From the Yorkville Studio Theater in downtown Toronto on the Great Debate,

12

resolve that unidentified flying objects from outer space exist.

13

Your Chairman, D. E. Eberton.

14

Well, almost everybody in this audience thinks that UFOs from outer space exist.

15

The vote is 190 for the affirmative, to 32 for the negative.

And are they enough Major Kehoe that makes your job the harder one

17

because you have fewer minds to change?

And that is the purpose of a debate.

It might be hard for another reason.

All right. We'll give you four minutes.

So would you start the clock please for the affirmative and Major Donald Kehoe?

For over 15 years, my honorable opponent has known that UFOs are alien spaceships.

This is what Boss thought about.

He was piloting an Air Force bomber with two crewmen aboard,

when a metallic circular craft came swiftly toward them.

Now I will have to give Colonel Coleman credit.

29

Despite the possible danger, he went to full power and shot after it,

30

thinking he might get a closer look, but within a few seconds it was out of range.

Now this is something which should affect a man quite a bit,

32

and he's had such an experience, but it really backfired

33

because he was, sometime after that, appointed one of the leading UFO officers in Air Force headquarters.

That means he was assigned to explain away cases,

and some of them didn't require much because they were fakes anyway.

But back of this there was other evidence that he learned after he became a UFO officer.

He learned about General Nathan Twining's evaluation.

Lieutenant General Nathan Twining was a great figure in World War II,

Chairman of Joint Chiefs of Staff later.

He was then head of the Air Materiel Command,

41

00:02:57,000 --> 00:03:01,000

and using almost 100 experts on this command, he evaluated.

42

It's a conclusion, the UFOs were real, they were not illusions.

43

The majority of reports described flying discs, apparently metallic.

44

They were flat on the bottom, domed on top, and they gave indications of intelligent control,

45

either direct or remote, by the way they tried to evade approaching aircraft.

Now this is of the approach, but he recommended another full-scale scientific evaluation,

47

and in the following year these scientists came up with a top secret conclusion.

It was called an Estimated Situation, that the UFOs generally reported,

The chairman of this group wanted the Chief of Staff to make it available to the public.

General Bannonberg, who was then Chief of Staff, said no, he was afraid it would cause trouble.

And there was one more.

54

Major Dewey Fournier, monitor for the entire project with headquarters,

55

came out with a still bigger evaluation after the great flap of 52.

Same conclusions, interplanetary spaceships and the public should be told.

57

Now since then there have been many, many developments.

58

The situation has grown worse because over 50% of the people in the United States,

59

and I think in Canada, believe the UFOs are real,

and by implication they don't believe the official explanations.

What makes it more serious is that there have been a number of serious cases, double serious.

and people on the ground saw a sort of a ready show,

There was a terrific light, and the airliner disintegrated with everyone on board.

The vice president of Banff, who investigated this along with the civil air night board,

said it was the most horrible crash he'd ever investigated.

There was no bomb inside the airliner.

So what I have been concerned about is that a sudden evaluation would start a people

If it all came out at one time about the secret developments and the many cases,

And I think the public should be gradually prepared pressing the statement.

there's so put to arrive at conclusions that would stand up in court.

The legal fascination in Wounded Today is the question of whether there is life on other worlds.

I support Dr. Sagan's theory that perhaps in our galaxy there are something on the order of

100,000 to a million planets in this galaxy that perhaps have some form of intelligent life.

Moreover, my colleague would have you believe that this intelligent life is in fact in existence

90

and that it has visited the Earth, and very recently, perhaps even now.

The question we are exploring tonight, do they visit us or do they not?

92

Yes or no?

The general public seemed to demand a yes or no answer.

And that is the question I say cannot be answered, yes or no.

In the first place, you can't say no because you can't prove a negative hypothesis.

And it was precisely that attitude with which the United States Air Force approached Project Blue Book,

and for more, that is just the way we pursued our investigations, objectively, systematically, thoroughly, and carefully.

Yet with imagination, open minds.

100

During that 20 years, we found no evidence, not an iota, that would prove or tend to prove

101

that manned extraterrestrial vehicles under intelligent control were visiting the planet Earth.

None.

We found so far nothing to indicate any technology beyond our current state of the art of present-day knowledge.

The Earth Force was given the responsibility to investigate UFO sightings, and this mission was too foal.

105

And the honorable opponent knows exactly what that mission was.

106

Was the national security being threatened?

107

00:08:22,000 --> 00:08:24,000

Air defense.

108

National security threat.

109

00:08:26,000 --> 00:08:29,000

Was our national security being threatened?

And the second reason?

111

Do whatever possible to preclude technological surprise, whether it be from this planet or some other.

112

Our purpose was not to determine whether life existed elsewhere in the universe,

113

and I might add, contrary to reports, the United States Air Force has never denied the existence of extraterrestrial intelligent life.

114

The question was not in our provenance.

115

We have been, and I have been accused of being less than truthful with the public regarding UFO reports.

116

I can only tell you that the charge is totally denied by the Air Force and by me.

117

After the cessation of Project Buber, we were left with a residue of some 700 cases.

118

This residue, as long as there is one, leaves a problem, and that's what we're discussing tonight.

119

These few hundred cases included a number of puzzling sightings.

