

UFOs sighted off Australian coast

PERTH, Wed. — A batch of unidentified flying objects flew into view off the south-western Australian coast, police said today.

Police at Bunbury, 190 km south of Perth, said they received three separate reports of sightings of up to 15 bright objects flying in formation about a kilometre offshore, just after 4 p.m. on Tuesday.

Descriptions of the objects and their movements were almost identical in all three sightings, police said. Neither the Transport Department nor the air force could shed any light on the incidents.

Flight operations at Perth International Airport said there was no large group of planes flying in the area. Those who reported the sightings said the objects did not look like conventional aircraft.

The UFO report came two days after a bright object, thought to be the remains of a burnt-out Russian communications satellite, Cosmos 434, was sighted in the far north of the state late Sunday.

A search in the northwest on Tuesday failed to turn up any evidence of satellite wreckage. — UPI.
