sells it to us. It's a whole milk. And this is a, you know, we get our cream and our butter

out there. And we drove out there and there was a great killer traffic going out there

6

that night, last night. Could you hold for a moment please?

7

Sure thing. Thank you for holding.

Would you like me to tell you what happened?

9

00:00:40,000 --> 00:00:41,000

Yes, please.

10

00:00:41,000 --> 00:00:42,000

It's about the only way I can describe it.

11

Yes.

12

00:00:43,000 --> 00:00:50,000

Okay, and we were, we had, it's, it got off the main road and it's quite dark out there.

13

I mean, it's super dark because there aren't any major street lights, not even every

14

day, so you know, it's a great thing. So we drive into the farm area, we pick up our

15

milk, we drive back out. Now I know there were exactly two cars that were, we weren't

16

even in the main road. I'm just trying to eliminate any possibility to put any doubt in anybody's

Yes.

19

00:01:12,000 --> 00:01:17,000

There were two cars that I had passed. Again, they were still on the county roads. We were

20

not on the main road, which would be division, but it's a highway before it comes into town.

21

00:01:21,000 --> 00:01:22,000

Okay.

22

00:01:22,000 --> 00:01:29,000

I'm going along here, still on the main, the country roads, swing on in total darkness.

23

I mean, I am the only one driving at that area, nothing. I am driving along, my neighbor

24

and I are talking and I have this habit of looking into my mirror, you know, as I am,

I'm driving.

26

00:01:43,000 --> 00:01:44,000

Yes.

27

00:01:44,000 --> 00:01:51,000

He was going on behind me and I tell you, all of a sudden there was one light. Okay, caught

28

an eye. So I'm still talking, but it was, I thought, my goodness, there must, first

29

00:01:56,000 --> 00:02:02,000

I thought, this car has only one headlight, you see. And because, and then I started trying

30

to look into it as well as keeping my eye on the road. I thought it must be a motorcycle,

31

00:02:08,000 --> 00:02:10,000

you know, because it was just the one light.

32

00:02:10,000 --> 00:02:11,000

Yes.

33

00:02:11,000 --> 00:02:16,000

I couldn't totally concentrate on it because I had to watch the road. The road didn't,

34

you know, it was, we had to watch it anyway. So if I thought to myself, after my friend,

35

my neighbor, I said, after, would you turn around and take a look at what is following

36

us? I swear to God, I cannot tell you. And she says, well, I said, I said, is it a car

37

with one headlight? And she says, well, Rose, it could be, but I'm concentrating on driving,

trying to look in there. And she's totally turned around. And she says, Rose, Rose, excited,

believe me. She says, that thing, it's not a car, it's nothing. It is something, you know,

40

and it is hovering over the road behind us. It was as far as from our car. And if you're

41

standing at one end of the block and looking down, you know, that I can't, I'm not very

42

good at distancing. About 300 feet. Right. The light was, it was about 15 feet. I could

43

tell you if I were to stand and show you, but I'm at 15 feet above the street. It was

44

one super bright, luminous, white, I have to say white. It was not a light tone that

45

00:03:30,000 --> 00:03:37,000

was like car light, you know, an obvious glare or anything. More of a full moon shape.

46

From where we couldn't actually even look at into it. It was so bright. And I, she says,

47

00:03:45,000 --> 00:03:51,000

Rose, Rose, that thing, and it was kind of hovering over the street and it was truly no way under

48

the, under, could a car be coming out of either side of the road because it was field. There

49

00:03:56,000 --> 00:04:02,000

was not an attack, you know, a road that could be coming. That thing came, it was there all

50

00:04:02,000 --> 00:04:08,000

of a sudden. Okay, I was slowing down. I slowed down, you know, because I couldn't concentrate.

51

And it kept, it's, if the way I had slowed down, if it had been a car, whatever, it would

52

have caught up with me. But it stayed this distance, but it would hover and it would

53

go like to the left and then it would kind of come back, you know, I mean, I don't mean

54

00:04:25,000 --> 00:04:30,000

to exaggerate it, but it was not staying on the road like a car, for example. I say,

55

my God, he's moving clear into the field off the road. You see what I'm saying? I may be

56

00:04:36,000 --> 00:04:41,000

bad in describing it, but it was definitely not a car, definitely not a truck, definitely

57

nothing I have ever seen before. Okay, we are driving along and my friends are, Rose,

58

Rose, this thing is moving up and down. And I got it, it literally, well, first of all,

I was driving along, I would be coming around a little bend, not a major bend, but you could

60

second. And by golly there it was again. You see what I mean? And this is what's finally

63

made me say to my friends, would you turn around and look? And we both, obviously, I

64

would say, we both, we'll put it down in writing that we feel it's an unidentified flying object.

It's a staff, all of a sudden we were coming closer to town. It's like this thing was really

66

on our tail. You know, very obvious. And we were coming into town and as Rose, Rose,

67

I couldn't turn around, but I was observing this in the mirror. She says, this thing has

68

taken off and it literally moved as quickly as you would raise your own arm, you know,

69

upward, that fast. Straight up. Straight up. Well, no, not straight up, because see, we're

70

on the county, I mean the highway, which is going to Division Street, and there's field

71

and it kind of went off, I could show you with my hand as a gesture, you know, that would be semi-up,

72

you know, kind of off to the side. Now you were driving north at the time, right?

73

No, we were driving south. South, okay. And then this thing would be following you coming

74

from the north. Yes, right. It's truly, sir, I wouldn't be quiet, you know, attached on.

75

Could you just one second, I have to tell my solo and powerful friend. Okay.

76

I'm going to be right back on the phone. Excuse me. Okay, then there, when I, before I attached

77

off the county road to the main road, which was still in a very, I would say at night,

78

00:06:43,000 --> 00:06:48,000

it looks pretty isolated, believe me, and it was only 6.30 in the evening. And, you know,

79

00:06:48,000 --> 00:06:51,000

when we got out there, but the sighting, and I remember I said to my friend, I said,

80

check your time, what time is it? And it was about 7.25, you know, that we saw.

