UFO KILLERS HAUNT US, SAY KIDNAP PAIR

Did aliens cause the tragic death of one hostage?

TERROR has stalked three women who claimed they were abducted by a UFO. One has already died in mysterious circumstances and the two survivors fear their alien kidnappers will be back for them too.

The two women, Mona Stafford and Louise Smith say they are in the grip of a strange force that is trying to stop them from talking about the incredible experience in 1976 that has made their lives hell.

Their amazing account, which one veteran investigator calls "one of the strangest UFO abduction cases I've ever come across," was revealed only under hypnosis.

And polygraph tests have proven that the pair and their friend Elaine Thomas, who died two years ago, were not lying.

The women claimed they were driving down a lonely road north of their homes in Liberty, Kentucky, the night of January 6, when they were attacked by an eerie object.

Suddenly, the car was "sucked" inside the craft by a bright beam.

"A split second later we were in Hustonville, eight or nine miles away," Louise recalled.

"We found out later that the 'split second' had lasted an hour and a half."

The women discovered their bodies had burn marks on the neck and other areas, and the car's paint had been badly blistered.

Police were called in, and soon the story was picked up by TV and newspapers.

Finally, UFO investi-

"She was only 43 and the heart condition came on rather suddenly," Dr. Price said. But Mona Stafford, 39, who was with Elaine during those final days, doesn't believe it was heart trouble that killed Elaine.

"Her throat and her chest hurt her something terrible," Mona told GLOBE.

"At night, she said lights, blinding lights, came at her from all sides and she heard the voices of the aliens

speaking to her.

"She told me: 'People are going to say I died, but that won't be true. Only my body is going to die. They're going to take my spirit with them.'"

Now Mona Stafford, who is unmarried, and divorcee Louise Smith fear they will be next.

They know who their alien tormentors are. They met them aboard their craft before their memories were mysteriously erased.

"Under hypnosis we were able to remember quite a lot," Louise told GLOBE.

"The aliens looked like humans, except they were only about four-and-a-half-foot tall and had fingers that looked like the edges of bird's wings — complete with feathers.

"They poured some liquid over me and when it hardened they peeled it off. I had this crazy notion they were making a mold of me."

Before her death, Elaine Thomas, also under hypnosis, told an even more frightening tale. She said a bullet-like object had been pressed against her left breast.

"It was terribly painful," she said. "I could feel the pain all through my chest."

Elaine experienced a similar pain shortly before her death.

And Louise, 49, who remembered being jabbed in the left arm by an alien probe, suffered a stroke that paralyzed the arm.

"It's one of the strangest UFO abduction cases I've ever come across," said Leonard Stingfield, a veteran UFO investigator.
