Reagan's Formula For Peace — Aliens From Another World

FALLSTOWN, Md. — A threat against this world by a species from some other planet would make the search for peace in this world easier, President Ronald Reagan says.

Reagan told an assembly of high school students in Fallstown on Wednesday that he had raised the possibility of an attack against the

world from elsewhere in the universe with Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev when the two men met last month in Geneva, Switzerland.

The president said he had told Gorbachev "how easy his task and mine might be in these meetings that we held if suddenly there was a threat to this world from some other species from another planet outside in the universe.

"We'd forget all the little local differences that we have between our countries and we would find out once and for all that we really are all human beings here on this earth together.

"Well, I don't suppose we can wait for some alien race to come down and threaten us. But I think that between us we can bring about that realization."