81

Yes, okay. What was the name of this road that you were driving on when you saw it?

82

Well, now that, it would be Division Street here in town, but it would, I'm sure it's called

83

a highway something before it actually turns into Division. And I can't tell you that.

84

Okay, we can check that. We were coming off Monroe Road.

85

00:07:18,000 --> 00:07:23,000

I see. This is the county road. You know, there's a farm. And the only light, a lot of times,

86

00:07:23,000 --> 00:07:30,000

is just where the farm is on their property. And it's a trees and fields and very, very, very dark.

87

00:07:30,000 --> 00:07:36,000

So I'm just, I'm stressing this because as I'm, as I'm getting off the county road,

88

00:07:36,000 --> 00:07:41,000

looking down to my left before I turn it right onto the main road, you might say.

89

00:07:41,000 --> 00:07:48,000

Total darkness, no kind sight. And I, you can, you can obviously tell if something is coming,

90

00:07:48,000 --> 00:07:51,000

you know, with a beam, I mean, or something.

91

00:07:51,000 --> 00:07:55,000

Okay, do you have any idea just how big this object was?

92

00:07:55,000 --> 00:07:59,000

Oh gosh, that's a good question. Yes, in my mind, I can still visualize it.

93

00:07:59,000 --> 00:08:02,000

I shouldn't sleep at work last night.

94

00:08:02,000 --> 00:08:08,000

It was, well, as I'm looking down the road, it would totally fill up, let's say,

95

00:08:08,000 --> 00:08:10,000

from one side to the other side of the road.

96

00:08:10,000 --> 00:08:12,000

Before it went to the road, right?

97

00:08:12,000 --> 00:08:20,000

It was that. It was that, in my eyes, it was that bright. And the brightness of it filled up the whole road.

98

00:08:20,000 --> 00:08:23,000

Okay, would the color, did it remain the same all the time?

99

00:08:23,000 --> 00:08:29,000

Yes, it remained the same. It was so bright that after this got, you know, she would turn away.

100

00:08:29,000 --> 00:08:38,000

And it was not a yellow, it was not a red, it was not a blue, it was, I would, you can call it a white light,

101

00:08:38,000 --> 00:08:44,000

but it had a silver, it was so bright, it was almost silver, it was very luminous.

102

00:08:44,000 --> 00:08:47,000

Did it by any chance light up the area around it?

103

00:08:47,000 --> 00:08:55,000

Well, that's the weird thing about it. As I'm looking back, the area that, there was not a sound.

104

00:08:55,000 --> 00:09:01,000

This is what really spooked us, because there was no warning or approaching of anything behind me,

105

00:09:01,000 --> 00:09:03,000

and I mean nothing, it was there.

106

00:09:03,000 --> 00:09:04,000

Uh-huh.

107

00:09:04,000 --> 00:09:11,000

And it lit up, yes, this is what I'm saying, when they lit it, lighting up, I would not say into the field or anything,

108

00:09:11,000 --> 00:09:13,000

but very definitely the entire road.

109

00:09:13,000 --> 00:09:14,000

Yes.

110

00:09:14,000 --> 00:09:16,000

It consumed the whole area it was on.

111

00:09:16,000 --> 00:09:17,000

Okay.

112

00:09:19,000 --> 00:09:23,000

And it maintained the same distance between you at all times?

113

00:09:23,000 --> 00:09:29,000

Yes, it did, however, the thing that finally attracted me, you know, where I really got a little bit,

114

00:09:29,000 --> 00:09:36,000

when I told my friends, well, you turn around, and this is, I'm telling you exactly, see who is following us,

115

00:09:36,000 --> 00:09:42,000

you know, like on the country road to women, you know, I mean, we were married, I mean, a family, but still, we were not stupid, you know.

116

00:09:42,000 --> 00:09:47,000

And so I said, after, that guy's getting closer, I called him a guy.

117

00:09:47,000 --> 00:09:49,000

You know what I mean?

118

00:09:49,000 --> 00:09:50,000

Yes.

00:09:50,000 --> 00:09:52,000

And he said, no, just an obvious thing.

120

00:09:52,000 --> 00:09:56,000

And when we said, no, that thing, what is that thing?

121

00:09:56,000 --> 00:10:06,000

Not, it was not a human car, driving in a car, a truck, motorcycle, I will rule that out, I will, you know, move me.

122

00:10:06,000 --> 00:10:08,000

Well, would you appreciate your calling?

123

00:10:08,000 --> 00:10:14,000

Well, I just had to get it off my chest, because it really, really was, where she was over last night,

124

00:10:14,000 --> 00:10:16,000

and you can talk about it and talk about it.

125

00:10:16,000 --> 00:10:19,000

And, you know, it's kind of an eerie experience, frankly.

126

00:10:19,000 --> 00:10:22,000

Did you ever think of stopping the car and getting out looking at it?

127

00:10:22,000 --> 00:10:25,000

See, that's what I was going to tell you, you know what, I haven't completed it.

128

00:10:25,000 --> 00:10:33,000

I'm driving along, and we both, the thing that we can't get over is that there was no traffic, you know.

129

00:10:33,000 --> 00:10:34,000

Yes.

130

00:10:34,000 --> 00:10:42,000

As we were going out to the farm, I said to my friend, and there was traffic, I have to explain, traffic coming in to town,

131

00:10:42,000 --> 00:10:48,000

and I said, my gosh, it's not even the weekend, you know, it was obviously heavy traffic.

132

00:10:48,000 --> 00:10:54,000

Once we got past the point where we have some residential building sites out there,

133

00:10:54,000 --> 00:10:58,000

and Chrissy going out to the lake, are you familiar with the area at all?

134

00:10:58,000 --> 00:11:00,000

No, okay, that's why I'm going into it a little bit.

135

00:11:00,000 --> 00:11:08,000

When we came back out, we, like I said, there was no traffic, just we felt really alone,

136

00:11:08,000 --> 00:11:12,000

and this thing was behind us, it was following us.

