

UFO landed — Pcs

TWO POLICEMEN believe they saw a "star-like" UFO land at Monmouth early this morning — in the third such incident in Gwent this week.

Officers David Holder and Graham Banks were on duty near the town when they saw the object which was similar to a star with blue and white flashing lights plus red intermittent flashes.

As they watched it, the UFO released two red points of light which fell to the ground and then the UFO came down "as though it touched the ground." It then moved north-west at speed.

Bid to solve UFO mystery

THE mystery of Gwent's UFOs could be solved by the end of the month — through a computer.

Mrs Myfanwy Davies, an investigator for National UFO Laboratories, has spent the last three weeks visiting South Wales. Some thirty sightings have recently been reported in Gwent alone.

She was accompanied by

her assistant, Mrs Anne Norman, whose husband, John, drove. Together they covered more than 300 miles and talked to as many people as possible who claim to have seen unidentified lights in the sky.

The most prolific informant, Mr Frederick Jackson, of Dorset Cres-

cent, Newport, was interviewed on Sunday night.

Now all the information has been sent off for the laboratory computer in North Wales to try and unravel the mystery.

Mrs Davies plans to return to North Wales at the end of October, and Mrs Norman told us that they hoped to have the results by then.

TWO young policemen told yesterday how they had a close encounter at dawn with a UFO.

said: "We have taken a lot of ribbing from our colleagues but we were wide awake at the time and hadn't touched a drop." They

reported the sighting to their senior officers at Monmouth, Gwent.

Chief inspector Keith Harris said: "I don't doubt what they saw for a moment.

The bobbies were on patrol at Monmouth when they spotted a strange light in the sky at 4 a.m.

Simon said: "It was about the size of a star

and flickered blue and white with red flashes."

The bobbies saw two red lights fall to the ground.

There was a flash where they landed and then a blue light soared from the ground into the sky and vanished.

Simon added: "The object couldn't have been a plane because it was hovering at times, and not a helicopter because when it moved off it went at incredible speed, faster than any jet."