120

These are the ones that are once the strangest and the most credible.

121

It was easier, though, to identify high strangeness than high credibility.

UFO investigation is very fascinating. It's a fascinating, interesting subject.

123

The problem was often all too slippery.

124

For all the evidence we discovered and all that presented to us out of the thousands of cases,

125

00:09:56,000 --> 00:10:04,000

what we found was either originated here on this planet or was of natural origin outside the planet.

126

If we take present knowledge and present technology, we must conclude that we have not received extraterrestrial visitors,

127

00:10:12,000 --> 00:10:14,000

at least in recent times.

128

00:10:14,000 --> 00:10:18,000

There was no evidence to support the visitation theory.

129

00:10:18,000 --> 00:10:25,000

If one was to believe he's being visited, then he has to do it strictly on faith.

130

Thank you.

131

00:10:27,000 --> 00:10:32,000

Thank you, Colonel Coleman. Two minutes for a bottle. Start the clock for Major Keel.

132

00:10:32,000 --> 00:10:38,000

I was as bad a steppie as you were, and maybe worse, because I went around hitting my pilot friends in Marine Corps.

133

00:10:38,000 --> 00:10:42,000

That was before Admiral Farny, who was the head of Navy Guided Missiles,

134

00:10:42,000 --> 00:10:48,000

showed me 200 or more reports by Navy Marine Corps pilots, carrier pilots, and carrier officers,

135

00:10:48,000 --> 00:10:53,000

and some of them were close encounters, daylight, showing exactly what was described by pointing.

136

Incidentally, you did not mention the three evaluations.

137

I have one of them. The photos started on them with me. I'll show it to you later if you haven't seen it.

138

I also saw the 1948 top secret evaluation, and you mentioned that one when we met at Cape Kennedy,

139

but anyway, I've seen that in Fournier also, and here's the secret, and it's still being kept as an unfinished document.

140

So I don't know why you evade those particular documents, because those are the belt foundation.

141

Now, in 20 years, you say there's no evidence at all.

142

Well, perhaps when we get to a general exchange here, I can bring up some cases I would like to have you mention.

143

You say there were only 700 cases. Dr. Heineck stated there were over 3,000 when he left the Air Force.

144

They were completely unexplained. Nobody ever answered that either.

145

Now, there are quite a number of serious cases that do come to mind.

146

The F-89 interceptor, they chased an object out over Lake Superior, and with big, ripped radar,

147

and they saw the plane and the UFO merged on the scope, and then they vanished.

148

There were about five different answers put out on that.

149

Dr. Cape Kennedy, when I asked you about that case, and you said the Air Force explanation was that it was a Canadian airline that got off course.

150

And I said, well, I have copies of many of your letters. In fact, a whole stack of them, and a resume and a photocopies.

151

00:12:15,000 --> 00:12:21,000

And as a maternal, we looked into that, and the Canadian Airlines was denied completely. They were anywhere near it.

152

And then, shortly after that, you switched to the Royal Canadian Air Force.

153

We contacted the Chief of Staff of the Royal Canadian Air Force, and he denied there was anything to it at all, because we had nothing there.

154

Thank you, Major Kehoe. You'll get a chance later to argue with Colonel Coleman.

155

00:12:36,000 --> 00:12:43,000

In fact, in a moment, you'll be doing just that in a face-to-face confrontation when we come back from our usual break. We'll see you in a moment.

Some background on our debaters. Major Donald E. Kehoe is a writer who has been writing about flying saucers for 25 years.

157

00:12:52,000 --> 00:13:03,000

He's made 400 appearances on television and radio, written five books on the subject, his latest is called *Aliens from Space, the Real Story of Unidentified Flying Objects*.

158

00:13:03,000 --> 00:13:18,000

He was named National Director of the National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomenon some years ago, a position he held until 1970.

159

00:13:18,000 --> 00:13:21,000

He still remains on the board of that institution.

160

00:13:21,000 --> 00:13:30,000

Colonel William Coleman has just retired as Chief Public Information Officer of the United States Air Force, supposed to be held for five and a half years.

161

00:13:30,000 --> 00:13:39,000

He's a former World War II combat pilot with 15 missions. He was recalled for the Korean War and the Air Force, and stayed in after that.

162

00:13:39,000 --> 00:13:48,000

He's written two books on the use of animals in medical and space research. He writes science fiction stories. He just finished a screenplay. He's working on a novel.

163

00:13:48,000 --> 00:13:51,000

I have a couple of questions for each of you, gentlemen.

164

00:13:51,000 --> 00:13:56,000

You keep talking about top secret documents, Major Kehoe, but you apparently have them all.

165

00:13:57,000 --> 00:14:04,000

One of your briefcase and the rest of your head. How can they be top secret if you have these answers to them?

166

00:14:04,000 --> 00:14:14,000

Well, there is a rule that when the 12-year period is over, documents have to be declassified unless a strong reason is presented that there was a danger of security.

167

00:14:14,000 --> 00:14:24,000

A number of these things were released before then to me, but they were stamped declassified. I'm not naming anybody, but I have some very good friends in the Pentagon, including Air Force.

