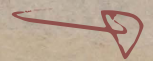

Top Secret Document Reveals . . . U.S. Govt.'s Belief in UFOs Goes Back 30 Years

As far back as 1950, the U.S. government considered UFOs "the most highly classified subject . . . rating higher even than the H-bomb," reveals a recently declassified top secret Canadian report.

The document also states that UFOs exist and that a "concentrated effort" to uncover their secrets was being made by top American scientists.

In a once top secret memorandum dated Nov. 21, 1950, to the Canadian Controller of Telecommunications, Canadian scientist Wilbert B. Smith wrote:

"I made discreet inquiries through the Canadian Embassy staff in Washington who were able to obtain for me the following information: The matter (of UFOs) is the most highly classified subject in the U.S. government, rating higher even than the H-bomb. Flying saucers exist . . . The entire matter is considered by the United States authorities to be of tremendous significance."

Smith said that a "concentrated effort" to investigate UFOs was led by Dr. Vannevar Bush, head of the National Defense Research Committee which mobilized American science and technology in World War 2. Dr. Bush, who also served as president of Carnegie Institution, died in 1974.

Smith, who died in 1962, filed his report two years before the U.S. detonated its first hydrogen bomb.

A year before Smith's report, the CIA launched a massive scheme of lies, deception and ridicule to publicly cover up UFO sightings, claims Baron Johannes von Buttlar.

As author of "The UFO Phenomenon" — a best-seller in Europe that will soon be published in America — Baron von Buttlar said he learned the truth about the cover-up from contacts with the CIA and Russia's KGB.

"We have all been duped in the cover-up of the century over UFO sightings," he told *The ENQUIRER*. "The culprits were the CIA, KGB and military forces of both countries.

"When the CIA was told by (government) investigators in 1949 that

the UFOs were almost certainly extraterrestrial visitors, it launched 'Project Grudge.' This was to make the world believe that all the UFO reports were hallucinations, mistakes or deliberate deceptions. However, the CIA issued orders to all American military forces to pass on reports of UFO sightings to the agency — and that in no way could they issue any official statements about UFOs."

The initial reason for the big cover-up was that the CIA wanted to be the first to learn of the UFOs' new technology, said Baron von Buttlar. "The CIA was afraid that the Russians would get hold of a UFO first. Naturally the Russians were moved by the same thoughts and so the race to capture a UFO was on.

"Both the CIA and the KGB decided that public interest in UFOs would be an obstacle — so they decided on a policy of total secrecy."