137

00:11:12,000 --> 00:11:14,000

It really was.

138

00:11:14,000 --> 00:11:17,000

I can't, you may think I'm kidding, but it was.

139

00:11:17,000 --> 00:11:19,000

Was this lack of traffic unusual?

140

00:11:19,000 --> 00:11:26,000

It was unusual, because when we drove out, it was so full, because I made a comment.

141

00:11:26,000 --> 00:11:37,000

Now, okay, we're driving past, okay, we hit the spot where it's Pine River, and there is a

beautiful area, you know, building site area out there.

142

00:11:37,000 --> 00:11:46,000

And I come down here, and I turn around, and I swear to you, we went back, would you believe this, two women?

143

00:11:46,000 --> 00:11:54,000

We had to see for ourselves that it was not a car with one headlight, a motorcycle, because it would be coming down south,

144

00:11:54,000 --> 00:11:56,000

following us if it were, you see what I'm saying?

145

00:11:56,000 --> 00:11:59,000

We wanted to meet it going the opposite direction.

146

00:11:59,000 --> 00:12:07,000

As I turned down to the highway here, all of a sudden I thought, where is this traffic coming from?

147

00:12:07,000 --> 00:12:08,000

Ginger's Can?

148

00:12:08,000 --> 00:12:09,000

Right.

149

00:12:09,000 --> 00:12:19,000

It was all of us, because I had to wait for all these cars to pass, and nothing when we were out there driving on the road.

150

00:12:19,000 --> 00:12:23,000

Okay, can we feel free to call you for more information?

151

00:12:23,000 --> 00:12:25,000

Oh, feel free to call me.

152

00:12:25,000 --> 00:12:26,000

I mean, I'm glad you called me.

153

00:12:26,000 --> 00:12:28,000

I just thought I had to tell somebody.

154

00:12:28,000 --> 00:12:31,000

My husband happened to be out of town, and I was going to explode.

155

00:12:31,000 --> 00:12:32,000

I had to tell somebody.

156

00:12:32,000 --> 00:12:39,000

You see, and then I saw the police department, and they gave me your number, and he would be the one that would want to hear my story.

157

00:12:39,000 --> 00:12:41,000

Okay, and thank you very much for talking to us.

158

00:12:41,000 --> 00:12:42,000

Thank you for calling.

159

00:12:42,000 --> 00:12:43,000

You bet.

160

00:12:43,000 --> 00:12:49,000

Kind of hoping, you know, when you said you were coming in, I was hoping we could take you out that area.

161

00:12:49,000 --> 00:12:50,000

Right.

162

00:12:50,000 --> 00:12:51,000

That area.

163

00:12:51,000 --> 00:12:59,000

But very quickly, you want to know, I mean, are we out from the very beginning, and so on and so forth?

164

00:12:59,000 --> 00:13:11,000

Okay, what I was really interested in is the time, the approximate time that you left your house, and then how far you had to go before you got on division, which is highway 395.

165

00:13:11,000 --> 00:13:20,000

And then how long it took you to drive up to the point where you turned off at 395 and to the milk store.

166

00:13:20,000 --> 00:13:24,000

And then the traffic conditions during that period.

167

00:13:24,000 --> 00:13:28,000

Okay, I'll tell you, and then I'll give you the opportunity.

168

00:13:28,000 --> 00:13:30,000

You want to ask my neighbors here too.

169

00:13:30,000 --> 00:13:31,000

Fine.

170

00:13:31,000 --> 00:13:34,000

But okay, now I'll have to, about what time was it?

171

00:13:34,000 --> 00:13:39,000

It was after 6.30 when we left, wasn't it?

172

00:13:39,000 --> 00:13:40,000

Yeah, roughly.

173

00:13:40,000 --> 00:13:45,000

It was about a quarter to seven when we left our home to go get milk.

174

00:13:45,000 --> 00:13:52,000

And we live north of town, you know, right close to the area where we hooked up on to.

175

00:13:52,000 --> 00:13:55,000

But we are going straight up North Undivision Street.

176

00:13:55,000 --> 00:14:03,000

And we go now under past Wondermere and Pine River out towards Deer Park.

177

00:14:03,000 --> 00:14:04,000

Okay.

178

00:14:04,000 --> 00:14:14,000

And now, as we were driving up division, I said to my neighbor Esther, I said, my gosh, look at all this traffic.

179

00:14:14,000 --> 00:14:18,000

There was a lot of traffic coming south as we were going north.

180

00:14:18,000 --> 00:14:25,000

And I said to her, my word, it's not even the weekend, which is not an uncommon thing on Friday and Saturday night, you know.

181

00:14:25,000 --> 00:14:31,000

And there was a lot of traffic as we were going north.

182

00:14:31,000 --> 00:14:40,000

And the traffic kind of died down after we get past Wondermere and Pine River Park and another new residential area, which is north of division.

183

00:14:40,000 --> 00:14:41,000

Okay.

184

00:14:41,000 --> 00:14:52,000

And as we went further on, how many miles to the farm?

185

00:14:52,000 --> 00:14:58,000

Oh, it's four miles north of Wondermere and about a mile and a half off division, which is the highway.

186

00:14:58,000 --> 00:14:59,000

Okay.

187

00:14:59,000 --> 00:15:01,000

Now we're tracking this on a map as you're talking.

188

00:15:01,000 --> 00:15:06,000

And what is this in relation to Whitworth College, your location?

189

00:15:06,000 --> 00:15:07,000

It is north of that.

190

00:15:07,000 --> 00:15:08,000

Okay.

191

00:15:08,000 --> 00:15:09,000

But it's north.

192

00:15:09,000 --> 00:15:10,000

Okay.

193

00:15:10,000 --> 00:15:11,000

We got Wondermere Lake.

194

00:15:11,000 --> 00:15:12,000

Is that where Wondermere is?

195

00:15:12,000 --> 00:15:13,000

Yeah.

