Good morning sir, I just got your number and is this the government agency?

It started trying, it was very high, I would say, oh jeez, over 30,000 at least.

And it was moving and calculating what the time it took off from the northeast quadrant going southwest.

It must have been doing at least close to 3,000 anyway, miles per hour.

And then it stopped just about over the town of Bisbee, which is southwest of us.

And of course at that altitude it must have been further southwest than Bisbee,

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00:01:03,000 --> 00:01:06,000

but from my line of sight it looked like it was over Bisbee.

And it was sort of a, oh, I wouldn't say green exactly, sort of like a dull green.

And first thing I did I called Fort Wichuka Base Operations, which is over there on the other side of Bisbee.

It's Fort Wichuka Libby Army Airfield.

And asked me if he would check and see if he saw it.

And excuse me just a moment.

589 or 2L, I thought it was Roger, the altimeter is 3017.

Okay, and I asked him to go outside and see if he could see it, you know, just about southwest of the Bisbee area there.

And he confirmed that he did see it.

And I called up Albert Gertie Center and asked me if he could pick up anything on the radar scope.

And then I checked with Tucson Approach Control, which is about 100 miles northwest of us here.

But anyway, what I saw was this sort of dull green light, pretty big.

But it was moving about 30,000 miles an hour.

And the only way I can describe it, what it did when it stopped over there, was,

have you ever seen one of these bees or flies or something hanging over garbage that just buzz back

and forth in one little, uh,

oh yes, radish going back and back like that?

Well, that's the way it stayed there for a while.

It must have stayed there for at least about, oh God, half an hour.

And then it just zipped on southwest.

I mean, it just flat moved out.

I couldn't calculate any speed.

Okay, when it came to a stop, did it appear to slow down or did it just stop abruptly?

It just stopped abruptly.

I was taking my weather observation.

Actually, at that time we go outside, we have a little shack that we take our temperatures for a dew point and all that stuff.

I looked up to see the judges sky cover.

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00:03:30,000 --> 00:03:38,000

And at first I thought it was a satellite because we see him cross over once in a while, but it was too big.

You could see a definite circle to it.

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00:03:44,000 --> 00:03:47,000

I'm sorry, I have to ask you to wait a minute again.

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00:03:47,000 --> 00:03:48,000

Go ahead.

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00:03:48,000 --> 00:03:52,000

I'm going to say 9 or 638 Victor Douglas, go ahead.

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00:03:52,000 --> 00:04:05,000

9 or 638 Victor Douglas, the Douglas Area Altimeter 3017.

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00:04:05,000 --> 00:04:12,000

So, like I said, it was circular or more or less anyway, it looked like it.

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00:04:12,000 --> 00:04:18,000

Then I was looking for the sky cover and thought coming on and I just followed on through.

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00:04:18,000 --> 00:04:19,000

It just looked kind of weird.

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00:04:19,000 --> 00:04:21,000

Were there any motions or maneuvers of any kind?

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00:04:21,000 --> 00:04:24,000

No, not when it first came out of the northeast.

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00:04:24,000 --> 00:04:31,000

It just went in a straight line all the way down to stomping over in the southwest quadrant there over the area of Bisbee.

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00:04:31,000 --> 00:04:37,000

But like I say, it had to be down further than that because of my line of sight.

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00:04:37,000 --> 00:04:46,000

But the only movement too, it was when it stopped, it just started going back and forth like I described like a fly or a bee or something over it.

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00:04:46,000 --> 00:04:49,000

Any estimate of size at all?

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00:04:49,000 --> 00:04:53,000

It was pretty big.

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00:04:53,000 --> 00:04:55,000

It was pretty big.

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00:04:55,000 --> 00:05:05,000

From the altitude, I would say Jesus, at least a couple hundred feet anyway in diameter.

Okay.

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00:05:08,000 --> 00:05:14,000

But it was definitely not atmospheric phenomena because we've been trained for that stuff.

Hold on just a minute.