168

00:14:24,000 --> 00:14:30,000

Well, how can you say that the U.S. Air Force is hiding something if they're declassifying the very documents to use as their hiding?

169

00:14:30,000 --> 00:14:45,000

Well, the Freedom of Information Committee, aided by NICAP, the organization you mentioned, kept that there for about a year, and we finally got out, projects 1-12, which is an Air Force, a combination of documents, and all the sightings in there stamp either secret or confidential.

170

00:14:45,000 --> 00:14:53,000

Well, of course, to release them, they had to stamp and declassify. For all those years, these things were being hidden. I knew some of them, but I couldn't use them.

171

00:14:53,000 --> 00:15:10,000

I have a question or two for you, Colonel Colon. You did not answer Major Keough's point that

General Twining of the Chief of Staff himself, after a lengthy investigation, according to your opponent, said that unidentified flying objects were real.

172

00:15:10,000 --> 00:15:21,000

Well, this was prior to Colonel Twining becoming Chief of Staff and later Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. This was when he was head of the Air Force Logistics Command in the project.

173

00:15:21,000 --> 00:15:28,000

Since they handled the R&D or Research and Development Function, the Air Force, he headed that aspect up when he was a Lieutenant General.

174

00:15:28,000 --> 00:15:39,000

Yes, this was in the beginning of the project, and our first concern, of course, was air defense. Therefore, there was classification early on in the program when it was Project Grudge.

175

00:15:39,000 --> 00:15:46,000

But later, as we began to learn more, we began to look at a few thousand cases, things became declassified.

176

00:15:46,000 --> 00:15:49,000

Well, now, did Twining say or did he not say?

177

00:15:49,000 --> 00:15:50,000

Yes.

178

00:15:50,000 --> 00:15:52,000

The thing is unidentified flying objects from outer space.

179

00:15:52,000 --> 00:15:56,000

He said we must, we must be alert to that possibility.

180

00:15:56,000 --> 00:15:57,000

He didn't say there were.

181

00:15:57,000 --> 00:15:58,000

No.

182

00:15:58,000 --> 00:15:59,000

He said we must be alert to that possibility.

183

00:15:59,000 --> 00:16:00,000

That's right.

184

00:16:00,000 --> 00:16:01,000

You said they were real.

185

00:16:01,000 --> 00:16:03,000

I mean, he said they were real. I didn't say they were real.

186

00:16:03,000 --> 00:16:05,000

Well, now, unidentified flying objects are very real.

187

00:16:05,000 --> 00:16:08,000

Well, they're flying objects that are unidentified and remain so.

188

00:16:08,000 --> 00:16:16,000

But he said, objects that were circular, metallic, and right on the bottom, domed on top, which is the typical explanation of project sign.

189

00:16:16,000 --> 00:16:20,000

You remember there, there, what they came out with?

190

00:16:20,000 --> 00:16:24,000

Well, Donald, that was 25 years ago now.

191

00:16:24,000 --> 00:16:27,000

And yes, there were a lot of, and there were mistakes made.

192

00:16:27,000 --> 00:16:29,000

We had the wrong people in the project.

193

00:16:29,000 --> 00:16:30,000

Later on, we were finding.

194

00:16:30,000 --> 00:16:31,000

You mean the wrong person?

195

00:16:31,000 --> 00:16:32,000

No, no, no, wait a minute.

196

00:16:32,000 --> 00:16:34,000

Let's put it in and put it in the time.

197

00:16:34,000 --> 00:16:39,000

We hired Dr. Heineck later and brought him into the program as a consultant.

198

00:16:39,000 --> 00:16:43,000

I personally called him and assigned him to certain cases.

199

00:16:43,000 --> 00:16:48,000

Those that were high strangeness, high credibility, we thought.

200

00:16:48,000 --> 00:16:50,000

These are the cases that we had Heineck work on.

201

00:16:50,000 --> 00:16:51,000

We consulted with him.

202

00:16:51,000 --> 00:16:52,000

Well, there's another point.

203

00:16:52,000 --> 00:16:57,000

Now, as far as the 3,000 cases that he mentioned, there are still 700 some on.

204

00:16:57,000 --> 00:17:02,000

3,000 perhaps in Heineck's mind, but that's not an official Air Force point of view.

205

00:17:02,000 --> 00:17:09,000

In December of 69, when the Air Force said that he had quit everything, closed investigation, everything was done,

206

00:17:09,000 --> 00:17:12,000

then there wasn't a single case that remained unexplained.

207

00:17:12,000 --> 00:17:13,000

Now, that was released.

208

00:17:13,000 --> 00:17:14,000

That's not true.

209

00:17:14,000 --> 00:17:15,000

We never made such a statement.

210

00:17:15,000 --> 00:17:16,000

It's all over there.

211

00:17:16,000 --> 00:17:21,000

Well, I'll be glad to provide you copies of our official statement, which clearly show

212

00:17:21,000 --> 00:17:24,000

that we have about 730 odd cases.

213

00:17:24,000 --> 00:17:29,000

Well, I'll ask the case now that the Air Force wrote Vice President Humphrey when he was

214

00:17:29,000 --> 00:17:33,000

Vice President and said, now the single unexplained case, same thing, to Senator Birch Bay.

