A tuna fishing appeared right over my port pole.

7

It was just like a tripod, you know, that you had a telescope on it.

8

00:00:27,000 --> 00:00:28,000

Yes.

9

00:00:28,000 --> 00:00:35,000

And from being around airplanes and stuff like that, I would say that the thickness of

10

it at the forward end would be about 20 feet and it was about three times that long.

11

00:00:40,000 --> 00:00:41,000

I see.

12

00:00:41,000 --> 00:00:47,000

And there was no wings or tail or wheels or nothing else on it.

13

It was just, oh, a lot of guys say they look like a saucer but they really don't.

14

And I think that was a leading end to them.

15

00:00:59,000 --> 00:01:03,000

Would this in any way resemble a cigar?

16

No, no, no.

17

00:01:05,000 --> 00:01:07,000

It was cylindrical in shape.

18

00:01:07,000 --> 00:01:08,000

I see.

19

00:01:08,000 --> 00:01:10,000

It was thicker on the forward end.

20

00:01:10,000 --> 00:01:13,000

And that's the end that it took off from.

21

00:01:13,000 --> 00:01:15,000

Like that would be the end that they were running it from.

22

00:01:15,000 --> 00:01:17,000

I see.

23

00:01:17,000 --> 00:01:22,000

It wasn't truly a saucer as you would think of a saucer.

24

00:01:22,000 --> 00:01:23,000

Yes.

25

00:01:23,000 --> 00:01:33,000

It looked, well, kind of, if you laid a long raindrop on its side, you know.

26

00:01:33,000 --> 00:01:35,000

Oh, you're talking about an oval shape then.

27

00:01:35,000 --> 00:01:46,000

Well, it would be oval but it was longer than it was high and it had a kind of a, the direction

28

that it took off to that end of the body or object was thicker than the other part.

29

00:01:54,000 --> 00:01:55,000

I see.

30

00:01:55,000 --> 00:01:57,000

That would be the bow of it then.

31

That would be the bow of it.

32

00:01:58,000 --> 00:01:59,000

Right.

33

00:01:59,000 --> 00:02:00,000

Right.

34

00:02:00,000 --> 00:02:07,000

We watched it stay motionless for a good three or four minutes before it took off.

35

And another boat that was coming out that morning too, they observed it too.

36

And there was, it was a charter boat and about half of the crew, there was about ten people

37

on the boat that saw it at the same time.

38

00:02:24,000 --> 00:02:25,000

I see.

39

00:02:25,000 --> 00:02:30,000

And I asked the next day, I called him because I knew he was out and I asked him if he was

40

looking in the west about that time of the morning and he said, yeah, I'm not nuts.

41

00:02:35,000 --> 00:02:38,000

He says, I know what you're talking about.

42

00:02:38,000 --> 00:02:42,000

So we went ahead and discussed it for a minute or two on the air there and I asked him when

43

he told me how many people had seen it.

You know, they watched it and it just took off and it shot.

And then another tuna boat came back on the air and said that he had observed it too.

And he was about ten miles below us.

I see.

48

I talked when I came in, I was out for three days and when I came in, a couple other tuna

boats, kippers came and talked to me and they said that they had observed it.

50

And from all the plodding that I could take in Loran bearings, we had people looking at

51

it from about a ten-mile semi-circle.

52

00:03:21,000 --> 00:03:22,000

I see.

53

00:03:22,000 --> 00:03:27,000

And nobody could see any tails or had their wings or anything on it.

54

No protrusions at all.

55

00:03:29,000 --> 00:03:30,000

No protrusions at all.

56

00:03:30,000 --> 00:03:36,000

No, it was just an oval shaped longer than it was tall.

57

Yes.

58

00:03:37,000 --> 00:03:39,000

How about the color?

59

It was just a silver color.

60

00:03:41,000 --> 00:03:46,000

No, it didn't have any flashing lights or anything like that on it.

61

You hear these guys say flashing lights and all that.

62

No.

It just looked like it took the body of a big plane and pulled all the wings up and off,

you know, and it snubbed her down a little bit on the tail surfaces and shortened her up.

Now when this took off, did it take off in a horizontal flight to the path?

66

Or did it move upward?

67

It moved off a little bit to horizontal and then it just shot right straight up in the air.

Perfect vertical climb?

Okay.

But how long would you say it took to leave your site?

72

And to throw a tuna fish in with a short line takes about, oh, not more than a minute.

It just disappeared.

Now Frank, he watched it the full time and he watched its full takeoff.

And he said that that thing just shoop and was gone.

He said it didn't leave any vapor current around.

And I just saw it start to go when I turned it on and grabbed the line and threw a tuna board.

Do you have any estimate of how far away it was from you?

80

Well, I would say it was not more than, oh, look at the angle.