196

00:15:13,000 --> 00:15:17,000

Wondermere Lake and then there's Pine River Park, which is Little Spokane River area.

197

00:15:17,000 --> 00:15:18,000

Okay.

198

00:15:18,000 --> 00:15:25,000

And then we go about, how many miles, about four miles up north of that, three and a half to four miles.

199

00:15:25,000 --> 00:15:29,000

Now on your map, I'll give you a location.

200

00:15:29,000 --> 00:15:30,000

It's Monroe Road.

201

00:15:30,000 --> 00:15:31,000

Okay, we've got that.

202

00:15:31,000 --> 00:15:35,000

That's where we turned left on Monroe Road.

203

00:15:35,000 --> 00:15:39,000

Another how many miles on Monroe Road, would you think?

204

00:15:39,000 --> 00:15:42,000

Another mile down on Monroe Road.

205

00:15:42,000 --> 00:15:43,000

Okay.

206

00:15:43,000 --> 00:15:50,000

And the other road we hooked on to, Austin, she said it starts with an A. She gets more,

207

00:15:50,000 --> 00:15:54,000

she's more familiar, you know, as a new driver on this road.

208

00:15:54,000 --> 00:15:55,000

Yes.

209

00:15:55,000 --> 00:15:59,000

We swung a right onto Austin, which would be going north again.

210

00:15:59,000 --> 00:16:00,000

Okay, we got that.

211

00:16:00,000 --> 00:16:01,000

Okay.

212

00:16:01,000 --> 00:16:02,000

And how many miles to the farm?

213

00:16:02,000 --> 00:16:08,000

Half a mile and then we would be to the farm, which we swing into her driveway would be,

214

00:16:08,000 --> 00:16:09,000

you know, to the left.

215

00:16:09,000 --> 00:16:10,000

Okay, fine.

216

00:16:10,000 --> 00:16:12,000

That's where we went to get the milk.

217

00:16:12,000 --> 00:16:14,000

And about what time did you arrive there?

218

00:16:14,000 --> 00:16:15,000

Do you have any idea?

219

00:16:15,000 --> 00:16:17,000

About what time did you think we got there to the milk?

220

00:16:17,000 --> 00:16:19,000

About 10 minutes to drive out there, 15?

221

00:16:19,000 --> 00:16:22,000

20 minutes, I guess, to drive out there total.

222

00:16:22,000 --> 00:16:23,000

Okay.

223

00:16:23,000 --> 00:16:28,000

And the traffic there on the main highway and then this side roads, was that fairly normal?

224

00:16:28,000 --> 00:16:37,000

No, the traffic, no, the traffic from Pine River Park and Wondermere and maybe just a shot north.

225

00:16:37,000 --> 00:16:41,000

We have Fairwood and Brentwood, which are residential areas.

226

00:16:41,000 --> 00:16:42,000

It was heavy.

227

00:16:42,000 --> 00:16:47,000

Now, I would not, I wouldn't consider that particularly normal or abnormal.

228

00:16:47,000 --> 00:16:50,000

That area right there is pretty well traveled.

229

00:16:50,000 --> 00:16:58,000

But beyond that point, when we get after you passed that bridge, there's a little bridge where you have Wondermere Lake.

230

00:16:58,000 --> 00:17:05,000

As we're going north, it died down considerably into a point where there was no traffic whatsoever.

231

00:17:05,000 --> 00:17:07,000

From that point to the milk barn?

232

00:17:07,000 --> 00:17:08,000

Yes.

233

00:17:08,000 --> 00:17:09,000

It's super dark.

234

00:17:09,000 --> 00:17:10,000

Okay.

235

00:17:10,000 --> 00:17:14,000

And you met nothing coming opposite direction and nothing passed you?

236

00:17:14,000 --> 00:17:15,000

Okay.

237

00:17:15,000 --> 00:17:19,000

As we were driving to the farm, we didn't encounter anything.

238

00:17:19,000 --> 00:17:20,000

No.

239

00:17:20,000 --> 00:17:21,000

Okay.

240

00:17:21,000 --> 00:17:23,000

How it, okay, you're, just go ahead.

241

00:17:23,000 --> 00:17:30,000

But now the countryside was fairly normal according to the other lady.

Everything seemed normal out there.

243

It seemed normal to you after at that point?

244

00:17:34,000 --> 00:17:36,000

Yes, it didn't seem abnormal.

245

00:17:36,000 --> 00:17:38,000

It was a super dark night.

246

00:17:38,000 --> 00:17:40,000

It had been cold and wet and raining in Spokane.

247

00:17:40,000 --> 00:17:41,000

Yes.

248

00:17:41,000 --> 00:17:46,000

And I was driving the entire distance almost on my high beams.

249

00:17:46,000 --> 00:17:47,000

Okay.

250

00:17:47,000 --> 00:17:52,000

And because you know, you turn them off if you have any traffic approaching you.

251

00:17:52,000 --> 00:18:00,000

So I was driving and I drove out there the next day in the daytime for my own benefit.

252

00:18:00,000 --> 00:18:05,000

Just to see how many lights, county lights were connected, you know, how many miles,

253

00:18:05,000 --> 00:18:08,000

or et cetera, they were apart.

254

00:18:08,000 --> 00:18:09,000

Yes.

255

00:18:09,000 --> 00:18:14,000

And the area that we were at, there would be a stretch, a periodic stretch where there

256

00:18:14,000 --> 00:18:19,000

was no light unless you came to a county road hookup onto the main highway and there

257

00:18:19,000 --> 00:18:21,000

would be one light.

258

00:18:21,000 --> 00:18:22,000

I see.

259

00:18:22,000 --> 00:18:27,000

You see, I had to see this for myself thinking it may be just the light off the road, but

260

00:18:27,000 --> 00:18:29,000

absolutely not.

261

00:18:29,000 --> 00:18:35,000

But as now we picked up our milk and it took us maybe a total of five minutes of that.