215

00:17:33,000 --> 00:17:35,000

And a lot of others got that kind of sweater.

216

00:17:35,000 --> 00:17:41,000

Now, somebody in the Department of Legislative Liaison was asleep or something along there

217

00:17:41,000 --> 00:17:45,000

because they're supposed to help Congress and give them the facts.

218

00:17:45,000 --> 00:17:48,000

Colonel, I'm still trying to figure out one thing.

219

00:17:48,000 --> 00:17:52,000

The major key was that you saw a metallic circular spacecraft.

220

00:17:52,000 --> 00:18:01,000

Yes, I was flying in a metro bomber from South Florida to a base in Mississippi about 2 o'clock

221

00:18:01,000 --> 00:18:03,000

on a cloudless Sunday afternoon around 2 o'clock.

222

00:18:03,000 --> 00:18:09,000

I spotted a strange object at what I would guess to be around 20,000 feet

223

00:18:09,000 --> 00:18:13,000

and some several miles in front of me to the right.

224

00:18:13,000 --> 00:18:16,000

I punched my copal and I said, do you see what I see?

225

00:18:16,000 --> 00:18:19,000

And he said, yes, I believe it's a reflection on our windscreen.

226

00:18:19,000 --> 00:18:21,000

I said, I don't think so.

227

00:18:21,000 --> 00:18:23,000

Start making a turn to the left.

228

Give me about one needle wet.

And of course the object moved and I said, well, it's for real and we're gaining on it.

230

That was strange because we were to lower altitude and a slower machine.

231

00:18:35,000 --> 00:18:41,000

And then the object began to descend in front of us and so I decided then to give chase.

232

I did go up to maximum military continuous power and then we started down.

233

00:18:47,000 --> 00:18:53,000

I was cruising at that time at about 10,000 feet and we did get very close to it

234

00:18:53,000 --> 00:19:00,000

and the sighting lasted for several minutes, not a few seconds, and we did gain on it.

235

It just didn't change your mind regarding the...

236

No, I saw an object that I could not identify.

237

00:19:06,000 --> 00:19:08,000

I was not then in research and development.

238

It could have been a test vehicle out of England.

239

00:19:10,000 --> 00:19:13,000

I doubt it, based upon knowledge that I could...

240

Are you any idea what it was?

241

00:19:14,000 --> 00:19:16,000

Have no idea.

242

00:19:16,000 --> 00:19:20,000

And it disappeared on me and I had several good observers.

243

00:19:20,000 --> 00:19:24,000

I had a representative of Lockheed Aircraft on board and a representative of the Allison

244

00:19:24,000 --> 00:19:30,000

Division of General Motors, plus my own co-pilot who was a flight engineer

245

00:19:30,000 --> 00:19:33,000

and of course my own enlisted flight engineer.

246

00:19:33,000 --> 00:19:35,000

We had no cameras unfortunately.

247

00:19:35,000 --> 00:19:41,000

Incidentally, the camera is the best tool to pursue this subject, Gretel.

248

Unless you get some of these people that get on the ground and hang something up on a wire

249

00:19:45,000 --> 00:19:46,000

and take a shot of it.

250

00:19:46,000 --> 00:19:50,000

Well, we have about four rooms full of photographs, like that,

251

00:19:50,000 --> 00:19:53,000

and we have computers, landshifts and all that.

252

00:19:53,000 --> 00:19:55,000

We can spot them almost in me.

253

00:19:55,000 --> 00:20:00,000

All right, but if the camera is the best evidence, what photographic evidence if any is there

254

00:20:00,000 --> 00:20:02,000

that there are objects found in space?

255

00:20:02,000 --> 00:20:07,000

Let's say that's just one aspect of evidence, Mr. Burton.

256

00:20:07,000 --> 00:20:13,000

The camera is a good tool because it's so readily available to everyone.

257

00:20:13,000 --> 00:20:15,000

But are there...

258

00:20:15,000 --> 00:20:22,000

Let me ask you if the Air Force examined photographs of so-called flying saucers in other space.

259

00:20:22,000 --> 00:20:27,000

We have two exposures of one unidentified flying object.

260

00:20:27,000 --> 00:20:29,000

We know it's a large object.

261

00:20:29,000 --> 00:20:37,000

It is dense, that is, it has mass, but we are not able to identify it under any known technology.

262

00:20:37,000 --> 00:20:43,000

But that doesn't mean that it came from Bernard Starr or Alpha Centauri.

263

00:20:43,000 --> 00:20:45,000

What do you have an unidentified object?

264

00:20:45,000 --> 00:20:48,000

I don't know whether you're referring to the Mendel case,

265

00:20:48,000 --> 00:20:54,000

but that was one where an object was said to have a man, a farmer and his wife named Trent.

266

00:20:54,000 --> 00:20:55,000

This was the Mendel case.

267

00:20:55,000 --> 00:20:56,000

That was what you were talking about?

268

00:20:56,000 --> 00:20:57,000

Yes.

269

00:20:57,000 --> 00:20:59,000

Well, all right, they kept quiet about for a while.

270

00:20:59,000 --> 00:21:05,000

They got pictures of it, and it shows this typical UFO thing with a sort of a dome on the top.

271

00:21:05,000 --> 00:21:08,000

And when I first saw it, I thought it was one of those funny rigged things.

