

449

Well, have you ever met anybody more skeptical that they've claimed that they've had a physical contact

450

00:30:56,000 --> 00:31:04,000

or a number of physical contacts with people from other planets and that they've been able to offer you any proof?

451

I don't think anybody has ever offered me anything that I could call proof.

452

00:31:10,000 --> 00:31:14,000

Of course, I haven't made any serious efforts to find a proof either.

453

Well, you've talked with a lot of these people more.

I've talked to just a few people.

You've talked to Howard.

I know of this program.

You've talked to Dan.

I know of Dan.

George Van Patel.

George Van Patel.

Oh, I see.

463

And one or two other people.

464

I've played, I haven't yet been confronted with anything, which I consider an iron-clad proof.

465

And I certainly am not going out on the limb as the last CSI does, and stating flatly that what somebody said he did is not true, I can't prove.

I think we ought to look into this term proof a little bit.

What would be proof? In other words, if you brought me a publication here and you told me that this was a magazine that printed on the planet Mars, I don't know what I could say about it.

If you brought me a piece of metal, if you brought me a piece of fabric or anything, very frankly, this would not prove anything to me.

I agree with you that it wouldn't be proof to possibly many people who may listen to the program.

It would be proof of at least.

Hey, message, however, I also do know, because I have a little knowledge of magic and a little knowledge of pseudo-mind reading, that I would be able to do this for you.

Dan, have you got any idea on that?

Can you suggest I believe that they're real?

And he was asked if he'd ever seen one.

And I have a massive cumulative evidence, which is the only thing you can't prove to people.

In my books, I've taken the attitude that I know a sense of faith as evidence for blind saucers that the other presented might stand on his own feet.

But when you have enough indication to stand a match to being proof, and when you come right down to it, you cannot pass it with proof.

The sun is going to rise tomorrow morning. It has been doing it for millions of years, but it may not go up tomorrow morning, but we won't be there.

Alright, then.

Can I listen to him, please?

Can you tell us a few things about him?

Belief is something similar to faith.

Only belief is actually a patient from the word be-lie, which means counter- faith.

Belief is a counter- faith, that's what it amounts to.

But it cannot be detected from the real faith.

The thing you're in college with, you're in the University of Jerusalem with the Dura, faith institutes, or faith psychology.

How do you go about...

Yeah, we probably have...

631

We are probably the only group that I know of in the United States that you could call the saucer-minded or saucer-researchers

632

We're not still trying to find out if these things are or are published cites, or never published cites.

634

We are trying to do something with the evidence we already have.

I'm a chemist, but for a very much interested in this theory, I find a little confusing if the apparent needs for cites,

636

and the theoretical cites in order to bring across this method from the people in capital letters to that lay people.

Why is there need for this?

638

What do you mean by that?

What do you mean by this mystical...

They don't know a few of the things that I know, but then on the other hand,

Do they really believe that there are people landing here,

664

in flying saucers, some other planet?

665

Well, I talked to two brain sources.

666

These postmortem brains are 16 bodies.

667

But as I say, if this hadn't been started under a security measure,

693

Do you know the name of these brain sources?

You can't say you've talked to them?

702

I've talked to them, yes.

703

00:49:37,000 --> 00:49:38,000

And you don't know them at the time?

704

00:49:38,000 --> 00:49:40,000

I was not concerned with their names.

705

To both the non-cubic cells.

706

They intermixed themselves, and they gave their names,

707

and my wife talked to them, and I have witnessed that they talked to them.

And they gave their names?

They gave their names, and they talked to them for two hours,

710

and I have witnessed this with the fact that they said what I just said.

741

Morty Jessup, in his most recent book, is the expanding case for the UFOs.

742

I'd like to get back, George, to that discussion that we were in at the time that we had to do a little business,

743

have to make a buck once in a while, you know.

744

It seems to me that he made this statement that I was not willing to accept truth when it's given to me.

745

Is that right?

Well, I told you something had happened, John, and because I couldn't possibly even name the two men,

747

But I wasn't interested in saucers as a research.