262

00:18:35,000 --> 00:18:36,000

It was ready for us.

263

00:18:36,000 --> 00:18:37,000

Okay.

264

00:18:37,000 --> 00:18:43,000

And I backed out of the driveway again and drove down the first little country road.

265

00:18:43,000 --> 00:18:50,000

As we were driving down, yes, there was a car coming on the opposite direction.

266

00:18:50,000 --> 00:18:51,000

We're going south now.

267

00:18:51,000 --> 00:18:53,000

You're going south on Austin Road.

268

00:18:53,000 --> 00:18:56,000

Yes, we are on Austin Road and a car is coming north.

269

00:18:56,000 --> 00:18:57,000

Okay.

270

00:18:57,000 --> 00:18:59,000

And it went north of us.

271

00:18:59,000 --> 00:19:05,000

And during the daytime when I drove back out there, there were some houses kind of scattered,

272

00:19:05,000 --> 00:19:09,000

you know, farmhouses and some nice homes with acreage.

273

00:19:09,000 --> 00:19:12,000

So we just assumed it was someone living out there.

274

Right.

275

Okay.

And then I've hooked up onto Austin.

277

00:19:16,000 --> 00:19:19,000

We come to the crossroads from Monroe and Austin Hook.

278

00:19:19,000 --> 00:19:20,000

Are you there?

279

00:19:20,000 --> 00:19:21,000

Right.

280

00:19:21,000 --> 00:19:22,000

Okay.

281

00:19:22,000 --> 00:19:25,000

As I'm waiting, there is a stop sign there on these two county roads.

282

00:19:25,000 --> 00:19:28,000

There's another car across the road.

283

00:19:28,000 --> 00:19:29,000

There she is.

284

00:19:29,000 --> 00:19:32,000

And I'm waiting to make a left-hand turn onto Monroe.

285

00:19:32,000 --> 00:19:33,000

Right.

286

00:19:33,000 --> 00:19:35,000

And he is going north on Austin.

287

00:19:35,000 --> 00:19:36,000

Okay.

288

00:19:36,000 --> 00:19:40,000

Also, this is the very last car we encountered.

289

00:19:40,000 --> 00:19:42,000

Okay, then you go...

290

00:19:42,000 --> 00:19:48,000

Then I swung onto Monroe Road, which would be a left-hand turn towards the highway.

291

00:19:48,000 --> 00:19:49,000

Right.

292

00:19:49,000 --> 00:19:54,000

Now this particular stretch of road is also quite dark because there's trees and the

293

00:19:54,000 --> 00:19:56,000

field and no light.

294

00:19:56,000 --> 00:19:58,000

No light whatsoever.

295

00:19:58,000 --> 00:20:04,000

And there aren't any homes, particularly on the road, that would reflect any light whatsoever.

296

Okay.

297

00:20:05,000 --> 00:20:06,000

Okay.

298

00:20:06,000 --> 00:20:12,000

And we're driving along and I come to the stop sign, which is the highway.

299

00:20:12,000 --> 00:20:13,000

Right, 395.

300

00:20:13,000 --> 00:20:14,000

Right.

301

00:20:14,000 --> 00:20:15,000

Okay.

302

00:20:15,000 --> 00:20:21,000

And to my left is the last light, a county road light that, you know, is on my left-hand

303

00:20:21,000 --> 00:20:24,000

side of the road that's lighting up this particular hurt up.

304

00:20:24,000 --> 00:20:25,000

Right.

305

00:20:25,000 --> 00:20:32,000

Now I am looking to my left quite a ways before I attach to make sure there is no traffic.

306

00:20:32,000 --> 00:20:33,000

Nothing.

307

00:20:33,000 --> 00:20:36,000

There was no light, nothing.

308

00:20:36,000 --> 00:20:38,000

Completely dark.

309

00:20:38,000 --> 00:20:45,000

Now, sir, I went back the next day to see how far the visibility was on that stretch of

310

00:20:45,000 --> 00:20:47,000

road, you know, in the daytime.

311

00:20:47,000 --> 00:20:48,000

Yes.

312

00:20:48,000 --> 00:20:51,000

It's really quite, quite a ways.

313

00:20:51,000 --> 00:20:53,000

It's a straight stretch almost.

314

00:20:53,000 --> 00:20:57,000

Yes, I see here in the math there's a long straight stretch.

315

00:20:57,000 --> 00:20:58,000

Right.

316

00:20:58,000 --> 00:21:03,000

And so if a car were coming, you could see the beam or the light reflecting from the car

317

00:21:03,000 --> 00:21:06,000

for quite a ways, if it were there.

318

00:21:06,000 --> 00:21:09,000

But absolutely not.

319

00:21:09,000 --> 00:21:10,000

Okay.

320

00:21:10,000 --> 00:21:17,000

So, okay, then I proceed onto the road, you know, to my right and we are coming south

321

00:21:17,000 --> 00:21:20,000

now on the highway.

322

00:21:20,000 --> 00:21:21,000

Okay.

323

00:21:21,000 --> 00:21:26,000

And my neighbor was sitting beside me and she lit up the cigarette and we were talking

324

00:21:26,000 --> 00:21:27,000

casually.

325

00:21:27,000 --> 00:21:32,000

She was talking about her brother, she was saying, and anyway, I have this habit of

326

00:21:32,000 --> 00:21:34,000

glancing up to my mirror.

327

00:21:34,000 --> 00:21:37,000

Just, you know, have it, I do to see what's going on behind me.

328

00:21:37,000 --> 00:21:38,000

Yes.

329

00:21:38,000 --> 00:21:44,000

And I'm not kidding you, all of a sudden I see this light, just a bright light in my

330

00:21:44,000 --> 00:21:45,000

mirror.

331

00:21:45,000 --> 00:21:49,000

I hadn't made any comment to my neighbor at that point.

332

00:21:49,000 --> 00:21:53,000

I thought to myself, my gosh, where did that car come from?

333

00:21:53,000 --> 00:21:58,000

Now, about how far had you driven before just as you drove onto the highway?

