And your estimation were these things fairly close or quite far away?

They were two or closer together, and two others sort of strung out behind into one side.

Okay. And once again, how long do you think you watch those?

How many witnesses did you see yourself?

Just myself. I was sitting in the back yard with a benign character, and saw.

They were not points of light. They were lobbed of light.

Oh, I see. Okay.

Would you say that these were attached to an object? Or was it that being possible to tell?

Well, I tried to visualize these as being lights on an airplane flying over.
