

The day Angela saw a UFO

ONE of the first unidentified flying objects of 1981 has been reported by a Camberley housewife. *2nd Feb*

And it appeared in broad daylight, hovering over the direction of Lightwater.

Mrs Angela Jones, of Keswick Close, Heatherside, was driving back from Woking at about 10.15 a.m. on Monday when she saw the object.

She first spotted it as she drove round the Gordon Boys' roundabout. "The sky was clear and the sun was shining. It was like a round, silvery object and shiny," she said.

"It wasn't moving, it was hovering and tilting from side to side."

She estimates the object was smaller than an aircraft, and lower in the sky than she would expect to see a plane.

As she travelled along the B311 towards Camberley the object was on her right. She managed to watch it until it went out of her vision as she drove along.

Mrs. Jones reported the object to the Royal Aircraft Establishment at Farnborough, who said it was nothing to do with them.

"I thought there must be some explanation for it, although it definitely wasn't an aircraft. I haven't seen anything like it before," Mrs Jones added.

WHEN Broadstairs housewife Mrs. Sheelagh Norris looked out of her window one evening last week her heart jumped.

For in the sky she saw a flat object with five white lights flashing and she is convinced it was a flying saucer.

"It was like five North stars flashing and rotating."

she said. "It was a foggy night and really eerie."

Mrs. Norris (29), of Swinburne Avenue, added: "I was excited but frightened."

"I rushed downstairs and told my neighbour, but when we looked again it had gone."

"I'm not crazy. I know a U.F.O. when I see one, and that was one."

Three other Broadstairs people reported a sighting to the R.A.F. at Manston the same evening. They said it stayed in the sky over the town for five minutes.

An R.A.F. spokesman said he thought it was probably a civilian aircraft.