334

00:21:58,000 --> 00:21:59,000

Was this almost immediately?

335

00:21:59,000 --> 00:22:03,000

No, it was, I, well I observed the thing for about two minutes.

336

00:22:03,000 --> 00:22:04,000

I see.

337

00:22:04,000 --> 00:22:07,000

So whatever, two to three minutes in my mirror.

338

00:22:07,000 --> 00:22:11,000

I see, I wasn't looking, you know, paying attention that much and it was so dark and

339

00:22:11,000 --> 00:22:16,000

then it did catch my eye and I observed it before I made a comment to my neighbor.

340

00:22:16,000 --> 00:22:20,000

Okay, now this just appears an ordinary light, like a headlight on the car?

341

00:22:20,000 --> 00:22:22,000

Well, it could have been.

342

00:22:22,000 --> 00:22:23,000

That's what I first thought.

343

00:22:23,000 --> 00:22:26,000

It was that, you know, about that size.

344

00:22:26,000 --> 00:22:27,000

About that size.

345

00:22:27,000 --> 00:22:33,000

Maybe a little bit larger, you know, like, well, it was larger than I would say a normal

346

00:22:33,000 --> 00:22:36,000

light because I've been observing the cars in the dark.

347

00:22:36,000 --> 00:22:40,000

Just trying to sense, you know, so I could tell you some size.

348

00:22:40,000 --> 00:22:41,000

Right.

349

00:22:41,000 --> 00:22:47,000

And this thing was back there but it was coming closer, increasing in size, you see.

350

00:22:47,000 --> 00:22:51,000

Yeah, it was as the gap closed between you, the thing did get bigger.

351

00:22:51,000 --> 00:22:52,000

Yes, absolutely.

352

00:22:52,000 --> 00:22:59,000

And I thought to myself, oh, that car has one headlight, you know, because it was just

353

00:22:59,000 --> 00:23:00,000

the one light.

354

00:23:00,000 --> 00:23:04,000

And then I thought, I hadn't sent anything to my neighbor yet and I thought, my goodness,

355

00:23:04,000 --> 00:23:08,000

it must be a motorcyclist because they have the one bright light.

356

00:23:08,000 --> 00:23:11,000

And I thought, what a cold night to be out, you know.

357

00:23:11,000 --> 00:23:16,000

But finally, this thing kept coming closer and it got to be bigger and brighter.

358

00:23:16,000 --> 00:23:20,000

So I am driving about 47 miles an hour, you know.

359

00:23:20,000 --> 00:23:23,000

And the roads are straight but it was dark.

360

00:23:23,000 --> 00:23:25,000

I had to keep my eye on the road.

361

00:23:25,000 --> 00:23:29,000

I said to my neighbor, I told her, I said, Esther, would you please turn around?

362

00:23:29,000 --> 00:23:34,000

And see, because it was not a, you know, something I had not recognized.

363

00:23:34,000 --> 00:23:39,000

I said, would you please turn around and see what is following us?

364

00:23:39,000 --> 00:23:45,000

And she literally bodily turned around and I said to her, is it a car with one headlight?

365

00:23:45,000 --> 00:23:50,000

And she said at that point, well, it could be.

366

00:23:50,000 --> 00:23:55,000

And all of a sudden she just, I'll let you tell her when her opportunity to talk what she saw actually.

367

00:23:55,000 --> 00:24:01,000

She says, Rose, Rose, it's a thing, it's a thing and it moved up into the sky.

368

00:24:01,000 --> 00:24:04,000

It appeared to be moving upward.

369

00:24:04,000 --> 00:24:06,000

She said, turn around, turn around.

370

00:24:06,000 --> 00:24:08,000

I said, I see it in my mirror.

371

00:24:08,000 --> 00:24:09,000

I see it.

372

00:24:09,000 --> 00:24:11,000

You know, I was observing it at that point too.

373

00:24:11,000 --> 00:24:17,000

And she said, it's going to the left and to the, I'll let her tell you that because she saw that more.

374

00:24:17,000 --> 00:24:25,000

And so, and this thing got closer and brighter, bigger, much larger.

375

00:24:25,000 --> 00:24:27,000

Did you lose sight of this in the mirror then?

376

00:24:27,000 --> 00:24:35,000

I was watching this, but the thing would like, literally go completely out, you know, with completely,

377

00:24:35,000 --> 00:24:39,000

it's almost an exaggeration of completely going away out of my mirror.

378

00:24:39,000 --> 00:24:40,000

You know what I mean?

379

00:24:40,000 --> 00:24:45,000

It would hover like to the left upward and then to the right and then I wouldn't see it.

380

00:24:45,000 --> 00:24:47,000

And then it would appear again.

381

00:24:47,000 --> 00:24:52,000

Now, sir, a normal car light will do that occasionally if you hit a bump or something,

382

00:24:52,000 --> 00:24:56,000

but never have I known it to completely go off of my mirror.

383

00:24:56,000 --> 00:24:57,000

Right.

384

00:24:57,000 --> 00:24:58,000

So this thing did.

385

00:24:58,000 --> 00:25:06,000

And I was trying to wash it and keep control of the car too, or at least started to shake so badly

386

00:25:06,000 --> 00:25:10,000

that I slowed my car down to not to lose control.

387

00:25:10,000 --> 00:25:15,000

And this thing seemed to slow down as I slowed down.

388

00:25:15,000 --> 00:25:21,000

We were going as a creep almost after it really, I had slowed down enough so I wouldn't lose control.

389

00:25:21,000 --> 00:25:23,000

Did you notice your speedometer?

390

00:25:23,000 --> 00:25:25,000

Did I notice my speedometer?

391

00:25:25,000 --> 00:25:29,000

No, what I did notice is that my instrument lights did dim.

392

00:25:29,000 --> 00:25:31,000

They did dim.

393

00:25:31,000 --> 00:25:32,000

They did dim.

