

IKE SEES ALIEN WRECKAGE, THEN SEVEN YEARS LATER...

RONALD REAGAN is the latest President to learn the secret of the UFO that crashed with its crew in 1947 near Roswell, New Mexico. But joining those who share the mystery wasn't easy for the first President who tried it, as GLOBE reveals in the final part of this amazing story:

Russians share UFO secret

WHEN President Dwight D. Eisenhower began to ask about the Roswell saucer capture, his first problem was that even though he was President, he did not have the necessary security clearance. According to

one source: "Some of the higher-ups in the intelligence community didn't trust Ike."

But Eisenhower did get a chance to examine the captured saucer at Edwards Air Force Base, California,

in 1954. He was staying at a friend's ranch near Palm Springs on a golfing vacation.

On February 20, Eisenhower went somewhere alone and rumors began to circulate among the press corps that he had disappeared.

Then presidential press secretary James Haggerty was summoned from a cookout and announced that the President had "knocked a cap off a tooth" while chewing on a chicken leg and had been taken by his host to a local dentist.

But another rumor said that this was merely a cover story for Eisenhower's visit to Edwards AFB.

British saucer researcher Desmond Leslie investigated the base during the summer of 1954 and was convinced that the saucer was being kept there "in hangar 27."

According to Leslie, Eisenhower had a "look see" at the craft.

His source is an "Air Force man" who had actually seen the saucer and said that men coming back from leave were not allowed on the base and those stationed at the base were not allowed to leave.

Recent evidence suggests that the UFO struck the ground and flew on before it finally came to earth.

This is similar to an incident in Russia which apparently took place near Lake Onega on April 27, 1961.

A group of hunters and woodsmen saw an "aerial object of unknown origin" approach the ground and collide with it.

The object was oval, as big as a large plane and it glowed with a blue-green light.

It was traveling at tremendous speed when it struck, causing considerable damage to the surrounding vegetation.

Witnesses said the object

survived and continued westward with a wobbling motion then disappeared.

Investigators recovered metallic-looking particles and a small piece of thin, foil-like substance.

These were sent to the Leningrad Technological Institute for analysis.

Soviet space scientist Professor Felix Ziegel concluded the object was a "space probe from another planet which had scraped the ground but managed to continue."

Both the Lake Onega and the Roswell incidents seem similar — unknown objects flying east to west at low altitudes and high speed, collisions damaging the ground and metallic-like debris scattered over the area.

In both cases, the object remained in

the air after the collision, although in the Roswell incident it crashed very soon after.

Did the Lake Onega craft crash farther west too?

Given the sparse population in northern Russia, wreckage and bodies could have been recovered by Soviet military units without civilians becoming aware of them.

Is there another Roswell yet untold?
