

UFOs do exist: Watch the sky!

The Civil Aviation Authority also has a standard form, which demands immediate reporting, preferably by telephone, of any UFO sighted by CAA personnel.

In 1979 the US Government released secret papers telling of a series of incidents over a military airfield, which was regarded so seriously that the joint chiefs of staff in Washington were kept informed. A full report was also sent to the CIA.

Also in 1979, Russia became the first country to order an official UFO alert, asking witnesses to report to the Soviet Academy of Sciences.

This high-level action was set off by spectacular sightings, over a period of weeks, over the city of Petravodsk.

A recent poll showed six per cent of the public believe UFOs exist. The scoffers are in an ever shrinking minority.
