When Deputy Fitzpatrick and Sergeant Schneider saw this phenomenon, they made about four pictures with a mid-ox camera.

These two pictures came out. They were enlarged by Detective Harold Curr of the Washington, Occhiavres department.

These two pictures are from separate negatives. They both show two light streaks, one here and one here, one here and one here,

in the same relative position from which the picture was taken. These were printed from separate negatives.

The resolution on this picture is a little bit better.

Yes, it is.

Are you relieved that there's something in the picture?

This was the housing section of Mylon Village. Street lights in the background and red lights.

And then you can vaguely see the outline of the clumps of trees all the way across the picture and a house at the far left side in both pictures.

These pictures were both taken from the same angle.

Detective Curr, the photo expert who made these enlargements from the mid-ox negatives, tells us that these two markings cannot be flaws in the negative.

He says there were no scratches on the emulsion side of the film.

In addition to that, these prints were made from separate negatives and they show these light streaks in the same place in each picture.