81

I'd say it was an elevation of around 2,000 feet.

82

And it wasn't any more than two miles from us.

83

I see.

And that was in the western sky.

85

Okay.

Now when you first spotted this, did you just have to look up into the sky?

87

Did this thing appear to just suddenly appear to you?

88

Oh, I just looked up across the pole to see if anything was bouncing on there.

89

It was sitting right above the poles.

90

Now I talked to one of these tuna skippers told me that last year they were out there.

91

And I was really insane about it.

92

There were three of them up here.

93

And while they were there, they had no radio communication.

94

I see.

And it was about the same time last year, there were three of them.

96

And everybody out there thought their dang radio was one.

97

Hey, why are you no one was Custon's North and pretty soon everybody's radio started working when they come off.

98

Well, this is very common.

99

And I noticed that in, I got this questionnaire from the other center to answer.

100

And I noticed in there that they had the electrical interference.

Right.

127

Well, Paul, do you work that area a year around?

128

Oh, no.

129

00:07:05,000 --> 00:07:08,000

No, I'm just out there in the fall to an efficient summer and fall situation.

130

I see.

131

00:07:09,000 --> 00:07:10,000

Uh-huh.

132

00:07:10,000 --> 00:07:13,000

If we send you a questionnaire, will you fill ours in also?

133

Sure, we have to.

And we'd appreciate to the names of as many witnesses or the other skippers that we could get also.

Okay.

My wife said she gave you a walk address.

137

Yes.

And I'm going to have to scratch my head and see if I can remember which boats was which now that came in and talked to me about it.

But you know the funny part of it is nobody will say anything about the dancing.

146

And somebody does say it, well, then they'll all come forward.

That's right.

It just takes one to trigger the whole thing.

176

Well, we sure appreciate you're giving us your time and describing this and just how you saw this object.

Uh-huh.

Sure.

It's good that you testimony of as many witnesses as possible on this particular incident.

199

No, this is fine.

200

It's very sketchy.

201

00:10:30,000 --> 00:10:37,000

I can tell you what I observed and, you know, I don't have any strong feelings one way or the other.

202

I feel it's possible.

203

00:10:40,000 --> 00:10:42,000

Understand it?

204

00:10:42,000 --> 00:10:48,000

So, and like I say, it was probably about around 80s in the morning, I believe.

205

I don't know if it was a problem for you, but that's my recollection.

206

And now what do you need to know?

207

What we want to know is just, we want to get a complete description of how you saw the object and also important here is we're trying to find out how many people actually saw the object leave.

208

Well, this is something that none of us on Paul's boat saw and I'm sure it's been explained to you by both Paul and my brother Walt, other brother.

209

He was in the cabin.

210

He didn't say that.

211

00:11:23,000 --> 00:11:24,000

Uh-huh.

212

00:11:24,000 --> 00:11:29,000

Paul brought this to my attention.

213

00:11:29,000 --> 00:11:37,000

We were just mowing around, trolling, you know, and he looked up, or he says, what's that up there?

214

00:11:37,000 --> 00:11:39,000

And I said, oh, I don't know.

215

00:11:39,000 --> 00:11:43,000

And, but whatever it was, was dead still.

216

00:11:43,000 --> 00:11:47,000

And this is a clear blue sky blue at night.

217

00:11:47,000 --> 00:11:50,000

Because it was a beautiful day.

218

00:11:50,000 --> 00:11:53,000

And it was bright in the parents.

219

00:11:53,000 --> 00:11:54,000

And he didn't move.

220

00:11:54,000 --> 00:11:55,000

Yes.

221

00:11:55,000 --> 00:11:58,000

And he doesn't sure that was his plane.

222

00:11:58,000 --> 00:12:00,000

And that's his idea.

223

00:12:00,000 --> 00:12:07,000

And I suppose, and I'm guessing here again too, we might have looked at it for a minute, minute and a half, two minutes.

224

And my brother Walt come over and he might have been looking at it for about 30 seconds.

225

00:12:14,000 --> 00:12:18,000

And at that time, we got a fish on.

226

00:12:18,000 --> 00:12:19,000

I see.

227

So everybody diverted their attention to this.

228

And there again, I would say the last time, but probably the two minutes at the most.

229

I don't give a two in the fish, you know?

230

No, I haven't.

But anyway, hand line the man.

232

And you figured it was in, you observed it from one to two minutes at least.

Your mind has done other things and it's something that, you know, you're not even thinking about.

And you don't really realize or you're not functioning properly as far as observing.

But the thing that got me when we turned around was gone.

286

And you're talking about a clear day and no obstruction whatsoever as far as haze or fog or anything.

I think Paul made the comment, there's no way in hell, a plane or anything else, to get out of sight, out of sight that quick.

Yes.