272

00:21:08,000 --> 00:21:12,000

And later on, several people I knew, including a man in a life magazine and others who went out there,

273

00:21:12,000 --> 00:21:14,000

said, I don't know, I'd maybe something to it.

274

00:21:14,000 --> 00:21:20,000

Well, that is one of the cases that was given to the Colorado University study.

275

00:21:20,000 --> 00:21:27,000

Now, for those of you who don't know, the Air Force paid \$523,000 to the University of Colorado for...

276

00:21:27,000 --> 00:21:28,000

\$550,000.

277

00:21:28,000 --> 00:21:30,000

Well, they jumped it up.

278

00:21:30,000 --> 00:21:35,000

Well, maybe they got that without being on the record because they copied the contract I got.

279

00:21:35,000 --> 00:21:37,000

Let's not argue about a mere \$5,000.

280

00:21:37,000 --> 00:21:38,000

Okay.

281

00:21:38,000 --> 00:21:41,000

Well, anyway, this was...

282

00:21:41,000 --> 00:21:46,000

This thing came in, and there's a scientist there who is an expert photographer.

283

00:21:46,000 --> 00:21:51,000

He went up there and spent about two weeks or more, and checking at all the angles.

284

00:21:51,000 --> 00:21:56,000

And you read this report, it's about nine pages in the convent document.

285

00:21:56,000 --> 00:22:00,000

And he ends up and said, for all intents and purposes, they saw exactly what they said.

286

He said, everything measures.

287

00:22:02,000 --> 00:22:06,000

He said, the photograph of the Mexican analysis and all that was perfect.

288

00:22:06,000 --> 00:22:08,000

So that's what it was in.

289

00:22:08,000 --> 00:22:13,000

Now, Condon rushed that thing through because it was Nixon's coming up, and they thought he was going to be elected.

290

00:22:13,000 --> 00:22:20,000

And he and Nixon were like that ever since that fight over his being a full communist.

291

So they hurried the thing through so that in case he was elected, that he wouldn't be coming in stopping it.

292

Well, I don't wish to participate in it.

Well, I'm sorry.

297

The fact that he's dead, Hitler's dead too, but I couldn't detest him less.

298

So I'm going to go this way on this photograph in the first two sections, which are all that Condon wrote.

299

00:22:42,000 --> 00:22:44,000

I've been told by people who are on the project.

300

00:22:44,000 --> 00:22:50,000

It says in there that this picture is bought forward, but it was too fuzzy and begged for photogrammetric analysis.

301

00:22:50,000 --> 00:22:54,000

And here's his own specialist out there telling exactly what he does.

302

00:22:54,000 --> 00:22:55,000

It was Pacific and Sean.

303

00:22:55,000 --> 00:22:56,000

I think we'll get off the picture.

304

00:22:56,000 --> 00:23:00,000

I've also seen pictures of the Sasquatches and sea serpents.

305

00:23:00,000 --> 00:23:08,000

And what you're seeing, Major Keough, is that there are, my right, there's only one picture available that anybody agrees on.

306

00:23:08,000 --> 00:23:11,000

No, there's one other, but it's kind of vague.

307

00:23:11,000 --> 00:23:12,000

And that's a gun camera.

308

00:23:12,000 --> 00:23:13,000

And therefore it's a gun camera.

309

00:23:13,000 --> 00:23:18,000

But you clearly don't face your belief in this on photographs.

310

00:23:18,000 --> 00:23:22,000

No, no, no, no, no, only on evidence by reliable people.

311

00:23:22,000 --> 00:23:23,000

It was double checked.

312

00:23:23,000 --> 00:23:26,000

And there's usually some physical proof.

313

00:23:26,000 --> 00:23:29,000

Let me say a word just about evidence.

314

00:23:29,000 --> 00:23:42,000

Any good prosecuting attorney will tell you that the best evidence in the world is circumstantial evidence, provided that the chain of evidence is unbroken.

315

00:23:42,000 --> 00:23:52,000

And throughout all of your reports, Mr. Keough, I find circumstantial evidence and big, wide gaps in it.

316

00:23:52,000 --> 00:23:53,000

You have no evidence.

317

00:23:53,000 --> 00:23:56,000

The Congress asked you to submit your evidence.

318

00:23:56,000 --> 00:23:58,000

You have nothing to submit.

319

00:23:58,000 --> 00:24:02,000

So it has to be done on the basis of faith.

320

00:24:02,000 --> 00:24:03,000

I sent that to the McCormick.

321

00:24:03,000 --> 00:24:08,000

He was there and he looked at it and he said that he thought that it was very serious and strong.

322

00:24:08,000 --> 00:24:12,000

And he passed it on and got the special project started.

323

00:24:12,000 --> 00:24:18,000

But then the top man in that committee died and it killed it all.

324

00:24:18,000 --> 00:24:22,000

We did something.

325

00:24:22,000 --> 00:24:27,000

Now, people are always passing away just like you and I will someday.

326

00:24:27,000 --> 00:24:28,000

I want to bring up something.

327

00:24:28,000 --> 00:24:29,000

You said circumstantial evidence.

328

00:24:29,000 --> 00:24:31,000

I will tell you this.

