What were you thinking about?

I believed that being as a radiation all around the edge of it and the intensity of it

9

with no other body showing, I believed that this was the actual size of the object

10

when I was in communications in the Navy, you're probably familiar with the 24-inch art type used in visual communications.

11

Yes, and it would have the intensity of about, as I say, a 24-inch art type at about 10 miles or 12 miles.

It was a very intense light, it was very bright light.

13

I judged it visually again later, I had passed a Seattle approximate position of 20 miles

14

southeast of Redmond at 35,000 feet and was confirmed to me at 25 southeast of Redmond

15

00:01:49,000 --> 00:01:56,000

at various altitude between 6 and 52,000 feet by radar contact.

16

When I first put the binoculars up and looked at it, I was amazed to see that there was this radiation

17

around the edge of this object and just as I had put the binoculars up, there was a light, a tinnacle

18

come out of this and it was a crimson color red and they extended out to a quite sunny distance

and then some green work came closer to the object behind the red and then several other leaves

came out

and not in that particular pattern or sequence of color and about three of them came out

21

and then they retracted back into the object.

This is very important, so let's go back over this again.

At this time this object appeared around the edge of the object.

24

That's right, around.

And this pinnacle that came out at what part of the object?

26

Well, in comparison to say, top-of-the-side.

27

Well, going clockwise from 12 o'clock to around the clock, the first one appeared about between 2 and 3 o'clock

and the second one appeared at about 12 o'clock and the third one at 10 o'clock.

Now these tinnacles were of a different color now than the object.

30

You say they were, what color again?

They were, when it first came out, the first part of it was red as it extended further out,

it turned a greenish color and there was several occasions there was yellow along with these colors.

And this was a straight tinnacle or was it curved?

34

What was the shape of the tinnacle?

Well, it came almost straight out from the object and like a ray.

Well, it would be like a ray, it wasn't like a straight beam or anything, it was irregular as far as the edges or the end of it.

It looked something like a holding a finger up and just a slight curve.

But it had a curve, so it definitely was not a ray type.

It would not be a ray, it would definitely curve.

And all these objects had curves in the same direction.

Yeah, I said all curves from my position looking at the object would have been at about 035 degrees from the building

and which would have been over a quarter of a northeast there.

And the tinnacles curves to the back of it or towards the northeast.

45

Were these mechanical appendages sticking out from the object or were they gaseous?

Or could you describe them in more detail?

47

They couldn't be attached to any vapor or any of this radiation giving off a downlight was off of the main body of the object.

48

So they could be mechanical or they could be more solid structured.

49

In your opinion, what was this object?

Well, I couldn't answer that. I don't know. I never observed anything like this or would have any idea.

But this is my first experience ever sighting anything like this.

Well, as a flight service specialist, you undoubtedly have seen many varied forms of aircraft.

53

This was definitely something that you had never seen before and never seen anything like it.

And you then would not have the slightest idea as to what it might be.

No, I would.

The good before the beyonder and the intelligent control.

I would say it was. It seemed that it could move very easily.

I don't know about what time it was, but I had about a quarter to five in the morning.

66

I was about a quarter to five and it was the weather, it was cloudy, rainy, or it was clear there was a few scattered clouds.

But, to and of, would you say that you could distinguish stars?

Yes.

There was no doubt in your mind about what this was, it wasn't a star, at least.

Thought how big was it, Bob?

But how did it compare, I would say, with a star?

It was much larger than a star, but smaller than the moon.

Would you say it's sort of in between there or closer to the size of a star?

The one thing you are positive about though is that it is bigger or bigger than a star.

The only color to it, Bob, oh, it was a bright white, an intense light.

Well, when I first observed it, when it was close to the ground, why did it tree it or lit up?

83

There's Juniper trees on the edge of town where it was real bright.

There were trees that were looking out there in the background right now.

85

Yes, and it was moving or stationary when you first thought,

well, when I first observed the object, I thought it would be a falling star coming down.

87

It was moving a lot slower, but that's the only thing I could picture that it would be.

88

And it got pretty close to the ground and it stopped and the trees lit up and I just thought you'd know what it was.

89

You stopped the car then?

90

Yes, I did.

91

The car was in motion when first you noticed this thing?

92

And you stopped it to go to better look at it or did you think it was better to hit you?

94

Well, I thought it was going to hit the ground and I wanted to stop to see what it was going to look like,

because I couldn't think what else it would be other than a falling star.

Then did it remain perfectly stationary?

97

Well, it stopped close to the ground and it moved from side to side a little bit,

not in the extreme motion, but it did move.

There was some perceptible side to side motion of it, so what shape did it have?

100

Well, it was just a rather round shape, it's like a barrel.

And could you guesstimate its height from the ground?

Did it appear to have any motive power that you could tell?

No, not when I first noticed that it didn't.

How about an odor?

Was there a strange odor out of ozone or anything that would indicate heat?

What did you do after you watched it?

Well, I watched it for five or ten minutes, something like that.

And the object seemed to change to a faint, well, the white light went on,

116

it changed to a faint red glow and moved to the sky points, etherally.

117

And etherally directed, and some red ones, in the direction of the airport, in other words.

118

Yes.

You say there was a faint redish glow to it as it moved?

It was just a faint red glow moving to the sky.

And so when it came on out to the airport?

126

Yes, I did.

127

And that's the first you knew of it too, isn't it, LeVern?

128

Yes, that's the first I had, I hadn't observed it before that.

129

I had made the weather observation shortly before Bob came up,

130

00:11:00,000 --> 00:11:03,000

and it wasn't visible to me then.

131

And when Bob came up and recorded this,

132

I didn't get very excited to start with,

133

00:11:09,000 --> 00:11:14,000

and kind of figured maybe you might have been a bright star or something,

134

00:11:14,000 --> 00:11:18,000

and so I finished up my weather report and came out to take a look at it.

135

He pointed out to where it didn't move to, and it was bright again then.

136

00:11:23,000 --> 00:11:28,000

So it was too low and too bright to be a star.

137

00:11:28,000 --> 00:11:32,000

I had a brighter than anything I'd observed before anything.

138

00:11:32,000 --> 00:11:37,000

Would either of you gentlemen say it resembled anything you were familiar with

139

and objects you'd ever seen, either natural or man-made?

140

00:11:40,000 --> 00:11:43,000

It's nothing I've ever seen.

141

Anything you could imagine that man might create?

142

No.

00:11:47,000 --> 00:11:49,000

Nothing of the sort?

144

Nothing I could think of.

Do you have any idea what it was?

You don't have any opinions on this?
