comes down and actually talks to me I have my doubts though."

Mr. Frank Jenkins, coast-guard officer for Tees district said: "Eighty per cent of the calls we receive about sightings in the sky, mostly at night, are just meteors.

"We have had about a dozen or more sightings this year, because meteors have been very active over the period."

But if you should spot a UFO contact the coastguards or police.

"It could be anything, after all, and it is better to be safe than sorry," Mr. Jenkins said.
