

Police chief's UFO photos are for real

PICTURES of a UFO taken by a policeman are genuine, scientists said yesterday. They admitted: "It can't be an aircraft."

The policeman, a senior officer, sent photographs of a mysterious round object hovering above North Yorkshire to Arizona's Ground Saucer Watch—the world's leading authority on "flying saucers".

In 30 years they have examined 1,400 pictures but have confirmed only 42 as UFOs.

The officer, who photographed the UFO five months ago, said: "It was covered in red lights, pulsating in rhythm. It was visible for about 30 seconds."

Two other UFOs have been reported in Yorkshire during the last three years.
