

UFO sightings reported

Several sightings of UFO's were reported early today in Staffordshire.

A Tamworth housewife, Mrs Dot Scattergood, said she saw a large bright light in the sky as she drove home with her husband from a dance.

Another woman had earlier rung a radio station in Birmingham, to say she had seen the UFO racing towards the south coast.

POLICE reports in the Lake District have an unearthly similarity these days.

"As I was proceeding along the lane I perceived a strange object in the sky . . ."

Several dazzled bobbies have made the same claim in the past two weeks.

Their observations have been backed up by dozens of public sightings of Unidentified Flying Objects—known as

UFOs—in the area near Kendal, Cumbria.

PC Bill White, 31, made one of the reports. He said: "It wasn't a plane—it was a UFO."

"There were two white lights with a bluish hue, rather like two TV screens, hanging above a tree.

"I drove down the road to look from another direction and I

could still see them hovering about 150ft. in the air.

"There was no noise so it wasn't an aircraft. The light remained visible for about four minutes.

"I'm not saying it was a spacecraft but whatever it was seemed to be keeping observation."

Two other police officers also reported the same lights.

Silver

It was a week later that 25-year-old PC David Wild was on patrol at Windermere with two other officers and saw "a silver object in the sky."

He said: "It travelled at fantastic speed. It was too high and too fast to be an aircraft.

"We were all impressed by what we saw."

The policeman's sightings have not impressed Kendal's Superintendent Leslie Thompson.

He said: "These are experienced, sensible and level-headed officers and I respect what they say.

"But personally I take UFOs with a pinch of salt."

Sue's UFO nightmare

FLYING saucers may be a joke to some people—but not to 23-year-old Susan Kellow.

Susan says she saw one when she was a teenager. And she has been having nightmares about it ever since.

It happened when Susan, of Winchester Street, Taunton, Somerset, was at nearby Creech St. Michael.

"My friend Penny Roberts was with me," she said.

"In the middle of the night we heard a humming sound and went to our bedroom window.

"Over a nearby copse we saw a luminous grey-blue object hovering.

"It seemed to cast a glow over everything around it. It was egg-shaped, as big as a double-decker bus, and was absolute stationary.

Suddenly shot off

"Suddenly" the saucer shot off and we felt free again.

"I hope I will never have to experience it again. These dreams are bad enough, and I wish someone would help me to get rid of them."

Penny Roberts, now 24, was the girl who shared Susan Kellow's frightening experience.

"It would have helped if someone had investigated my sighting, if only to prove it was something logical like a satellite," she said.
