Date with UFO fans

FLYING saucer fanatics are set to invade Derby with conclusive proof that UFOs really do exist.

The international Aetherius Society claims to have contacted little green men from outer space who told them almost 30 years ago about the recent nuclear accident at Sellafield.

"We know there are flying saucers and we have 30 years worth of findings to prove it," he said.

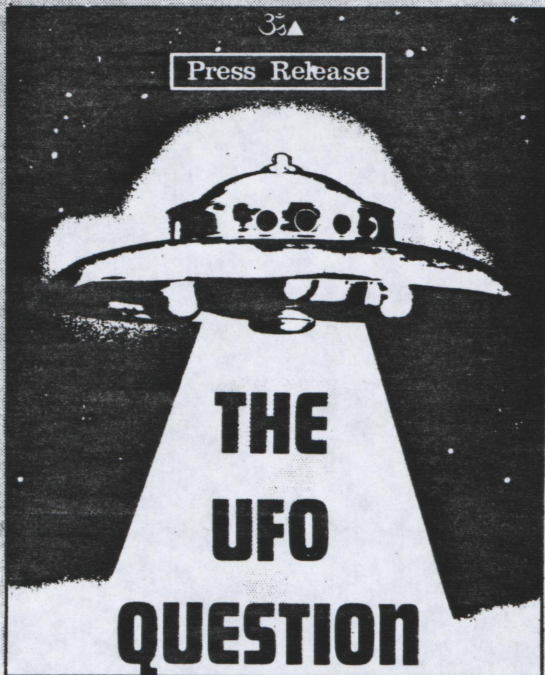
And on the Sellafield issue, Dr Lawrence said: "Our founder-president Sir George King was told of this by a telepathic message from outer space before any official announcement."
