Sparks fly in Ufo sighting

KIDD'S BEACH — The UFO, sightings of which have been reported from places in the Eastern Cape and Border, is still around, it seems.

It was sighted one evening last week by two Kidd's Beach farmers, Mr Len Meier and his son-in-law, Mr Basil Green, as they were driving to a meeting at 7.30 in the evening. The site of the sighting was close to the junction of the Kayser's Beach road with the national road from Port Alfred to East London.

Mr Meier reports that they both saw the object clearly for the space of about half a minute and that it appeared to be near and low in the sky. He says that it was bright and funnel shaped, with blue and red sparks coming from the tail of the funnel. The direction of its movement was from west to east. It did not fade away, but suddenly just vanished from sight. "One minute it was there," Mr Meier said, "and the next minute it was gone."

Berwick textile worker saw a U.F.O.

Textile worker, Yeoman Redfearn, is not just spinning a yarn when he says he saw a U.F.O. in the early morning sky on Monday.

Yeoman, who works at Pringles of Scotland Ltd., on the Tweedside Trading Estate, spotted the object on his way to work.

At 6.45 a.m. he saw a flashing light in the sky.

It was following the railway embankment at Tweedmouth, travelling towards Berwick, when it disappeared above the 'One Tunnel' leading to the Trading Estate.

Yeoman said it wasn't a helicopter or an aeroplane, and there was no sound. He observed the U.F.O. for about 10 minutes.

This is the second sighting in a week. Last week Mr. George Smith, of the Pilot Inn, Berwick, reported a similar sighting.
