# UFO cover-up claimed

Suspicious of a government "cover-up" over Unidentified Flying Objects will be voiced by former First Sea Lord and Chief of Defence Staff, Lord Hill-Norton, in the Lords this week.

He is to back Earl Clancarty, the leader of the Lords 30-member all-party UFO group in an attempt to persuade the Government to list reported sightings over the last four years.

Lord Hill-Norton is convinced that facts about UFOs are being kept from the public, and the growing sense of frustration he and other peers, like Earl Kimberley, secretary of the Lords Defence Group, feel will be aired during Question Time on Thursday.

If it does not get a satisfactory reply from the minister responsible for the defence procurement, Viscount Trenchard, the UFO group is planning a private Freedom of Information Bill, forcing the Government to release details of sightings.

Lord Clancarty said yesterday: "When there was a cover-up in the States instituted by the CIA, the UFO group managed to get a 900-page document released through their Freedom of Information Act which listed UFOs spotted over nuclear storage areas."