In other words, we were having experience in doing certain things ourselves,

or that controversies would arise over anything else.

To us at the time, it was just a little incident to take place every day, as real as anything else,

756

and nothing to expect you to question people about, or keep a record of everybody who talked to you and found the place.

We run a public air force, it's even 300 to 500 people a week, and we can't write down every conversation we have.

758

Well, did these two doctors arrive at your airport in a plane?

This must have been a very exciting day for you.

When you first came to the airport, they were going to tell you about 16 operations that they performed.

Well, contrary to being exciting, it was very dull, because I had so much information prior to that,

763

Further evidence.

For any purpose, right?

I think the statement here merely indicates that if there are no contributions, there can be no research.

1113

I don't think this could be safely implied as a request.

It is, as you said, a statement of fact.

If there are contributions, there can be research if there are no contributions.

That can't be the question.

One of the most important investment requests to anyone to join the conversation.

Anything of a proven nature?

Yeah, we are not going to...

1127

Anything of an attempt to prove a nature, you mean,

1128

in any stage of its operation, anything of an assumedly proven nature, you mean?

1129

01:20:46,000 --> 01:20:54,000

I mean, well, I mean that anything that we definitely know we can back up

1130

01:20:54,000 --> 01:21:00,000

with the rejuvenation of the lizard, to be an example of what it is in defenitonation of the lizard.

Well, matching the head in and then having the head grow back, is that the story?

Yeah, I guess two moments later you'll see.

1142

It is very true that...

1143

01:21:25,000 --> 01:21:27,000

I forget which morning it was at this point.

1144

01:21:27,000 --> 01:21:31,000

I think it was Wednesday morning.

1145

01:21:31,000 --> 01:21:41,000

George had a number of photographs here, and one group of photographs showed three...

1146

And pardon me if I use this term, gadgets, the only way I can describe it.

1147

Three pieces of equipment.

1148

01:21:47,000 --> 01:21:49,000

Three pieces of equipment.

1149

And he also had a 12-inch square next to it so that you can get a little idea of the size of these pieces of equipment.

1150

George also mentioned that they were not put together in their proper fashion so that anybody seeing the photographs would not know how this machine would function.

1151

Isn't that true?

1152

In other words, they were separate.

But the only way I could say is if we wanted to show a lead pencil, you'd have some graphite, and you'd have some wood over here, and you'd say,

Well, when I put these together...

There were four pieces of equipment.

No, there were four, and each one was built up out of other pieces.

1159

Yes, I realized that.

1160

They were built up pieces of equipment.

1161

Now, can I contribute that?

1162

Life is skeptical, no care.

1163

01:22:43,000 --> 01:22:46,000

I'm a research worker in addition to being an editor.

1164

01:22:46,000 --> 01:23:04,000

If you showed me these pictures, and on the back there were notations by an independent witness saying that I testify notarized notations saying I've testified that at 105, this was the physical appearance of the lizard.

1165

01:23:04,000 --> 01:23:08,000

The next picture I testified at 115.

1166

01:23:08,000 --> 01:23:10,000

I testified at 125.

1167

01:23:10,000 --> 01:23:16,000

I think I would be completely receptive.

1168

These pictures were only taken to bring back years still along the aisle.

1169

Well, but you see, you can understand that in the absence of...

1170

I have witnesses that have seen these things work.

1171

01:23:28,000 --> 01:23:30,000

I don't need to write on the back of a picture.

1172

01:23:30,000 --> 01:23:32,000

Could you tell us something about the witnesses?

1173

01:23:32,000 --> 01:23:34,000

I do, could write.

1174

01:23:34,000 --> 01:23:35,000

I'm suggesting the witnesses.

1175

01:23:35,000 --> 01:23:37,000

I haven't their addresses with me.

1176

01:23:37,000 --> 01:23:39,000

Could you tell us the name?

1177

01:23:39,000 --> 01:23:41,000

One of them is named Zarno.

1178

01:23:41,000 --> 01:23:43,000

Yes.

