THAT UFO WAS A LIGHTHOUSE

SENSATIONAL stories of a UFO landing in Britain are giving a good laugh to people who really know what happened.

Some of the loudest laughter comes from American Air Force Colonel Charles Halt, said to be a key witness of the landing in 1980 near the base where he was stationed at Bentwaters, Suffolk.

The stories, splashed across the front page of the News of the World last week, allege that Colonel Halt supported patrolmen who claimed they saw three little men in silver suits pilot a mysterious spacecraft to earth.

But an official spokesman for the USAF said last week: "Colonel Halt's report was based solely

on what the patrolmen had reported.

"It in no way confirms the claims made by the News of the World - which have caused Colonel Halt some amusement."

There was more amuse-

ment at the story down in Tangam Wood, where strange lights were seen on the night that the spacecraft is supposed to have landed.

Forestry Commission officer Vince Thurkettee, who lives near the wood, said: "The light from the Orford Ness lighthouse, on the coast, can be seen through the trees.

"From the hill where

the site is, it appears to be practically at ground level and, of course, it flashes.

"As you walk towards it, because of the lie of the land, it disappears."

According to the News of the World, Col Halt's report has been the subject of a massive official cover-up, presumably for security reasons.

But a USAF spokesman

said: "The report was never classified as secret, so there can be no question of a cover-up."

The Ministry of Defence confirmed that they had seen the report. A spokesman said "It was sent to us as a matter of routine.

"As far as we are concerned it was just another report of the sighting of unexplained lights.

"We have no further interest in the matter and there is nothing to cover up."

No cover-up, no "secret" report, no little silver men, no UFO... the only thing that's real is the laughter.
