### Man's suit demands an E.T.

WASHINGTON — A man has filed a lawsuit demanding that the U.S. Air Force surrender "one or more occupants of crash-landed UFOs of apparent extraterrestrial origin" and to release any information it has regarding their capture.

Larry W. Bryant called his plea a "Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus Extraterrestrial."

In the petition to the U.S. District Court in Washington, Bryant does not say how he knows that there are such aliens in custody. In fact, he demands information. He charges, however, that the government "has pursued and continues to pursue a policy of UFO secrecy whenever that policy is deemed convenient."