1179

01:23:43,000 --> 01:23:48,000

Two of his friends who I don't recall their names because my association was not with them.

1180

01:23:48,000 --> 01:23:50,000

Are they the only witnesses?

1181

01:23:50,000 --> 01:23:53,000

No, there are several of their wives.

1182

01:23:53,000 --> 01:23:56,000

Any other men's wives?

1183

01:23:56,000 --> 01:23:58,000

Yes, there are other people.

1184

01:23:58,000 --> 01:24:02,000

May I make a suggestion, George, for our listeners?

1185

01:24:02,000 --> 01:24:06,000

Because there are many nights that they're not with us on the program.

1186

01:24:06,000 --> 01:24:10,000

And after all, we just started the program back in August.

1187

01:24:10,000 --> 01:24:12,000

And we were only on the air for two or three months.

1188

01:24:12,000 --> 01:24:15,000

That is the last time that you appeared on the program.

1189

I wonder if you'd be kind enough and a specific brief outline of what happened on the desert

1190

01:24:21,000 --> 01:24:24,000

when you found the two lizards with the crushed heads.

1191

01:24:24,000 --> 01:24:26,000

What happened when I found them?

1192

01:24:26,000 --> 01:24:28,000

Well, you handled it anyway.

1193

01:24:28,000 --> 01:24:30,000

Well, we didn't find them.

1194

01:24:30,000 --> 01:24:35,000

In fact, most of this research was conducted by this man, Donald, who was an associate.

1195

01:24:35,000 --> 01:24:37,000

He's got his last name on here.

1196

01:24:37,000 --> 01:24:39,000

Yes, his last name.

1197

01:24:39,000 --> 01:24:49,000

And the lizard head was smashed against a venture table or something.

1198

01:24:49,000 --> 01:24:51,000

Was this done intentionally?

1199

01:24:51,000 --> 01:24:52,000

Yes.

1200

01:24:52,000 --> 01:24:53,000

To conduct the investigation?

1201

01:24:53,000 --> 01:24:55,000

No, it was done intentionally.

1202

01:24:55,000 --> 01:25:00,000

Well, don't mind me asking the question, George, because I'm not too familiar with the story at this point.

1203

01:25:00,000 --> 01:25:13,000

The only thing is that we found out in this research that if this time phase exceeded the differential of this field,

1204

01:25:13,000 --> 01:25:16,000

that the lizard would completely disintegrate.

1205

01:25:16,000 --> 01:25:24,000

And so we demonstrated again that the very forces which we can heat ourselves with can also burn it.

1206

01:25:24,000 --> 01:25:34,000

And in other words, this particular field not only assembles the atomic structure of the head and makes it well again,

1207

01:25:34,000 --> 01:25:38,000

but if you don't get him out of there in the right time, right, it won't be anything less of it.

1208

01:25:38,000 --> 01:25:48,000

So we've held a lot of this information for that reason, because we're dealing with a force that's greater than atomic energy

1209

01:25:48,000 --> 01:25:52,000

as prior to atomic energy, and even atoms are born from it.

1210

01:25:53,000 --> 01:25:54,000

Prior?

1211

01:25:54,000 --> 01:25:56,000

Prior to atomic energy?

1212

01:25:56,000 --> 01:25:57,000

Yes.

1213

01:25:57,000 --> 01:25:59,000

The force in which atoms are born.

1214

01:25:59,000 --> 01:26:01,000

Oh, I see atoms on the moon.

1215

01:26:01,000 --> 01:26:05,000

For science, what happens to the heads of the lizard before it would be a story?

1216

01:26:05,000 --> 01:26:10,000

Precisely what happens is that every atom is like a person.

1217

01:26:10,000 --> 01:26:15,000

It's intelligent to understand, and knows its purpose as an element.

1218

01:26:15,000 --> 01:26:22,000

And as all of the people who left that lecture tonight knew their way home without having to ask anybody,

1219

01:26:22,000 --> 01:26:26,000

when these atoms are dispersed in the crushing of the head,

1220

01:26:26,000 --> 01:26:33,000

if they are permitted to be removed from all forces, which tends to hold them apart,

1221

01:26:33,000 --> 01:26:37,000

they will immediately reassemble themselves into what they would call home,

1222

01:26:37,000 --> 01:26:40,000

or the last position they knew when they were aged.

