

Trespass arrest reported

UFO report, outage timing

Brenda Kay Stacy, 18, address unknown, was arrested by Coos Bay police late Thursday evening and charged with first-degree criminal trespass, first-degree criminal mischief and fourth-degree assault.

She was arrested on the charges and transported to the North Bend Holding Facility, following a report of a fight in progress at a Coos Bay residence, according to police.

Bail has been set at \$10,000, according to a holding facility spokeswoman.

UFO reported

Coos Bay police responded to a report of an unidentified flying object in the area of the T-Dock shortly after midnight this morning.

Unable to find the two large orange disks reportedly traveling at a low altitude and

heading northbound, officers were returning to town only to see the lights in all of downtown Coos Bay turn off.

Officer Doug Hill said the timing of the two events left him wondering how coincidental they were.

Officer Karl Larsen said he was waiting for his car to go dead.

The UFO sighting was reported by one Jack R. Crazy, according to the police log.

Pacific Power and Light Co. officials this morning confirmed that there was a brief power outage in downtown Coos Bay shortly after midnight and are investigating the cause.

A PP&L spokesman said the problem stemmed from the line feeding all of the substations in Coos Bay.

if the cause of the outage was due to a deficiency in the Coos Bay system or in the feed from the Bonneville Power Administration.

He added such brief outages "happen occasionally" in coastal areas such as Coos Bay because of the effect the high salt content has on the power lines.

Arrested in Curry
