Los Angeles County sheriff's deputy will stand trial in the shooting death last

spring of an unborn child and for attempted murder of the child's mother.

Municipal Judge Vincent N. Erickson Tuesday also ordered that Robert Armstrong be tried for assault with a deadly weapon.

Armstrong, 28, is accused of shooting Delois Young, who was 8 months pregnant, after she opened the door to the Duarte home she shared with her mother, a son and others on April 16.

During a preliminary hearing, deputies Richard Overland and Richard Summers testified that Armstrong fabricated a disturbance call at the home and then shot Ms. Young without identifying himself. Her unborn child died.

Overland said he overheard Armstrong say that an informant had reported that drugs were being sold at the house. No illegal drugs were found, authorities said.

Overland said that he and Summers joined the four deputies — Armstrong; Rene M. LaBelle, 27; Frederick F. Porter, 33, and David G. Geyer, 34 — at the Young home.

Judge Erickson also ordered LaBelle, Porter and Geyer, along with Armstrong, to stand trial for conspiracy to obstruct justice, stemming from their alleged attempt to cover up events leading to the shooting.

Fireball spotted in sky after missile test launch

VANDENBERG AIR FORCE BASE, Calif. (AP) — Callers in two states reported an explosion or red fireball in the sky after the test launch of a Minuteman missile, but the Air Force said it was a coincidence.

The unarmed Minuteman 3 intercontinental ballistic missile splashed down on schedule in the western Pacific test range about 30 minutes after launch, a spokesman said.

"I don't have any idea what those people were seeing," he added. "Whatever they saw, it was not caused by the missile."