394

00:25:32,000 --> 00:25:33,000

How about your headlights?

395

00:25:33,000 --> 00:25:34,000

They did too.

396

00:25:34,000 --> 00:25:38,000

And I didn't notice that, so I'll get to that point when we were coming down.

397

00:25:38,000 --> 00:25:39,000

Okay.

398

00:25:39,000 --> 00:25:46,000

Okay, we're driving along and this, it was about as far away, now there's double blocks,

399

00:25:46,000 --> 00:25:50,000

you know, a normal block for my car.

400

00:25:50,000 --> 00:25:55,000

If you were to stand at one end of the block and I was at the other, we could shout at each other.

401

00:25:55,000 --> 00:26:02,000

And it literally, the light was so luminous and so bright, you couldn't look at it for any length of time.

402

00:26:02,000 --> 00:26:06,000

My neighbor was saying, well, if I can't look at it, I can't look at it, you know.

403

00:26:06,000 --> 00:26:15,000

And, yeah, your eyes were water, she said, but it literally lit up the whole width of the road.

404

00:26:15,000 --> 00:26:18,000

You know, it wasn't just like one headlight.

405

00:26:18,000 --> 00:26:24,000

It literally lit up the whole width of the road and maybe over the road.

406

00:26:24,000 --> 00:26:25,000

You know what I mean?

407

00:26:25,000 --> 00:26:31,000

It's so dark, you can't see, but where we saw this light, it literally lit up the entire road.

408

00:26:31,000 --> 00:26:37,000

Okay, now, about this point, do you have any idea of your exact location on 395?

409

00:26:37,000 --> 00:26:43,000

Now, if I were driving it, I could probably, you know, tell you, well, here's about the place.

410

00:26:43,000 --> 00:26:49,000

Right at this minute, I'm not that familiar with names of the area, other than where to be in the car.

411

00:26:49,000 --> 00:26:50,000

Okay.

412

00:26:50,000 --> 00:26:56,000

I can, yeah, we've had gone, oh golly, well, we saw the thing for about a total of five minutes.

413

00:26:56,000 --> 00:27:04,000

Okay, and when we came now, we're coming south and as soon as we got into the residential area,

414

00:27:04,000 --> 00:27:11,000

like Pine River and Wondermere again, where that bridge is, the thing literally flew off to the left into the sky,

415

00:27:11,000 --> 00:27:13,000

as fast as you could raise your arm from your side.

416

00:27:13,000 --> 00:27:15,000

That's about at the bridge at the Spokane River.

417

00:27:15,000 --> 00:27:17,000

Right, right, exactly.

418

00:27:17,000 --> 00:27:20,000

Okay, and that's the last you saw of it.

419

00:27:20,000 --> 00:27:22,000

And that is the last we saw of it.

420

00:27:22,000 --> 00:27:33,000

I am not kidding you, I'm not a chicken little, I drove south trying to find a place where I could turn off to turn around.

421

00:27:33,000 --> 00:27:39,000

And I said, after I have got to see this with my own eyes, whether it's a car with one headlight, a motorcycle,

422

00:27:39,000 --> 00:27:42,000

a truck with lights for sitting up high, anything.

423

00:27:42,000 --> 00:27:49,000

And all of a sudden, as we were trying to hook up onto the division streets, all this traffic, which would not be in front of us,

424

00:27:49,000 --> 00:27:55,000

not before us, it must have come out from Pine River, Wondermere, Brentwood, Fairwood.

425

00:27:55,000 --> 00:27:58,000

We both said the traffic, where was it before, you see?

426

00:27:58,000 --> 00:28:02,000

Now, do you saw this traffic after you passed over the bridge?

427

00:28:02,000 --> 00:28:09,000

Well, after we passed over the bridge and I drove to the point and I turned around in a place called Trailer Camper,

428

00:28:09,000 --> 00:28:11,000

Movial Camper, excuse me.

429

00:28:11,000 --> 00:28:13,000

And about how far is that south of the bridge, any of you?

430

00:28:13,000 --> 00:28:18,000

How far is that away from the bridge, where that thing left us?

431

00:28:18,000 --> 00:28:21,000

We have no idea, I mean, half a mile maybe.

432

00:28:21,000 --> 00:28:23,000

That's the first turn off I took.

433

00:28:23,000 --> 00:28:26,000

Now, up to that point, you saw no traffic, right?

434

00:28:26,000 --> 00:28:27,000

No traffic.

435

00:28:27,000 --> 00:28:29,000

Okay, then you went in and you turned around.

436

00:28:29,000 --> 00:28:30,000

Yes.

437

00:28:30,000 --> 00:28:33,000

And then you tried to get back onto the highway.

438

00:28:33,000 --> 00:28:34,000

Yes.

439

00:28:34,000 --> 00:28:36,000

And that's when you hit the traffic.

440

00:28:36,000 --> 00:28:37,000

That's when we hit traffic.

441

00:28:37,000 --> 00:28:39,000

And that's going north and south.

442

00:28:39,000 --> 00:28:40,000

That's correct.

443

00:28:40,000 --> 00:28:41,000

Okay.

444

00:28:41,000 --> 00:28:43,000

More south this time than north again.

445

00:28:43,000 --> 00:28:44,000

Okay.

446

00:28:44,000 --> 00:28:46,000

And then did you drive back north?

447

00:28:46,000 --> 00:28:54,000

Yes, I did, sir, and I drove back up and after, again, after we got out of the residential area,

448

00:28:54,000 --> 00:28:56,000

we're thought to be much darker.

449

00:28:56,000 --> 00:28:58,000

And that's when I noticed my headlights were dim.

450

00:28:58,000 --> 00:29:03,000

I said, yes, turn my headlights a shirt dim and I got cold feet, you know,

451

00:29:03,000 --> 00:29:08,000

and I tried to find a little road or something I could turn off on Main Highway

452

00:29:08,000 --> 00:29:12,000

because there wasn't another county road connecting between that point where I was at.

