

# Strange sight at the pub

FARM HAND F. W. Fleet, of Long Ponds, Layham, near Ipswich, saw a strange beam of light the night he went down to the pub to get some tobacco.

It was 7.15 p.m. in November 1947.

He says: "The landlord at my local, The Queen's Head, told me to hang on while he went to get his shirt off the line outside.

"Soon he came rushing in, shouting and looking as white as a ghost.

"I ran out to see what the commotion was about.

"I stopped in my tracks. All I saw was a trail of vapour and something bright in the distance.

"But the landlord told me he had seen a bright flying light coming after him.

"He had yelled and it had shot off."

That was not the end of the story.

Mr Fleet was cycling home in 1973.

He claims: "I saw what looked like a cluster of lights in the sky to the right of Colchester. They never moved.

"Two nights later, the same cluster was there.