329

00:24:31,000 --> 00:24:37,000

There have been more people convicted of murder except lately when nobody gets convicted of anything.

330

00:24:37,000 --> 00:24:42,000

Because of evidence, that wasn't as strong as some of these UFO cases.

331

00:24:42,000 --> 00:24:44,000

Now, I'll ask you about this one.

332

00:24:44,000 --> 00:24:47,000

Colonel Donald J. M. Blake Slay.

333

00:24:47,000 --> 00:24:50,000

He was the number one Air Corps Agent World War II.

334

00:24:50,000 --> 00:24:52,000

He was also a wing commander.

335

00:24:52,000 --> 00:24:58,000

He was over in Japan and he was making a routine flight and he got a call from the ground radar.

336

00:24:58,000 --> 00:25:04,000

And they said two, the pilots of two other Air Force planes had radioed in and said there was strange object.

337

00:25:04,000 --> 00:25:11,000

So he climbed up, came on through the clouds and here was this thing which had rotating beams of light.

338

00:25:11,000 --> 00:25:14,000

And so he tried to go near it and it pulled away.

339

00:25:14,000 --> 00:25:20,000

And he started down again and they called him and said it was back.

340

00:25:20,000 --> 00:25:25,000

And when he went through that time, he caught off his lights and closed down full power.

341

00:25:25,000 --> 00:25:28,000

And the thing disappeared in about three seconds.

342

00:25:28,000 --> 00:25:34,000

Now this was an official Air Force report that was declassified out of the right path sent by Rupel.

343

00:25:34,000 --> 00:25:41,000

It was declassified again in Air Force intelligence and I was given a detailed report of the whole thing.

344

00:25:41,000 --> 00:25:42,000

Are you familiar with this Colonel Cohen?

345

00:25:42,000 --> 00:25:43,000

Just vaguely.

346

00:25:43,000 --> 00:25:47,000

My only comment here that you mentioned pilots.

347

00:25:47,000 --> 00:25:51,000

Incidentally you credited me with 15 combat missions. I had 155.

348

00:25:51,000 --> 00:25:52,000

I'm sorry, yes.

349

00:25:52,000 --> 00:25:54,000

I've seen many strange things.

350

00:25:54,000 --> 00:26:02,000

I wouldn't want them to change my records.

351

00:26:02,000 --> 00:26:07,000

And I wouldn't want them to have to go back and make all those up.

352

00:26:07,000 --> 00:26:13,000

Pilots are not experts on astronomical or meteorological phenomena.

353

00:26:13,000 --> 00:26:15,000

I don't care how qualified they are.

354

00:26:15,000 --> 00:26:19,000

I've got 30-some odd college credit hours and meteorology.

355

00:26:19,000 --> 00:26:22,000

I am not an expert on meteorological phenomena.

356

00:26:22,000 --> 00:26:24,000

I know a lot about it.

357

00:26:24,000 --> 00:26:27,000

But I haven't seen everything yet.

358

00:26:27,000 --> 00:26:28,000

Same way with astronomy.

359

00:26:28,000 --> 00:26:30,000

I've been an amateur astronomer.

360

00:26:30,000 --> 00:26:34,000

I've been looking through the glass ever since I was a small child.

361

00:26:34,000 --> 00:26:37,000

And yet I have not seen all there is to see.

362

00:26:37,000 --> 00:26:39,000

This was the astronomical world.

363

00:26:39,000 --> 00:26:43,000

There's one question I think we've got here before we go to our audience, Colonel Cohen.

364

00:26:43,000 --> 00:26:48,000

Major Keough specifically accused the U.S. Air Force of a cover-up,

365

00:26:48,000 --> 00:26:52,000

which if it were revealed would be a greater cover-up than a Watergate cover-up,

366

00:26:52,000 --> 00:26:54,000

a cover-up of enormous proportions.

367

00:26:54,000 --> 00:26:55,000

And I think...

368

00:26:55,000 --> 00:26:57,000

Well, I'd like to hear much more about it.

369

00:26:57,000 --> 00:26:59,000

I give him names and evidence there if you want it.

370

00:26:59,000 --> 00:27:01,000

I mean Air Force people have said it.

371

00:27:01,000 --> 00:27:03,000

We would appreciate the evidence.

372

00:27:03,000 --> 00:27:07,000

We've been asking you for it for years, but all we get is the sighting reports.

373

00:27:07,000 --> 00:27:09,000

We want evidence that we can get.

374

00:27:09,000 --> 00:27:11,000

Let me answer the question.

375

00:27:11,000 --> 00:27:12,000

Let me answer the cover-up.

376

00:27:12,000 --> 00:27:13,000

All right.

377

00:27:13,000 --> 00:27:15,000

There is no cover-up.

378

00:27:15,000 --> 00:27:17,000

All of the material is declassified.

379

00:27:17,000 --> 00:27:23,000

It's open to any serious researcher or reporter that cares to go to the Air Force Archives.

380

00:27:23,000 --> 00:27:28,000

We've been isolated blue-boned so that we have ready access to it,

381

00:27:28,000 --> 00:27:31,000

even though it's located in a Class B vault.

382

00:27:31,000 --> 00:27:33,000

Now, the vault has to be a building.

