

Bright streak of light assumed to be meteor

SEATTLE (AP) — A bright streak of light presumed to be a meteor blazed across the night sky over Washington state and Idaho, and authorities said a number of people in the two states reported sighting it.

In central Washington, Chelan County Sheriff's Deputy Leon Milligan said his office in Wenatchee got three calls and one was reported by a radio station in Chelan,

about 7 p.m. Saturday.

One caller reported seeing "a yellow streak followed by a ball of fire," and another said it was like "a falling Roman candle," and all four said it appeared to be north or east of them, Milligan said.

An traffic controller at Spokane International Airport, who declined to give his name, described it as having "a bright tail, a green, glowing head."
