And then the erratic movement, it's not circular as such, it seems like an eccentric circle.

That's all I can tell you.

It's moving very, very slow, but still it seems to have this other erratic movement to it,

I mean, it's, I don't know if they're rising, I don't know, I'm describing that very well.

Well, I, you know, I just, you stare at it long enough and you see about anything, I guess.