383

00:27:33,000 --> 00:27:35,000

We have to house it somewhere.

384

00:27:35,000 --> 00:27:40,000

But the serious researcher can go in there and spend months reading all the reports

385

00:27:40,000 --> 00:27:42,000

and let him make his own conclusions.

386

00:27:42,000 --> 00:27:47,000

I was the guy that opened up blue-boned files to reporters, invited them down there.

387

00:27:47,000 --> 00:27:52,000

I even extended the invitation to you to go out to blue-book and help yourself.

388

00:27:52,000 --> 00:27:54,000

There is nothing to testify.

389

00:27:54,000 --> 00:27:57,000

Now, they said I couldn't go.

390

00:27:57,000 --> 00:27:58,000

That's not true.

391

00:27:58,000 --> 00:28:00,000

If you're assistant to the Secretary, I've got his letter.

392

00:28:00,000 --> 00:28:05,000

I spoke to the Secretary because I was the security review authority for the Air Force.

393

00:28:05,000 --> 00:28:06,000

I'll show you that.

394

00:28:06,000 --> 00:28:08,000

And I had the authority to grant you in.

395

00:28:08,000 --> 00:28:09,000

I would not grant you in.

396

00:28:09,000 --> 00:28:11,000

It didn't get to you.

397

00:28:11,000 --> 00:28:13,000

You've never been in there?

398

00:28:13,000 --> 00:28:16,000

I haven't been on a right path in the UFOs.

399

00:28:16,000 --> 00:28:17,000

He says you can go in.

400

00:28:17,000 --> 00:28:18,000

There's one thing that's...

401

00:28:18,000 --> 00:28:19,000

Go stand with Max.

402

00:28:19,000 --> 00:28:23,000

Mr. Barton, there's one thing that he did not answer.

403

00:28:23,000 --> 00:28:24,000

I'd like to finish that.

404

00:28:24,000 --> 00:28:26,000

I do want to finish one at a point.

405

00:28:26,000 --> 00:28:28,000

I'd like to finish this to break, please.

406

00:28:28,000 --> 00:28:29,000

Let me finish this.

407

00:28:29,000 --> 00:28:30,000

You didn't finish the whole thing.

408

00:28:30,000 --> 00:28:33,000

I wanted to tell you what we do cover up.

409

00:28:33,000 --> 00:28:35,000

We've just got one minute and then we're going to go to our audience.

410

00:28:35,000 --> 00:28:36,000

One minute for you.

411

00:28:36,000 --> 00:28:37,000

You're making a finish in seven.

412

00:28:37,000 --> 00:28:38,000

I'm going to give you...

413

00:28:38,000 --> 00:28:39,000

I've got a man.

414

00:28:39,000 --> 00:28:41,000

This will take less than that.

415

00:28:41,000 --> 00:28:42,000

Good.

416

00:28:42,000 --> 00:28:45,000

Now, we've developed certain aircraft which we had to keep under cover.

417

00:28:45,000 --> 00:28:47,000

Now, I'll give you a very recent example.

418

The A11 SR-71 that our corp has developed totally in secrecy.

419

00:28:51,000 --> 00:28:54,000

Yes, it flew and it was spotted by people.

420

00:28:54,000 --> 00:28:57,000

We knew who they were that saw it because they reported it.

421

00:28:57,000 --> 00:29:00,000

We immediately debriefed them and had them sign a little paper.

422

00:29:00,000 --> 00:29:01,000

Saying it's not a point, sir.

423

00:29:01,000 --> 00:29:04,000

And that was for a good reason because we jumped out technologically wise.

424

00:29:04,000 --> 00:29:06,000

They go ahead and sell it.

425

00:29:06,000 --> 00:29:07,000

All right, you get your 10 seconds.

426

00:29:07,000 --> 00:29:08,000

All right.

427

00:29:08,000 --> 00:29:09,000

Or even a minute.

428

00:29:09,000 --> 00:29:10,000

You're going to be fair.

429

00:29:10,000 --> 00:29:15,000

You innovated that Commander Colonel Bletchley, who had all that backing, was the number one

430

00:29:15,000 --> 00:29:17,000

World War II ace was not competent.

431

00:29:17,000 --> 00:29:23,000

The official answer to his sighting when I made it public was that he was looking at the

432

00:29:23,000 --> 00:29:24,000

planet Jupiter.

433

00:29:24,000 --> 00:29:29,000

Now, that night the planet Jupiter, and I checked this with the government, was 366 million

434

00:29:29,000 --> 00:29:30,000

miles from the Earth.

435

00:29:30,000 --> 00:29:35,000

The radar that was reporting this object had a range of less than 500 miles.

436

00:29:35,000 --> 00:29:40,000

Bletchley, this top ace, a great man, and terrific, was really cool.

437

00:29:40,000 --> 00:29:44,000

And he got so annoyed at it, that he said some things about the people in the Air Force

438

00:29:44,000 --> 00:29:45,000

that I don't think you care to hear.

439

00:29:45,000 --> 00:29:47,000

I don't think you were talking about you, because you weren't up there.

440

00:29:47,000 --> 00:29:49,000

We will not repeat them in this program.

