UFO evidence in US document

Nine creatures from outer space 'did come'

WASHINGTON, July 15.

The director of a group that monitors unidentified flying objects (UFOS) said today a 23-year-old U.S. government report on the arrival of nine creatures from outer space was probably true and strongly suggested the Air Force was still holding their remains.

The report, contained in a 1950 memo to J. Edgar Hoover then Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, said the three-foot (one-metre) tall human-like creatures had landed in New

Force yesterday which

says a Defence Depart-

ment counterintelli-

gence unit maintained

an 'Interplanetary Phen-

omenon unit' until

1959.
