# Space aliens have contacted U.S. & communist govts

**CLOSE ENCOUNTERS** of a different kind have become a puzzling reality for Earth's three major governments.

Aliens have secretly contacted Chinese, U.S. and Russian intelligence agencies.

"We don't know what they want, if anything, or where they've come from," confesses a shaken senior official of the super-secret Institute of Defense Analysis.

"All we can be certain of is that they are here and want us to know it."

The official, who spoke only on condition he not be identified, confirms the Russians and Chinese also have been alerted to the aliens' presence.

## Creatures

He says all three governments are awaiting further developments with bated breaths.

"Obviously, we don't normally exchange information with each other, but after all, we are human and these creatures are not," he says.

Still, the governments are furiously trying to figure out how they can turn the alien contacts to their advantage, and against the interests of their enemies.

"If they have valuable scientific information to exchange, we are determined that the aliens deal with us first," says the U.S. government official.

## One-way

"We realize, of course, our counterparts in Peking and Moscow feel the same way."

So far, however, communication has been strictly a one-way street, a case of, "Don't call us; we'll call you."

Communiques simply appeared on printers attached to highly-guarded computer terminals normally reserved for top-secret intelligence dispatches.

"This is no joke," insists an East German computer expert, called in to analyze the 'security breach' of the KGB's central computer lo-

cated in Moscow.

"Clever pranksters all over the world have learned tricks that allow them to talk to supposedly secure computers," he says, "but there is no way anyone from Earth could break into the internal security systems of these

three governments at once—speaking the highly-different languages of each at the same time."

Officials of the KGB, Russia's secret police and intelligence agency, are frantic about the alien

computer intrusion, the East German expert contends.

Reports from China are even more sketchy, although high sources in the U.S. State Department acknowledge privately that officials from Peking have quietly asked for

copies of the English language communiques to compare with the ones they received.

"The whole affair is most mysterious," says Japanese computer designer Taniko Mirashume, who has been able to obtain copies of all three

alien messages.

"The aliens merely say they are here, they are watching and they wish the human race well," he says.

"There's no hint of a threat, but I don't blame the governments for being seriously rattled."
