The second wave of UFOs to streak through Brazilian skies in less than a year suggests that an alien invasion of earth has already begun, a prominent physicist warns.

Scientists admit they were wrong! Expected space war of 1993 is happening now!

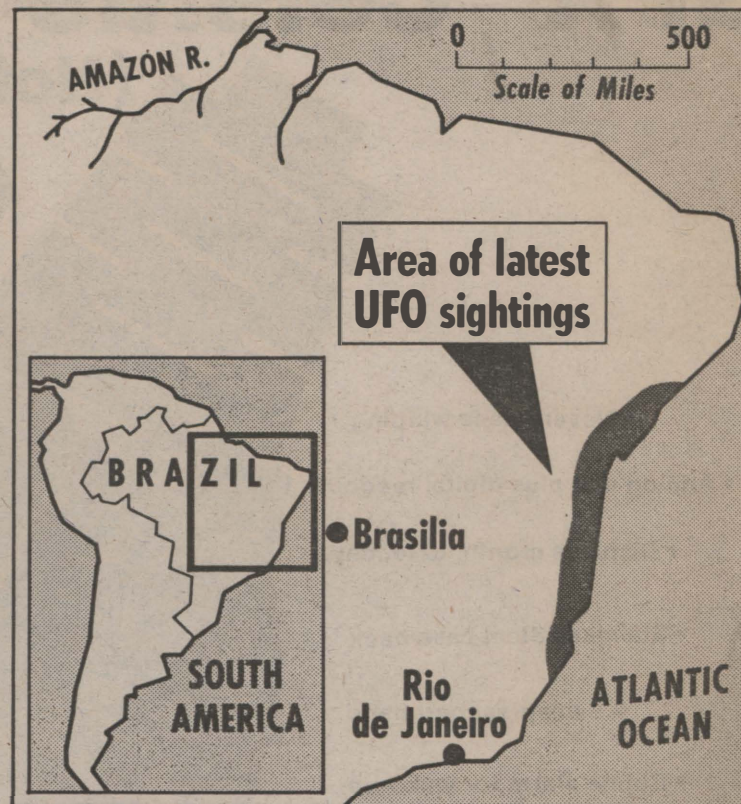
But the sighting of dozens of glowing starships over Brazil on Dec. 21 — following an identical blitz last spring — has prompted them to revise the aliens' estimated time of arrival.

Dr. Gerhard Schultz worked closely with the team that translated the space radio message. He says the alien invaders are here — now.

“It appears that we made a grievous error in the translation of the message,” the physicist told reporters at a hastily called press conference in Bonn, West Germany.

“There is no other explanation for the wave of starships that have been encountered in Brazil. I firmly believe that the war of the worlds is on the verge of beginning, if it hasn't already begun.”

Soviet and American offi-



cial refused to comment on Dr. Schultz's assessment of the situation. But Brazilian authorities spoke openly about the alarming invasion of their country's air space.

“We are trying to present the whole truth to the press,” said ministry spokesman Adalberto de Rezende Rocha. “We have registered a phenomenon of luminous flashing lights and persistent radar screen blips that we cannot explain.”

Gen. Moreira Lima, who characterized the phenomenon as an invasion, said: “Dozens of contacts were made along our coastline.”

“It's not a matter of believing or not. We have no expla-

nation for it, but this is what happened.”

The official said Air Force fighter pilots pursued “several dozen saucer-shaped UFOs” after they were picked up on radar Dec. 21.

The pilots reportedly drew near the starships several times. But they were unable to make radio contact or engage them in battle during the 12 minute cat-and-mouse encounter, Gen. Moreira Lima said.

“It was very much like the situation we had last spring,” he said. “The UFOs would slow down and let our pilots see them. But when our planes got too close they would shoot out of range.”
