Things that go flash in the night

STRANGE aircraft — beings from another world?

Hot on the heels of the unexplained UFO experience in Australia last week, when a car was lifted from the road, there has been a second reported sighting — this time in Wrecclesham!

This wasn't a close encounter of the third kind, but of the first. The UFO was seen by young brothers Scott and Jonathan Burnett, who were at their home on Wrecclesham Hill on Thursday last week.

"We were looking out of the window at about ten to eight. In the sky above the Wrecclesham sandpit was this UFO — round with lots of flashing lights," said Scott, who is 13. The mysterious object, which was saucer shaped, flew past the Burnett's house, with its different coloured lights flashing all the way round the craft, they claimed.

"It was easily distinguishable from a helicopter or a plane," said Scott.

The brothers have had an encounter once before. "It was a long, long time ago. We were at home, in Wrecclesham, when we saw this round object high in the sky," said Scott.

Sceptics have discounted Scott and Jonathan's latest experience. Did you see the UFO on Thursday last week?

UFO claim by father and his stepson

ANOTHER sighting of a UFO has been claimed — this time by a 49-year-old Farnborough man and his teenage stepson.

Mr. Fred "Nobby" Clarke was driving to work at 6.30 a.m. on January 11 with his 17-year-old stepson, Darryl Robson.

They were travelling along the A31 towards Alton when they saw a bright light in the sky, with a less bright one below it.

On reaching Bentley, Mr. Clarke stopped to visit a shop. He said he was amazed what he saw.

"I looked up and there was a massive object moving slowly towards Farnham. It was shaped like a 50p piece and larger than an aeroplane," he said.

The object had a light at opposite ends and was making a droning noise.

Other sightings of UFOs in Farnborough, Yateley, Bagshot, Lightwater and Blackwater had been recounted to the "News" since Christmas.

FOLLOWING last week's report in the Farnham Herald of a UFO sighting at Wrecclesham on January 22nd., another incident has come to light.

Ms. Miranda Scolding was at home in Middle Field, Wrecclesham, on the same night that the two young brothers claimed to have seen a UFO.

Ms. Scolding told a Herald reporter: "It was about 1.20 a.m. and I couldn't get to sleep. Then I heard this really wierd noise like very loud breathing.

"I realised that it was coming from outside the house and it was

unlike anything I had ever heard before. It went on for about four or five minutes and sounded like it was in the front garden."

Ms. Scolding, who is 26, said: "I went and opened the bedroom window and could see lights

flashing across the road. After a short while it just stopped.

"It really terrified me. Nothing like this has ever happened before and I am really sceptical about such things. But
