The bad rule of phenomena, what about that?

And we've evaluated evidence in our National Committee in Washington.

Excuse me, I'm sorry.

I've confused the semantic issue here.

I believe that flying objects under intelligent control exist.

And that's the belief shared by the majority of our committee in Washington.

Flying objects under intelligent control.

That's right.

Well, that's the belief of Major Donald Keyhoses, Marine Corps, retired,

39

author of several books and head of the National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomenon.

This book, Colonel Tacker, has occupied me over much of the weekend.

41

It was a very exciting book to read.

42

00:02:08,000 --> 00:02:11,000

I've read some of Major Keyholes' books, too.

43

Air Force figures, I believe, show that they're been 6,523 reported fighting over the past 13 years.

44

What percentage of these, according to Air Force standards, remain unexplained?

45

Well, I'd have to go back to the early days and admit that in the very beginning,

46

when this was a new subject in, say, 47 and 1950, that the unknowns or the unidentified cases ran as high as 20%.

47

By 1953, they were down to 9%, and now they run somewhere between 2 and 3%.

48

2 and 3%?

49

00:02:50,000 --> 00:02:51,000

Yes, sir.

50

Major Keyholes, do you agree with that?

51

No, I don't.

52

00:02:55,000 --> 00:03:00,000

Because the Air Force has issued a statement, in fact, it's repeated in the Colonel's book here,

without any qualifications, that the Air Force says,

explain all but about 2% of the total.

55

And you may have your letter signed by an official in the Air Force,

which says that, up to the end of 1959, there were 565 cases unexplained,

a total of 9 and 410%, and incidentally, the official was Colonel Lawrence Jay Tuckett.

Our experts are experts on radar because they're alive because the Gad-Ero-Inners are the best experts.

our experts on radar only kind of don't split Soviet bombers.

At Washington Air Force, the experts on radar track these things at speeds up to 70,000.

We didn't need to do that.

Colonel, you've told a general wife forward to the book.

And the book is described as the official Air Force story.

But I'm going to say it that way by the Department of Defense.

Lieutenant Swipe, who of course is Chief of Staff,

235

the US Air Force has a forward,

236

but what he says essentially is that unidentified flying objects are investigated,

237

both are not a single, but the clear evidence of existence of the system found.

The funny ties in there, Dave, is the fact that by an active Congress,

But must the clear evidence of the existence of something be found before it's real?

247

Certainly. I believe so.

248

I don't think you have any.

249

Do you have a piece of wood in your hand?

250

No.

00:12:43,000 --> 00:12:44,000

Did it really?

252

Oh, I think it was.

253

00:12:46,000 --> 00:12:49,000

Yeah, but then you have spectrum analysis and light,

254

00:12:49,000 --> 00:12:52,000

to say, taken, you've got...

255

I'm not a scientist, I'm an information officer.

256

I'm a computer.

257

But there are such things as photographs and spectrum analysis and mathematical

258

that they can build up to a basis and collect.

259

Who is a pure scientist against that?

260

A very statement by somebody that's a pure spaceship.

I believe it is an active space.

262

And if I'm not too alright if I believe it is an active space like that,
