More flying saucers sighting earth now?

Flying saucers are visiting

Earth more frequently these days because a "greater intelligence" is trying to deter the planet from waging nuclear war, says a former Army colonel who is a long-time leader in the movement to acknowledge unidentified flying objects, or UFOs.

"More than 13 million people in the U.S. have seen them (UFOs)," says Wayne Aho, "but those who report unidentified flying objects are often ridiculed, so many people don't tell what they see."

Aho was in Seattle for this weekend's 21st annual convention of the New Age Foundation at the Seattle Center.

He is founder and president of the foundation which, he says, is dedicated to recording flying saucer reports and studying the nature of such "visits."

Aho contends flying saucer reports were recorded in ancient writings, but he claims the sightings increased greatly after the atomic bomb explosions at Nagasaki and Hiroshima, Japan, and are increasing again.

The beings aboard the visiting space ships are sending messages in the form of thought communications with the minds of people on earth, Aho insisted.

"These messages are telling us to put away our nuclear weapons

of war, or we will destroy our own planet," he said.

Adviser in UFO probe to address convention

Dr. J. Allen Hynek, former adviser to the U.S. Air Force project which investigated UFOs, will be among the speakers at "UFOs — A Scientific Challenge" in Pasadena's Huntington-Sheraton Hotel Saturday and Sunday, July 2-3.

Hynek, professor emeritus of astronomy at Northwestern University, will discuss "UFO Activities Around the World" at 7:30 p.m. Saturday. Hynek is also the director of the Center for UFO Studies in Illinois.

The convention runs from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. Saturday and from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday. Admission for the entire conference is \$17.50, but tickets will be available for individual sessions at prices ranging from \$3 to \$7.

The conference is sponsored by the Mutual Unidentified Flying Objects Network, a national group.

Other topics and speakers include Ann Druffel of Pas-

adena, who will discuss "Southern California's 'Straight Line Mystery' in UFO Sightings;" and William L. Moore of Prescott, Ariz., author of a book on what was supposed to be a crashed flying saucer in Roswell, N.M., who will discuss "UFOs: Uncovering the Ultimate Answer."