1223

01:26:40,000 --> 01:26:44,000

Which is a quarry that they would call a factory in the morning.

1224

01:26:44,000 --> 01:26:46,000

Anyway, that's what takes place.

1225

01:26:46,000 --> 01:26:49,000

Yeah, well, the reason to face it is for the man who will tell us to understand,

1226

01:26:49,000 --> 01:26:55,000

so you all are without too descriptive words, you smash in the head of the lizard,

1227

01:26:55,000 --> 01:26:59,000

you put it under machine, it causes the earth to be under certain conditions,

1228

01:26:59,000 --> 01:27:01,000

and the head grows back to normal.

1229

01:27:01,000 --> 01:27:02,000

And the head grows back to normal.

1230

01:27:02,000 --> 01:27:05,000

Now, I may ask you, though, how many witnesses did you have to get?

1231

01:27:05,000 --> 01:27:08,000

Actually, I could stick to seven.

1232

01:27:08,000 --> 01:27:13,000

I don't recall that offhand, but it might have been eight, it might have been twelve.

1233

01:27:13,000 --> 01:27:17,000

I just can't recall exactly at the moment,

1234

01:27:17,000 --> 01:27:23,000

because I can kill anybody or take anybody to the witnesses out there,

1235

01:27:23,000 --> 01:27:25,000

but I can't present them here.

1236

01:27:25,000 --> 01:27:28,000

Wasn't it true, George, if my memory serves me correctly,

1237

01:27:28,000 --> 01:27:34,000

that during the time that you conducted this experiment with the ligus in the crushed head,

1238

01:27:34,000 --> 01:27:39,000

and the rejuvenating machine, that there were two brain specialists there?

1239

01:27:39,000 --> 01:27:46,000

No, no, the two brain specialists only came into my place and told me about the brain-based animals.

1240

01:27:46,000 --> 01:27:50,000

As I must frankly admit to you, I could be wrong,

1241

01:27:50,000 --> 01:27:53,000

but it seems that if my memory serves me correctly,

1242

01:27:53,000 --> 01:27:58,000

that when you were with me last October, that you mentioned that there were two brain specialists at that time,

1243

01:27:58,000 --> 01:28:01,000

and I also asked you the question if you need some help,

1244

01:28:01,000 --> 01:28:05,000

and they were from two major hospitals in the West Coast.

1245

01:28:05,000 --> 01:28:07,000

May I ask this, Mr. Van?

1246

01:28:07,000 --> 01:28:12,000

All these people from out in the West Coast, your witnesses are all out there.

1247

01:28:12,000 --> 01:28:16,000

Well, I just want to remind you your memory is very bad.

1248

01:28:16,000 --> 01:28:19,000

I spoke to you at the Pithian Temple when you elected there.

1249

01:28:19,000 --> 01:28:23,000

You told me the name of one of your witnesses, from Chicago,

1250

01:28:23,000 --> 01:28:29,000

another Wayne Wright from Indianapolis, that you couldn't give me the precise address.

1251

01:28:29,000 --> 01:28:32,000

Your story has changed, your memory is very bad.

1252

01:28:32,000 --> 01:28:36,000

Your story has changed, because I don't know any Smith and Chicago.

1253

01:28:36,000 --> 01:28:39,000

I imagine there are a lot of people who don't even know the name.

1254

01:28:39,000 --> 01:28:43,000

Well, in the time when you saw Simon, you might have thought Simon and then turned it into Smith,

1255

01:28:43,000 --> 01:28:45,000

because Simon is a man, not Smith.

1256

01:28:45,000 --> 01:28:49,000

Well, nobody, they're all from the West Coast, you just got a moment ago,

1257

01:28:49,000 --> 01:28:51,000

now in Chicago, you'd be an athlete.

