Fireballs falling over Seaford?

STRANGE things have been dropping out of the sky above Seaford.

Mr Harry Crick, of St Crispins, Claremont Road, Seaford, could hardly believe his eyes when he looked out of this lounge window and saw what resembled a huge fireball falling from the heavens.

Giant sun

He said: 'It was just like a giant sun dropping out of the sky. At first I thought it might be a flare sent out by the lifeboat but when a friend checked we were told the flares used were white.'

'The fireball just fell out of view, presumably into the sea.'

The second unexplained sighting by Mr Crick was in

early January when he saw what appeared to be a huge piece of scrap metal falling onto the nearby railway line.

He told the NEWS: 'I was in bed at the time when a sudden brightness hit the floor. It was too brilliant to be reflected by car headlights.'

Sparks

'I jumped out of bed just in time to see what looked like a giant piece of scrap metal falling. It caught the railway line near the signal box and appeared to be smouldering. Then it began to rain and the sparks were extinguished.'

No-one has been able to explain the mysterious falls but Mr Crick is still on the look out for any other inexplicable happenings.
