That's why I can't agree with my old friend Stanton T. Friedman.

Stanton is known in the Ufology trade as the Flying Saucer Physicist. For some strange reason he has given up on physics and taken to lecturing all over the continent on The Coming — of UFOs.

Stanton shares a common trait with other lecturers (even myself) — he's not averse to publicity. So when a Toronto newspaper published an article on the fading interest in flying saucers, followed by a tongue-in-cheek editorial on the subject, Stanton wasn't laughing. He brought his case to the Ontario Press Council.

It ain't true, he complained. The UFOs are still out there in

Terra Firma's suburbia. But our governments are sitting on the saucer story. They won't tell. They've been covering up, all these years.

Of course most Ufologists have been taking this line, but Friedman is in the forefront. It was he who coined the phrase Cosmic Watergate.

But Stanton, Watergate blew its cover years ago. Who's holding down the lid on the UFOs these many decades?

Another point occurs to me. If the U.S. government knows of the existence of UFOs why are they wasting millions of dollars on the NASA program, using such primitive means as rockets for space exploration? Why not use

the technology of the captured UFOs which they are claimed to be hiding.

It's revealing that when the U.S. congressional panels were investigating intelligence agencies, Stanton Friedman was challenged by UFO investigator Philip J. Klass to bring his cover-up evidence to the panels in Washington, at Klass's expense — and Friedman declined. His reason? "The pressure has to come from somebody else other than me."

One of the most notorious government coverups was supposed to have taken place when "an extraterrestrial spaceship" crashed in Roswell, New Mexico in July 1947.

This resulted in a book, The Roswell Incident, authored by William Moore and Charles Berlitz. This is the same Berlitz who wrote that masterpiece of fictionalized fact, The Bermuda Triangle.

Stanton Friedman was the "chief of research" for The Roswell Incident. He still claims that the U.S. government stowed away the spacecraft wreckage along with the remains of the little green men.

It's been almost 40 years since this event — and no leaks. I hope they kept the little men on ice.