453

00:29:12,000 --> 00:29:16,000

So I drove into this, you almost missed it if you weren't looking for a spot

454

00:29:16,000 --> 00:29:18,000

and I turned around in a field.

455

00:29:18,000 --> 00:29:20,000

Okay, now you say you've got cold feet.

456

00:29:20,000 --> 00:29:22,000

Was it getting cold in the car or were you just...

457

00:29:22,000 --> 00:29:24,000

No, I think, just kind of a chill.

458

00:29:24,000 --> 00:29:25,000

I see.

459

00:29:25,000 --> 00:29:27,000

I was up in that same vicinity.

460

00:29:27,000 --> 00:29:29,000

Okay, but you did not see the object again.

461

00:29:29,000 --> 00:29:30,000

We did not.

462

00:29:30,000 --> 00:29:32,000

We looked, believe me.

463

00:29:32,000 --> 00:29:36,000

I mean, we were both frightened, but we just had to see for ourselves what it could be.

464

00:29:36,000 --> 00:29:46,000

Now, when your headlights and panel lights dimmed, did you notice any unusual action in the engine?

465

00:29:46,000 --> 00:29:48,000

No, not really.

466

00:29:48,000 --> 00:29:49,000

We didn't.

467

00:29:49,000 --> 00:29:56,000

I noticed that my lights in the car were quite dim and my headlights were quite dim

468

00:29:56,000 --> 00:29:59,000

and this is one reason I did turn around.

469

00:29:59,000 --> 00:30:03,000

Okay, and then you did turn around and then you started back down, division again?

470

00:30:03,000 --> 00:30:05,000

Then we went home, yes.

471

00:30:05,000 --> 00:30:07,000

Okay, and nothing happened from that point till you got home?

472

00:30:07,000 --> 00:30:08,000

Nothing happened.

473

00:30:08,000 --> 00:30:10,000

No, uh-oh.

474

00:30:10,000 --> 00:30:16,000

Okay, and at any time that you were driving, and this, while this object was behind you,

475

00:30:16,000 --> 00:30:19,000

did you have any unusual physical reactions?

476

00:30:19,000 --> 00:30:23,000

Well, other than, that's hard to tell because I was shaking like a leaf.

477

00:30:23,000 --> 00:30:24,000

I see.

478

00:30:24,000 --> 00:30:28,000

And my knee, I could hardly keep my foot on the pedal if you want to know the truth.

479

00:30:28,000 --> 00:30:31,000

And my neighbor was just shaken.

480

00:30:31,000 --> 00:30:36,000

We're laughing about it now because we're, you know, after you think how frightened you were.

481

00:30:36,000 --> 00:30:40,000

Okay, now, do you have any idea of what time it was when you got home?

482

00:30:40,000 --> 00:30:44,000

As a matter of fact, I'll tell you exactly what time we saw that thing.

483

00:30:44,000 --> 00:30:46,000

It was at 7.25.

484

00:30:46,000 --> 00:30:48,000

That was when you first saw it up north?

485

00:30:48,000 --> 00:30:52,000

Well, I'll tell you, it went, it went all the way up to about 7.30.

486

00:30:52,000 --> 00:30:55,000

And I said to Esther, what time do you have on your watch?

487

00:30:55,000 --> 00:30:56,000

And we both looked.

488

00:30:56,000 --> 00:30:57,000

I didn't know why I did that.

489

00:30:57,000 --> 00:31:05,000

And so it was 7.30, but I said, okay, that's the first, the first minute I saw that thing was about 7.25.

490

00:31:05,000 --> 00:31:09,000

From the minute I saw it, it was about that time.

491

00:31:09,000 --> 00:31:12,000

It could have been just a couple minutes earlier than that, you know, too.

492

00:31:12,000 --> 00:31:15,000

But I wanted to remember the time for some reason.

493

00:31:15,000 --> 00:31:16,000

I don't know why.

494

00:31:16,000 --> 00:31:20,000

But did you have any idea what time it was when you turned around to head back north?

495

00:31:20,000 --> 00:31:27,000

Probably, it might have been like, but what time you suppose it took us when we went back upward?

496

00:31:27,000 --> 00:31:31,000

It was what, maybe about 7.35 going on 7.40.

497

00:31:31,000 --> 00:31:35,000

Okay, but did you notice the time, what time it was when you got home?

498

00:31:35,000 --> 00:31:37,000

What time was it when we got home, Esther?

499

00:31:37,000 --> 00:31:39,000

About 8 o'clock.

500

00:31:39,000 --> 00:31:53,000

Okay, now, taking into consideration the time that you lost when you slowed down and also the time

that you turned around and made the trip back up and then turned around again and came south,

501

00:31:53,000 --> 00:32:00,000

would this be, this trip had taken you much longer than usual?

502

00:32:00,000 --> 00:32:03,000

You mean coming back home on the whole total trip?

503

00:32:03,000 --> 00:32:04,000

Coming back home?

504

00:32:04,000 --> 00:32:08,000

It probably took me a little longer because I had slowed the car down, yes.

505

00:32:08,000 --> 00:32:12,000

But nothing like a half hour or an hour longer than usual?

506

00:32:12,000 --> 00:32:15,000

It took us 20 minutes for us to get there, normally.

507

00:32:15,000 --> 00:32:16,000

Right.

508

00:32:16,000 --> 00:32:21,000

And it is a dark road and I don't drive 55 or 50, I mean drive a little slower than most.

509

00:32:21,000 --> 00:32:27,000

But I would say it took us longer to get home than it normally would, yes.

510

00:32:27,000 --> 00:32:29,000

This is if I'm answering your question.

511

00:32:29,000 --> 00:32:30,000

Okay.

512

About how close did the object, your estimate, how close did the object come to you during

of water, that's about the brightest light, you know, comparison to any light I've seen.

You know, the airplane lights, is they landing?

554

That would be probably the brightest thing that I could compare it to, but it was brighter

It was kind of rounded on the top, very rounded on the top, and it was kind of a half rounded on the bottom.
