## Study Finds Space Beings Have Made Contact With 1,500 People

More than 1,500 people throughout the world have been contacted by extraterrestrial beings, according to a six-year study by the California-based Interplanetary Network.

"We looked at material from 100 nations and people who ranged in age from 6 to 86," network president Valerie Jean Ransone told The ENQUIRER.

"There is absolute evidence of transfer of information between extraterrestrials and human beings. We found that many of the people had been contacted more than once, and that the communication lasted from 20 minutes to three hours and 50 minutes.

"We could tell which reports were genuine because of the repetition of certain key facts and words among those who had actual contact," Ransone said.

"We got information from people about their contacts that was absolutely identical. Yet there was no way that two individuals, from two different countries and parts of the world, people who didn't even speak the same language, could have been in collusion."

For example, she said, despite the fact that none of the people contacted by outer space beings knew each other, many reported hearing a high-pitched whine in the right ear at the time of contact.

Ransone revealed that the people studied by the Interplanetary Network — whose members are physicists, electronics experts and social scientists — had been contacted "numerous times and over a period of three years or more."

She added: "It's part of a precise program of communication and contact."
