

# Unidentified AS23/d flying object over Summit

A HEYWOOD woman claimed last week that she spotted what could have been two unidentified flying objects within the space of 12 hours.

The sightings were reported to the Advertiser by Mrs Dorothy Wright, of Bury Old Road, who said it was about the seventh time she had seen a UFO in the area in 16 years.

On the first of the two latest sightings — last Wednesday afternoon — Mrs Wright said that while looking through her kitchen window she saw a "bright object in the sky" hovering over the Summit area.

She described its colour as "bright golden" and said it was the first object she had seen "with a little bit of vapour coming out of it."

Mrs Wright said it was not very high up and was travel-

ling from north to east.

She added: "It came across the top of the houses. There was no sound and it was definitely not an aircraft."

She said she observed the second UFO at 12.25 am on Thursday — just before she went to bed.

Mrs Wright said: "I was sitting in the dark at home when I saw through the downstairs window a very bright object. I saw it for about two minutes. It was moving in a southerly direction. There was a big flash and then I did not see it again."
