Wednesday afternoon First Lady **Nancy Reagan** addressed a fund-raising luncheon for a nursing scholarship in her name at the University of Southern California. She told the 890 guests that she has a "special place" in her heart for nurses and reminisced about her days as a nurse's aide during World War II.

"I don't know exactly how to say this except to just tell you right out that my first patient died in the middle of the bed bath," she said. "I want you to understand it had nothing to do with my bed bath. I'm pretty good at giving bed baths," she said, adding, "I hope you won't rename the scholarship after somebody else."

Nancy Kissinger Update:

The woman who is charging **Nancy Kissinger** with assaulting her in Newark Airport says she won't drop her charges against Kissinger because she feels that people should confront former secretary of State **Henry Kissinger** whenever possible. "I know Kissinger is out of office, but he is very influential with his ties to **Alexander Haig** and the **Rockefeller** family," **Ellen Kaplan** said at Denver's Stapleton International Airport where she hands out pro-nuclear literature. "People should confront him if they see him."

Kaplan, 29, is a member of a group affiliated with controversial right-wing politician **Lyndon**

LaRouche. She admitted that she was not harmed during the incident but says she was "frightened." She also said that she didn't know Kissinger was en route to Boston for heart surgery when she confronted them. "But that does not make me sympathetic toward Mrs. Kissinger and I will not drop my charges because she might have been upset," she said.

The question put before the House of Lords by **Lord Clancarty** was one of governmental covering up. Is the British government covering up the number of UFO sightings in Britain?