441

00:29:49,000 --> 00:29:54,000

I'm trying, trying to get our audience into the show because there's a lot of people out

442

00:29:54,000 --> 00:29:55,000

there who want to ask questions.

443

00:29:55,000 --> 00:29:57,000

And we're going to give them a chance to do that in a moment.

444

00:29:57,000 --> 00:29:59,000

We'll take a break and then be back with the great debates.

445

00:29:59,000 --> 00:30:01,000

Okay, gentlemen down in the corner here.

446

00:30:01,000 --> 00:30:02,000

Would you stand up, sir, yes?

447

00:30:02,000 --> 00:30:03,000

Yes.

448

00:30:03,000 --> 00:30:13,000

The main thing that people said they saw crashed, has there ever been an object left over that

449

00:30:13,000 --> 00:30:17,000

anybody has to see or to study?

450

00:30:17,000 --> 00:30:25,000

Well, there was something at Crownsville, Maryland in 1957, which was supposed to fall

451

00:30:25,000 --> 00:30:30,000

into the state hospital grounds after an object was seen to explode nearby.

452

00:30:30,000 --> 00:30:36,000

Army intelligence came in and cleared off the area and they got this object and put

453

00:30:36,000 --> 00:30:41,000

it into a sometimes kind of container and kept taking Geiger counter checks on it.

454

00:30:41,000 --> 00:30:45,000

And this was sent out to right-past Air Force Base.

455

00:30:45,000 --> 00:30:48,000

First they denied the head, then they said that when they opened the container the thing

456

00:30:48,000 --> 00:30:49,000

had to be wrapped with.

457

00:30:49,000 --> 00:30:50,000

It was not even just that.

458

00:30:50,000 --> 00:30:54,000

That was, in one case it was proof that it had been something, but it didn't turn out to be

459

00:30:54,000 --> 00:30:55,000

any help.

460

00:30:55,000 --> 00:31:01,000

Then there's a story about the crashed UFOs way down in the southwest and the small

461

00:31:01,000 --> 00:31:02,000

beings that were deep frozen.

462

00:31:02,000 --> 00:31:04,000

If I was actually concerned you can write that off.

463

00:31:04,000 --> 00:31:08,000

I investigated that for two magazine years and years ago.

464

00:31:08,000 --> 00:31:12,000

The two men who were putting it out were really trying to make some dough.

465

00:31:12,000 --> 00:31:16,000

There may have been something, some such thing happened, but I never found any evidence of

466

00:31:16,000 --> 00:31:17,000

it.

467

00:31:17,000 --> 00:31:18,000

Hey, Colin, Colonel Colman, to the first part.

468

00:31:18,000 --> 00:31:24,000

The other thing I knew in Maryland, and that we got the evidence, was a Nike that had been

469

00:31:24,000 --> 00:31:25,000

launched from a local site.

470

00:31:25,000 --> 00:31:31,000

And I can understand perhaps the United States Army wanted to keep that one quiet because

471

00:31:31,000 --> 00:31:37,000

they started launching rockets near the city of Washington, D.C. and you can get people

472

00:31:37,000 --> 00:31:38,000

excited.

473

00:31:38,000 --> 00:31:44,000

That wasn't any Nike besides the cheap intelligence out there of the civilian.

474

00:31:44,000 --> 00:31:47,000

And we really knew him or not.

475

00:31:47,000 --> 00:31:51,000

Anyway, he told me and he would check into it and he did and he called back and said,

476

00:31:51,000 --> 00:31:53,000

yes, it was here, but it was back there.

477

00:31:53,000 --> 00:31:55,000

The gentleman behind you, you'd stand up.

478

00:31:55,000 --> 00:32:00,000

Major Kehoe, it only took NASA, I believe, three flights to land on the moon.

479

00:32:00,000 --> 00:32:05,000

I was wondering with all these hundreds of flights of UFOs why they haven't landed and

480

00:32:05,000 --> 00:32:09,000

started playing golf here or something along those lines.

481

00:32:09,000 --> 00:32:15,000

Because of my honorable opponent's objection to facts and evidence here, I'm going to say

482

00:32:15,000 --> 00:32:17,000

merely that this was a report.

483

00:32:17,000 --> 00:32:23,000

There was a report that once landed out in Ohio and left a sports circle on the ground.

484

00:32:23,000 --> 00:32:28,000

Over in Australia, a senior pilot on the airline and some people, other people said the same

485

00:32:28,000 --> 00:32:33,000

thing and there had been dozens and dozens of those reports.

486

00:32:33,000 --> 00:32:37,000

I know that there are cases that go through to the airport and through to the outlet so

487

00:32:37,000 --> 00:32:39,000

they had no answer for it.

488

00:32:39,000 --> 00:32:44,000

Well, apparently one of these things touched down or was about to touch down and death came

489

00:32:44,000 --> 00:32:45,000

in.

490

00:32:45,000 --> 00:32:48,000

There were a lot of people coming in scrambles or anything like that.

491

00:32:48,000 --> 00:32:50,000

And they got off.

492

00:32:50,000 --> 00:32:56,000

But there was only one that you might consider seriously down in Argentina.

493

00:32:56,000 --> 00:33:01,000

A UFO was reported to have landed near a ranch house.
