

UFOs 'trying to warn us of nuclear war'

ALIENS from another planet could be sending UFOs to Earth in a desperate bid to prevent a nuclear war.

This amazing claim was made at a private meeting of members of the House of Lords, who belong to the UFO Study Group.



And the peers at the meeting are now demanding a full-scale Commons debate on UFOs—particularly the News of the World's exclusive story of one landing in Britain, only a quarter of a mile from a secret NATO airbase in Suffolk.

The theory about aliens trying to save the world from destruction was put forward by former Ministry of Defence intelligence officer Gordon Creighton.

Mr Creighton—a top expert on UFOs, and consultant to the magazine Flying Saucer Review—said after the Lords meeting:

"We're poised on the brink of a nuclear catastrophe, and if we're being watched over by other beings they could be trying to come to Earth and warn us."

Worried

The chairman of the study group, Lord Clancarty, said: "The occupants of space-craft could be very worried about what's going on here."

"It's quite possible that they're warning us not to press the nuclear button."

The News of the World's UFO revelation was discussed by the peers, and Lord Clancarty said: "The cover-up must end. It's time Whitehall came clean and admitted what they know about UFOs and landings in Britain."

MP Sir Patrick Wall, a member of the Commons Select Committee on Defence, was also at the meeting.

He said: "I want more answers from the Government about what's going on."

"The theory about aliens trying to warn us seems feasible to me. And if that's the case, then we should listen to them."

I telephoned to the Editor of the News of the World and complained that this was an absurdly simplistic account of what I had said to the Lords Study Group, and that I had already told Keith Beaby in great detail what I had said. He got Beabey to phone me back later. Beabey admitted he had not done a very good job and said he would do a piece on me again soon.
