

Photos of dead alien expose UFO cover-up

MORE than 40 sensational photographs of a wrecked UFO and its charred pilot have been given to three UFO experts by a veteran Navy photographer who has kept them secret for 32 years.

"He was afraid they would kick him out of the service if he made the photos available to the public," said Charles Wilhelm, who has now released two of the pictures.

"He's still afraid. He has more than 40 years of service. He's releasing the pictures because he feels the public has a right to know about them," Wilhelm explained to GLOBE.

Wilhelm and his two associates, Dennis Pilychis, of Rome, Ohio, and Dr. Willard McIntyre, of Baltimore, Maryland, have quizzed the photographer who wants to remain anonymous.

"We are convinced the photographs are authentic," Wilhelm says. "We have had them analyzed and there appears to be no signs of deception.

"However, if the future produces any evidence that the photos are bogus, we will be the first to tell the public."

He said the three investigators were selected because the photographer felt they were among the country's most responsible UFO experts.

"He knows we will have no part of any kind of hoax," adds Wilhelm, of Cincinnati, Ohio.

The two photographs that have been released purport to show a charred body, allegedly that of a UFO pilot who crashed in northern Mexico, about 30 miles south of Laredo, Texas, in 1948.

The photographer claims that the crash was investigated by members of the U.S. and Mexican military including personnel still in the armed forces. According to Wilhelm, the body and the wreckage were divided between the American and Mexican governments.

"It is my understanding that this body, along with several others, are still in the possession of the American government," he adds. "The body was taken to Wright-Patterson AFB, here in Ohio.

"There have been some rumors that the government has since spread the various bodies of aliens, along with wreckage of their craft, to other military installations. But I suspect they all are still at Wright-Patterson," Wilhelm told GLOBE.

"We have talked to pathologists who say they have examined the bodies, and are convinced they are not of this planet," Wilhelm

would not say how the aliens differ from earthlings.

He said the other 38 photographs in his possession are even more spectacular than the two released.

"There are a number of close-ups of the head, which reveal a greater detail of his face, and of the UFO wreckage," he explained. "These will be released as soon as we have some indication as to how the public is reacting."

Wilhelm said he is convinced the government has a great deal of information and evidence that UFOs do exist, and that it is afraid to release it because it fears the public will panic. "But I think they're changing their views now," he adds.

"I believe they will release some astonishing information within the very near future."

The Navy photographer warned the three investiga-

tors to expect to be hassled by a secret government agency when they release the first of the pictures but, so far, Wilhelm said, there have been no signs of attempts at intimidation or harassment.

GLOBE checked with several government agencies, including the Air Force, NASA and the CIA. All deny any knowledge of the 1948 UFO crash in Mexico, and of any alien pilot, or pilots.
