VIV, ROSEMARY and Valerie had enjoyed their regular hen night at Tiffany's disco in Shrewsbury. They had danced, had a chat and a laugh — but nothing stronger than Coca Cola had crossed their lips.

Now it was 2 a.m., and time for the 20-minute drive along the A5 expressway to their homes in the Dawley district of Telford New Town.

At the wheel of her Hillman Avenger was Viv Hayward, 27. Beside her in the front passenger seat was mother of three Rosemary Hawkins, also 27.

Behind them, in the back, was 26-year-old Valerie Walters.

Passing the Shropshire village of Atcham, they saw some red and white lights on a huge round object in a field.

Panic

Rosemary glanced at her watch. It was 2.10 a.m.

Then the lights started to stalk the car—and the three women began to panic. Viv put her foot hard down on the accelerator . . . but nothing happened.

After a moment of so, the UFO climbed into the clouds and vanished.

Suddenly, the car was freed of its restraining influence and Viv drove at full speed into Telford. There they reported their sighting to the police.

The police logged their arrival at 2.40 a.m. on July 17, 1981. But only a few minutes earlier, when the women first caught sight of the UFO, the time had been 2.10.

JESSIE SPOTS AN ALIEN CREW

WHEN Mrs. Jessie Rostenberg saw ET and his little fellow aliens in the film Close Encounters Of The Third Kind, she wanted to tell the rest of the cinema: "They are not like that at all!"

And Jessie should know — for she had a close encounter with the occupants of a UFO at her lonely farmhouse at Ranton, Staffordshire.

Experience

"Aliens are not funny little green men," she insists. "The ones I saw were almost human."

Jessie spotted a disc-shaped craft, with a large window, hovering over her home.

It was low enough for her to see two figures staring down at her. They seemed distant, almost wistful and yet oddly compassionate, she says.

They wore blue ski-type suits and had long blond hair. Their skins were very white and their chins were



pointed, but they seemed otherwise human and normal in height.

"It felt like hours passed, but it must have been seconds," she says. "I was paralysed, as if I was held in a vice."

"I wanted to say hello, but I was worried about my children. I turned to see if they were all right, but when I looked back up it was gone."

Jessie ran indoors and hid under a table with the children, Anthony, eight, and six-year-old Richard. One of them spotted the disc through trees,

apparently circling. It gave off a flash of purple light and disappeared.

Jessie's story is legendary among UFO-ologists. And she insists that her experience has changed her life.

"Since then, I have developed very clear extra-sensory perception," she says. "I know things without being told. I understand situations without them being explained to me."

"All this probably sounds crazy, but it is true."

stretch of road, they had lost about 20 minutes.

Over the next few months, Viv, Rosemary and Valerie underwent expert hypnosis by doctors.

The story which tumbled out was remarkable.

Viv told of the car being

lifted into the clouds and entering the UFO through double doors in the underside.

She was lifted out of the car and put into a reclining chair by aliens wearing green cloaks.

She described them as

four feet tall, with deep-set dark eyes, thin arms and strange-looking noses.

"They are holding me down," she said. "They feel very strong. They are trying to find out things from me. They want to know how we are made."

One of the creatures told her in a deep, gruff voice: "Don't . . . be . . . afraid."

"I feel as if they're taking something from my body," she complained. "They're putting their hands in my legs and pulling at my bones."

When they released their grip, Viv was scanned by a big light which first studied her top half, then moved down her body.

Rosemary also recalled being taken from the car, and told of being made to lie on a bed.

Robots arrived, and Rosemary was disconcerted to realise that they were faceless.

There was no medical examination of Rosemary.

Valerie relived her sheer terror under hypnosis.

"It's coming towards us,"

she cried. And the doctor who was monitoring Valerie reported that her blood pressure and pulse rate shot up, indicating severe distress.

She floated into a room where she saw two aliens — a man and a woman.

They were six feet tall with dark, shoulder-length hair, vivid blue eyes and very white skin.
