SHIRLEY WRIGHT sets the scene for a meeting in Oxford tomorrow

The woman in this snap says she gets messages from Outer Space . . .

SHIRLEY Adcock says she has seen a flying saucer and knows without doubt that they exist. "Without flying saucers this world would be lifeless — we owe it to them to clean up pollution and radiation," she says.

This, she maintains, is not idle speculation. Not only can she feel the spiritual energy beamed down by a Martian spacecraft which orbits the earth four times a year but she has a tape-recorded message from its captain.

Shirley, 61, of Banbury Road, Oxford is the local organiser of the Aetherius Society and a Dame of the Mystical Order of St Peter, one of the society's titles.

Tomorrow she will be revealing some of the secrets of alien space flight to fellow earthlings at Oxford Town Hall.

The talk, which will be shared with the Rev. Christopher Perry, is one of a series being organised by the Society throughout the country aimed at "giving the truth about flying saucers and their message to earth."

The Society is an international occult group that believes in a Cosmic higher intelligence.

He dropped a plate!

Its president and founder, with Society titles, is His Serene Highness Prince George King de Santorini, doctor of divinity, professor of humanity and former chauffeur.

Thirty two earth years ago, the untitled George King was washing up in his Maida Vale bed when he was told by a voice:

"Prepare yourself. You are to become the voice of Interplanetary Parliament."

He was so surprised by dropped a plate.

The following days were a time of intense frustration. There were no more messages and unable to confide in his friends he wondered what lay ahead.

His anxiety ended when an Indian Swami, glowing in a green light, walked through his locked door, sat down on a battered old chair and explained what the job of an interplanetary spokesman involved.

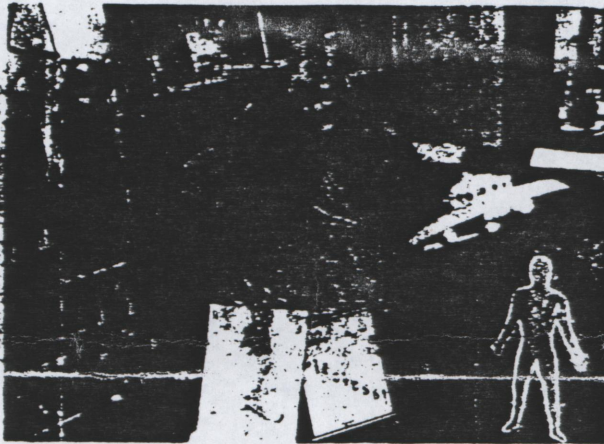
Shortly after he began to receive telepathic transmissions from Master Aetherius, the 3,456 year old parliamentary liaison officer from Venus.

He explained that flying saucers had been landing on earth for thousands of years but the Cosmic Masters had decided to branch out. They are prepared to give their message of goodwill through specialised individuals and they had chosen George as their sole channel for receiving the information on earth.

Later, George embarked on his first psychic voyage of outer space. He reports that he visited the moon, Venus — where he gazed enraptured at tall towers and spires — and Mars, where he arrived in the middle of a serious debate of the Martian General Assembly.

He also says he was a guest in the Martian spacecraft Satellite Three which orbits the earth four times a year, directing cosmic energy at Earthlings with pinpoint accuracy.

George, 67, has maintained regular telepathic contact with the commander of

the spacecraft who is known as Mars Sector Six.

In 1959 cosmic voices directed him to move to Hollywood where he lives with his wife, a former cocktail waitress, in what is described as a modest bungalow.

The society says he lives a modest lifestyle putting the bulk of his income from his 50 books and 80 tape-recorded transmissions back into the group.

Mars Sector Six speaks with a kind of distant authority. The Master Aetherius sounds warm, friendly and wise. He begins his message with: "Good Evening, My Dear Friends."

"You should hear Master Jesus," says Shirley, "His voice is so soft — he's fantastic."

Master Jesus, along with the saintly but unusually-named Goo-Ling, are just two of the Cosmic Masters in regular contact with George King.

In fact, according to George, Jesus is a resident of Venus and was brought to earth in a rather up-market Martian spacecraft which people have mistakenly named the Star of Bethlehem. Since George has been in touch with Jesus he has been asked to pass on an eleventh commandment and he has been given a new explanation of the crucifixion.

According to George, the crucifixion was a trap laid by Jesus to thwart black magicians who were trying to destroy the world.

Shirley has no doubt about the authenticity of the messages George King receives from the Cosmos.

"As a medium, George King is the top," she says. "I was brought up as an extremely practical person and the things he says and the things he has taught me make sense."

She says that countless statements made by George have been proved correct. In the nineteen fifties he was told there had been a leak of radioactivity at Windscale which had been covered up by scientists. Later he was told of an atomic accident in Russia which was not discovered by the West until 18 years later.

They are all friendly

Shirley says the Cosmic Masters are particularly concerned about the use of nuclear power and build up of nuclear arms on earth. "They feel we haven't sufficient knowledge to know how to use it properly," she says.

There are, she says, around 92 Martian agents on the earth monitoring the situation. They are all friendly.

The Cosmic Masters have used their powers to prevent volcanoes, floods, earthquakes and other disasters, and members of the Society have also by directing energy received from Satellite Number Three into a gadget called a prayer machine which resembles a car battery.

Once the battery is charged with hundreds of hours of prayer, its energy is unleashed at a specific area in need of help.

Much of the society's work is directed

at trying to convince people that there are such things as flying saucers and Cosmic Masters. Shirley says only when the fear and suspicion is removed from extra terrestrial beings will they come to earth and play an active role on the planet.

Richard Lawrence, a former pupil of Oxford's Dragon School and secretary of the Aetherius Society in Britain agrees the concepts are hard to swallow.

But, he points out, electricity and space flight were equally hard to swallow a 100 years ago.

Who would have predicted in the middle of the last century that man would travel at a speed of more than 30 mph? "Just because something is hard to swallow doesn't mean that it is untrue. People should have an open mind and apply investigation. You can't dismiss something just because it is difficult to believe."

"I am sure that within the next 50-100 years our ideas will be accepted by the majority of people. There is no question the Society will be vindicated and accepted."
