It's hard to explain, but I was awakened by a sensation of being tugged out of bed. The room was dark and the thing hovering over me was darker. It actually looked like a huge black baby with enormous eyes. They changed like a mud puddle does when you drop a large rock in the center and then drop a smaller one in. That's how it communicated. I knew it wanted me to go somewhere. It never made any sound."

"Encounters of the Third Kind", a box office sell-out movie touched on the subject of space communication. By the time of the picture's release, U.F.O.'s were a topic of conversation.

In 1973, hundreds of people reportedly observed U.F.O.'s in over hundreds of towns in Alabama, Rhode Island, Wisconsin, Illinois, Pennsylvania, Ohio, North Carolina and South Carolina. One such report in South Carolina read: "Police in Cherokee County, South Carolina received so many U.F.O. sighting reports during January and February, 1973 that they stopped sending cruisers out to investigate."

According to the local police, the sighting reports had been in the hundreds, ranging from hazy, distant sightings to close-up, detailed descriptions. The objects were described as cylindrical, cigar-shaped, triangular and round like a saucer with a cabin on top.

On August 30, 1973, reports of U.F.O.'s broke out across Georgia from Valdosta to Macon and Waycross. A trooper said that "there were as many as four of the things in the sky at one time. They would hover over the city, then move back and forth." He described the U.F.O.'s as a "clear light" in the sky that changed colors from red, green and orange to yellow and flashed at irregular intervals.

While we are concerned with what is happening on earth at this moment, things may be happening on other planets of which we are not yet aware.

Meanwhile we continue to probe the outer limits for answers. The popular opinion is still that U.F.O.'s are aircraft manned by extraterrestrial (other planet) scientists on missions to "scout out" this planet.