1258

01:28:51,000 --> 01:28:54,000

Well, we as men are working on a equivalent research,

1259

01:28:54,000 --> 01:28:58,000

but they are not witnesses to the thing that I had.

1260

01:28:58,000 --> 01:29:03,000

Well, once again, sir, I say your story has changed, but you've gotten away from change.

1261

01:29:03,000 --> 01:29:05,000

You're getting away from a very basic issue.

1262

01:29:05,000 --> 01:29:12,000

A moment again, you vehemently said you were not asking for contribution for the rejuvenation machine.

1263

01:29:12,000 --> 01:29:14,000

Now you're justifying the contribution.

1264

01:29:14,000 --> 01:29:16,000

Now let me just quote again.

1265

01:29:16,000 --> 01:29:22,000

And once again, your language always tries to read your loophole.

1266

01:29:22,000 --> 01:29:26,000

that basically you are trying to tell the American public that there are saucers landing on this planet,

1447

and that people are arriving here from other planets, and that they're here to do as good?

1448

Definitely. We're trying to tell people some facts that are being withheld from the people.

1449

I think you could put it this way. I can see the controversy is going to develop.

1450

If the city engineer goes out into the park, into the city park, and puts a drink in fountain out there,

1451

he is not particularly concerned whether any individual drinks from that fountain are not.

It is his job to make that water available.

1453

If anyone wants to drink from it, why they can't, and if they don't, why there's no compulsion for whatever it is to do so.

Well, let me get back with George a moment, and this is not on personalities, George,

because you've been on the program before, and you've been with me a couple of times this trip,

and you discuss it, do you think that it's wrong for people to want to question you and get more information about it?

No, I don't object to anybody questioning me or coming and finding out anything that we are ready to release.

Well, of course, unfortunately, not all of us are in a position financially, and as far as time is concerned, to take a trip out to California.

1467

Yes, it's a conoscope. It's what the space people call a conoscope.

1468

What it is, we have many of them today which are really replicas or duplicates or counterfeits of the real thing.

1469

The original conoscope is counterfeited today in what we call a crystal ball.

1470

The original conoscope is made up in such a manner that the tuning of it is controlled by the thought of the individual looking into it.

1471

Does it look like a crystal ball?

1472

01:42:01,000 --> 01:42:03,000

It looks like a crystal ball when it's finished.

1473

01:42:03,000 --> 01:42:04,000

When it's finished?

1474

This man who happens to be conducting this particular research and making these parts, they've went to this thing because they aren't just one ball or many parts.

1475

And the axis of these particular crystals have to be in relative directions to form three planes.

1476

There's also three of the primary colors that go in the three planes.

1477

This thing will reproduce by thinking into it. It will reproduce whatever you desire to see.

1478

Red, black, and you'll bring it to the full color and motion, just like a motion picture.

1479

What will it do for us?

1480

If you want to see your mother, say in Nebraska or someplace, you could look in it and think of your mother and you would see her.

1481

Full motion, full color.

1482

This is one of the devices they carry around their pockets.

1483

01:42:58,000 --> 01:43:05,000

This thing they developed thousands of years ago and the one thousand years ago they developed it.

1484

01:43:05,000 --> 01:43:12,000

Well, they've had it for long enough so that they had them before they built the Great Pyramid.

1485

01:43:12,000 --> 01:43:23,000

The predictions made by Nostradamus were the result of his acquiring one of the few true conoscopes that were lost on this planet around the Great Pyramid.

1486

01:43:23,000 --> 01:43:25,000

Has he mentioned it in his book?

1487

01:43:25,000 --> 01:43:27,000

No, he doesn't think.

1488

01:43:27,000 --> 01:43:41,000

Without the necessity of assembling tubes and scopes and so forth, you could transmit from one of these crystals to any other crystal that were tuned to it.

1489

But this is unusual. This conoscope, isn't it? It seemed to me that it would make it great.

To ask John a question.

1516

John, you went to Yepa Valley. We are so fortunate as to watch any of the rejuvenation processes, obelisads, or the like.
